

Ellora -Ajanta International Festival 2023 begins in Maharashtra



- Sitar player Ustad Sujaat Hussain will perform along with tabla players Amit Choube and Mukesh Jadhav today in a three-day Ellora -Ajanta International Festival 2023 in Chatrapati Sambhaji Nagar Maharashtra.
- Drum player Padamshri Shiv Mani, Sitar player Ravi Chari, Piano player Sangeet Haldipur, Khanjira player Selva Ganesh, bass guitar player Sheldon DeSilva and Aditi Bhagwat will also perform on kathak dance.
- Yesterday evening, Union Minister of State for Finance Dr. Bhagwat Karad inaugurated this festival.
- The Government of Maharashtra's Minister for Employment Guarantee Scheme and horticulture Mr. Sandipan Bhumare and Minister for Co-operative and marketing Mr Atul Save, were present on this occasion.

IAF contingent to participate in Exercise Cobra Warrior in United Kingdom



- An Indian Air Force contingent comprising 145 Air Warriors has departed from Air Force Station Jamnagar to participate in Exercise Cobra Warrior at the Waddington Air Force Base of the Royal Air Force in the United Kingdom.
- The Exercise Cobra Warrior is a multilateral Air exercise in which Air Forces from Finland, Sweden, South Africa, the United States of America and Singapore would also be participating.
- The exercise aims to participate in fighter aircraft engagements and learn from the best practices of various Air Forces.
- The IAF will be participating in the exercise with five Mirage 2000 fighters, two C-17 Globemaster III and an IL-78 mid-air refueller aircraft.

UAE to send its second astronaut to space on a long haul mission to ISS



- UAE's second astronaut, Sultan Al Neyadi Mission Specialist, Primary Crew, Crew-6. is set to em bark on the historic space mission scheduled at 10:45 am on February 27th, from Kennedy Space Center, Florida, USA.
- Once he reaches the orbiting station, onboard the International Space Station he will undertake various science experiments over the next six months.
- Fields of scientific experiments range from learning about the cardiovascular system, epigenetics, immune system, fluid science, plant biology, sleep analysis and radiation.
- Apart from Al Neyadi the other members of the SpaceX Crew-6 are Nasa commander Stephen Bowen, pilot William Hoburg, and Russian cosmonaut Andrey Fedyaev.
- UAE will be only the 11th country to send an astronaut on a long-term mission to space with this mission.
- Dr Al Neyadi, 41, will spend six months aboard the ISS in what will be the Arab world's longest-du ration space mission.
- Sultan Al Neyadi is a member of the UAE Astronaut Program and an Emirati astronaut.

- He was born in the UAE in 1987 and has a PhD in Information Technology from Griffith University in Australia.
- Neyadi was chosen from over 4,000 applicants in 2018 to be one of two UAE astronauts on a mis sion to the International Space Station (ISS).

Qatar Open: Daniil Medvedev beats Andy Murray in final



- Daniil Medvedev won the Qatar Open in his professional tennis debut by defeating Andy Murray 6-4, 6-4, in the final game between two former No. ls.
- In every set, Medvedev converted quick beginnings. In the first, he got to 4-1, and in the second, he gotto 3-1.
- Murray retaliated, but Medvedev silenced him to win his 17th singles championship.
- Medvedev also triumphed in Rotterdam, extending his winning streak to nine games.
- Medvedev has now won 18 Tour-level championships after winning in Rotterdam last week as well.
- He got off to a great start and quickly settled into his baseline rhythm, winning the majority of the extended rallies and taking a 4-1 lead with two breaks of serve.
- Murray also fell behind in the second set but came back with a break of serve to win
 it.
- On Friday, Murray saved five match points against Jiri Lehecka to advance to his 71st ATP final.

LS speaker Om Birla inaugurates 19th Annual Zone III CPA Conference in Sikkim



- Lok Sabha speaker Om Birla inaugurated the 19th Annual Zone III Conference of Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA) India Region in Gangtok, Sikkim on Thursday.
- Delivering the inaugural address, Mr Birla said that the legislature, as a forum to solve people's problems, must be the center of unhindered debate sans disruption which will increase peoples' faith in democratic institutions, thereby strengthening our democracy.
- He emphasized on discussion and dialogue, observing that it is the biggest strength of democracy.
- Speaking on the economic potential of the northeastern states, Mr Birla said that there are huge possibilities in the field of tourism, renewable energy, organic farming and handicrafts.
- He also emphasized on Prime Minister Narendra Modi's focus on the North East through projects under Gatishakti, Prime Minister's Development Initiative for North East Region and multimodal connectivity, among others, which has transformed the vision of Look East to Act East.
- Speaking on subjects of the Conference, Mr Birla said that cyber bullying is relevant today as it affects the youth, who are the future of the nation.
- He said that it is the responsibility of lawmakers and citizens to deliberate on the challenge and create awareness to address it.
- He said, information technology should be used to improve efficiency in governance and improving lives of people but at the same time safeguards should be taken to protect institutions and people from its demerits.

Nokia changes its logo to mark the start of a new era



- Nokia will no longer use the colour blue and will instead use whatever is more fitting
 given the circumstances, therefore no particular colour scheme is allocated.
- Nokia is now a "enterprise technology company," according to Lundmark, rather than just a maker of smartphones.
- Nokia will put more of an emphasis on selling equipment to other companies while

also expanding its telecom equipment business.

- They include tools for automated manufacturing and private SG networks, positioning the busi ness as a rival to Microsoft and Amazon in the industry.
- A "three-phased approach to generate sustainable, profitable growth" is being developed by Nokia. It was stated that Nokia will "continue to accelerate" following the reset phase to establish itself as "an unchallenged technology leader."
- The announcement on Sunday is consistent with Nokia's long-term financial objectives, which were reaffirmed with Q4 2022 results.

Argentina captain Lionel Messi bags best FIFA football player award



- Argentina captain Lionel Messi has been named the best player in men's football by FIFA, at The Best FIFA Football Awards in Paris yesterday.
- Messi won this award for his outstanding performances in men's football from August 2021 to December 2022.
- The 35-year-old forward scored two goals in the final against France.
- France's Kylian Mbappe, also nominated forthe highly anticipated award of the night, netted a hat trick in the World Cup final.
- However, Mbappe's achievement was overshadowed as Messi finally won the most coveted trophy.
- Spain's Alexia Putellas won the best women's player award for the second year in a row.

National Science Day, marking discovery of Raman Effect being celebrated



- National Science Day is being celebrated across the country today.
- The theme of this year's Science day is "Global Science for Global Wellbeing", in light of India's G20 presidency.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi has extended his greetings to all scientists and innovators of the country.
- In a tweet, the Prime Minister said, India is making innumerable strides in the world of science and nurturing an ecosystem for research and innovation.
- National Science Day is celebrated to mark the discovery of the "Raman Effect" by physicist Sir CV Raman on this day in 1928.
- For this discovery, he was awarded the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1930. In 1954, he was honored with India's highest civilian award, the Bharat Ratna.
- In 1986, the National Council for Science & Technology asked the Government of India to designate February 28 as National Science Day.
- Since 1987, the event has been celebrated all over the country in schools, colleges, universities and other academic, scientific, technical, medical and research institutions.

W-20 meeting to conclude at Chatrapti Sambhajinagar



- The inception meeting of W-20 (Women 20) will conclude today at Chatrapti Sambhajinagar.
- The delegates of the W-20 group will discuss a major priority topic in two important sessions to day.
- In the special session, Member of Parliament Dr. Sonal Mansingh and some navy lady officers will discuss the topic on breaking the barriers: stories of unconventional women.
- Last session will be held on the topic of the enablers for women -led development: policy and legal frameworks.
- After the last session, task force members will finalize the discussion summary.
- India has selected five priority areas for the meeting. These are- Women in Entrepreneurship, Women Leadership at Grassroots, Bridging the Gender Digital Divide, Education & Skill Develop ment and Women & Girls as change makers Climate

Resilience Action.

ISRO successfully conducts flight acceptance hot test of CE-20 cryogenic engine



- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has successfully conducted the flight acceptance hot test of the CE-20 cryogenic engine.
- The Engine will power the Cryogenic Upper Stage of the LVM3 launch vehicle for the Chandrayaan-3 mission.
- The space agency said the test was successfully conducted on February 24, at the ISRO Propulsion Complex, Mahendragiri in Tamil Nadu.
- ISRO said, the hot test was carried out for a planned duration of 25 seconds at the High Altitude Test Facility.
- It said, all the propulsion parameters during the test were found satisfactory and closely matched with predictions.
- The Space agency said, the cryogenic engine will be further integrated with the propellant tanks, stage structures and associated fluid lines to realise the fully integrated flight cryogenic stage.

J&K wins best adventure tourism destination award



• The India Today Tourism Survey has chosen Jammu & Kashmir Tourism for best adventure tour ism award.

- The awards were given away at New Delhi by Union Minister of State for Culture & Parliamentary Affairs, Arjun Ram Meghwal.
- The award has been given to the J&K Tourism Department in recognition of its efforts in promoting 'Gulmarg' as an adventure destination of international order.
- The award was received by Deputy Director, Tourism, Alyas Ahmad on behalf of the Department.
- Ministers from Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh, representatives of Tourism Boards of several states and UTs, representatives of national travel trade and business bodies were present on the occasion.
- Expo(SATTE), one of the best trade expos in the country in which the J&K Tourism Department was awarded for its efforts in post COVID-19 recovery of the tourism sector.
- It is in place to mention here that last year J&K received a record number of tourists and the De partment for the last two years has been consistently diversifying its tourism products which has gone well among the tourists.

Air India's order for 470 jets at list price of \$70 billion



- Tata group-owned Air India's order for a record 470 aircraft from Airbus and Boeing Co will be at a list price of \$70 billion, Chief Executive Campbell Wilson said, as the airline seeks opportunities to expand in long-haul international.
- Air India had, earlier this month, announced provisional deals for 220 planes from Boeing and 250 from Airbus in an order that would eclipse previous records for an order by a single carrier.
- The airline plans to fund the order with a combination of resources, including internal cash flow, shareholder equity and sale-and-leaseback of aircraft, Wilson told reporters at a press conference.
- Air India, once considered a world-class airline in India, saw its image tarnish in the mid-2000s due to financial troubles, an aging fleet and poor service.
- The airline's renaissance under the Tata conglomerate, which took control of the previously gov ernment-owned carrier last year, aims to capitalize on India's growing

base of fliers and large di aspora across the world.

With new tagline, Pepsi ropes in Ranveer Singh as its new brand ambassador



- PepsiCo India has roped in actor Ranveer Singh to endorse its leading soft drink brand Pepsi.
- Singh joins Pepsi's growing league of celebrity endorsers. In 2019, the brand roped in actor Salman Khan.
- In January, Pepsi had announced that it has roped in Kannada actor Yash as its brand ambassador.
- A leading female actor could soon join the brand's summer campaign that Pepsi is running under the "Rise up Baby" theme.
- Singh, whose brand rankings improved in 2021, had a brand value of \$158.3 million according to a Duff & Phelps report. Singh was the second-most valued brand in the rankings after cricketer Virat Kohli. Singh endorses 45 brands.

- Former governor of Lagos state, Mr. Tinubu, will take command of a nation battling Islamic insur gencies in the northeast, armed attacks, homicides, and kidnappings, strife between farmers and cattle herders, shortages of cash, fuel, and power, and enduring corruption.
- According to the Independent National Election Commission (INEC), Tinubu received 8.79 million votes, surpassingAtikuAbubakar, the leading competitor, who received 6.98 million.
- Younger people preferred the outsider Peter Obi, who received 6.1 million votes.

UN report: Uranium particles enriched to 83.7 per cent found in Iran



- Inspectors from the United Nations nuclear watchdog found uranium particles enriched up to 83.7% in Iran's underground Fordo nuclear site.
- The confidential quarterly report by the Vienna-based International Atomic Energy Agency dis tributed to member states likely will raise tensions further between Iran and the West over its nuclear program.
- That's even as Tehran already faces internal unrest after months of protests and Western anger over sending bomb-carrying drones to Russia for its war on Ukraine.
- The IAEA report only speaks about "particles," suggesting that Iran isn't building a stockpile of ura nium enriched above 60% the level it has been enriching at for some time.
- The IAEA report described inspectors discovering on Jan. 21 that two cascades of IR-6 centrifuges at Iran's Fordo facility had been configured in a way "substantially different" to what had been previously declared.

Air India plans to do away with Vistara brand after merger



- Air India, owned by the Tata group, will discontinue the Vistara brand on completion of its merger with Tata SIA Airlines Ltd, the operator of Vistara airline, chief executive and managing director Campbell Wilson said.
- Tata Group owns a 51 per cent stake and Singapore Airlines the rest in Vistara.
- The full-service carrier will be known as Air India only, which is a much more recognisable brand outside India.
- Some of Vistara's heritage would be retained in that 'new manifestation', said Wilson.
- "The intention is to have one full-service airline and one low-cost airline in the group.
- The full-service airline will be an amalgam of Air India and Vistara," Wilson said during a virtual media interaction.
- He added that the idea was to carry forth the heritage of both Air India and Vistara, and work is undergoing to that end.

Elon Musk returns to the top, becomes richest person on the planet again



- Elon Musk, CEO of Tesla, once again overtook the position of richest person in the world on Febru ary 28, according to a Bloomberg Billionaires Index report.
- The second-placed French business tycoon Bernard Arnault has a net worth of \$185 billion, trail ing Tesla CEO Elon Musk by \$187 billion.
- With a net worth of \$117 billion, Amazon Executive Chairman Jeff Bezos ranks third in terms of wealth.
- The strong increase in Tesla stock price, which rose to 92% in 2023 and outpaced the Nasdaq 100 rally so far in 2023, has been cited as the cause of the jump in Musk's

wealth.

- The government has approved the procurement of 70 HTT-40 Basic Trainer Aircraft from Hindu stan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) for the Indian Air Force at a cost of over six thousand 828 crore rupees. The aircraft will be supplied over a period of six years.
- The Ministry of Defence said, the aircraft will meet the shortage of basic trainer aircraft of IAF for the training of newly inducted pilots.
- The Ministry said, the HTT-40 is a turboprop aircraft and is designed to have good low-speed han dling qualities and provide better training effectiveness.
- According to the Ministry, the procurement is expected to provide direct employment to one thou sand 500 personnel and indirect employment for up to three thousand people spread over more than 100 Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises.
- The acquisition of the HTT-40 provides a fillip to the Indian Aerospace Defence ecosystem and boosts efforts towards 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat'.

Windsor Framework: What is the deal UK and EU have reached to solve the Northern Ireland Protocol tangle



- After months of intensive talks, the United Kingdom and European Union have unveiled an agree ment on the Northern Ireland Protocol, called the Windsor Framework.
- This is not a new protocol or a fundamental rewrite of the current treaty.
- But the package announced this week is an improved deal that could substantively ease how the protocol will operate for businesses as well as individuals.
- It is a negotiating achievement that marks a turning point in the long road since Brexit for North ern Ireland.
- After the UK left the European Union, Northern Ireland remained its only constituent that shared a land border with an EU-member, the Republic of Ireland.
- Since the EU and the UK have different product standards, border checks would be necessary be fore goods could move from Northern Ireland to Ireland.
- However, the two lrelands have had a long history of conflict, with a hard-fought peace secured only in 1998 under the Belfast Agreement, also called the Good Friday

agreement.

- Fiddling with this border was thus considered too dangerous, and it was decided the checks would be conducted between Great Britain and Northern Ireland.
- This was called the Northern Ireland Protocol.

Triple-jumper Aishwarya Babu gets 4-year ban for doping



- India's top triple-jumper Aishwarya Babu has been banned by the National Anti-Doping Agency's (NADA) disciplinary panel for four years for using a prohibited anabolic steroid.
- Aishwarya Babu, 25 years old, was dropped from the Birmingham Commonwealth Games in 2022, along with sprinter S Dhanalakshmi after testing positive for the steroid, which is on the World Anti-Doping Agency's (WADA) prohibited list.
- Aishwarya has been given time till 6th March 2023 to file an appeal against the ban after receiving the ban notice from NADA's Appeal Panel on 13th February 2023.
- Aishwarya previously won the triple jump gold in the championships with a national record-break ing lunge of 14.14 meters.
- She tested positive for Ostarine a drug that falls in the category of selective androgen receptor modulator (SRAM) during the National Inter-State Championships on 13 and 14 J in 2022 in Chennai.
- Aishwarya was provisionally suspended in July last year and she has already served six months of her four-year ban.

- NADA stated that the substance Aishwarya used was an "anabolic steroid" listed under WADA's 2022 prohibited. It added that the athlete had not taken a therapeutic use exemption (TUE) for it.
- Aishwarya on the other hand stated in her submission that she "did not take any prohibited ton order to enhance" her performance.
- The athlete added that she had suffered an injury in the past when her shoulder had dislocated while lifting weights in the gym in February 2021.
- Aishwarya added that in the run-up to the National Inter-state Championships, she
 pushed herself too much, which led her to the "painful discomfort on the Shoulder."

AFI NATIONAL THROWS COMPETITION: JESWINALDRIN BREAKS NATIONAL LONG JUMP RECORD WITH LEAP OF 8.42m TO CLAIM GOLD



- Tamil Nadu's Jeswin Aldrin broke the national record in the men's long jump in the second AFI National Jumps Competition.
- JeswinAldrin, 21-year-old, leaped 8.42 meters to take over the previous mark of 8.36 meters set by India teammate M Sreeshankar at the Federation Cup in Kozhikode in April 2022.
- Aldrin previously won silver at the Asian Indoor Championships in Astana last month with a 7.97-meter jump and made the most of being in a competitive frame to break the national record.
- Aldrin leaped 8.37 meters in Kozhikode last year to win gold but since his jump was wind-aided, it wasn't considered a national record by the Athletics Federation of India (AFI).
- M Sreeshankar, who bagged silver at the AFI National Jumps Competition with a jump of 8.36m, made the national record.
- A measure of Aldrin's dominance can be praised from the fact he was the only competitor to cross the eight-meter mark
- JeswinAldrin opened with 8.05m and followed it up with 8.26 before finding the power and speed to get to 8.42m. Kerala's Muhammed Anees Yahiya was a distant second at 7.85 meters.

• Alongside, Gayathry Sivakumar set the women's triple jump meet record with a jump of over 12.98 meters to break the 12.68m mark set by Aleena Jose in the inaugural edition in Thiruvananthapu ram last year.

RBI launches 2 surveys to gather 'useful inputs' for monetary policy



- The Reserve Bank of India launched two key surveys, the results of which provide "useful inputs" for the central bank's bi-monthly monetary policy.
- One of the surveys is to know inflation expectations of households and the other is to gauge con sumer confidence.
- The March 2023 round of Inflation Expectations Survey of Households (!ESH), RBI said, aims at capturing subjective assessments on price movements and inflation, based on their individual consumption baskets, across 19 cities.
- The cities are: Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, Chandigarh, Chennai, Delhi, Guwa hati, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Jammu, Kolkata, Lucknow, Mumbai, Nagpur, Patna, Raipur, Ranchi and Thi ruvananthapuram.
- The survey seeks qualitative responses from households on price changes (general
 prices as well as prices of specific product groups) in the three months ahead as well
 as in the one year ahead period and quantitative responses on current, three months
 ahead and one year ahead inflation rates.

ACF confers Grandmaster D Gukesh with Player-of-the-Year award



• Indian Grandmaster D Gukesh has been honoured with Player-of-the-Year award by the Asian Chess Federation (ACF) for clinching the gold medal with a record-breaking score of 9/11 in the 44th Chess Olympiad at Mahabalipuram last year.

- In March last year, Gukesh became only the sixth Indian to break the 2700 Ela-rating mark, and the youngest Grandmaster from the country to be rated above 2700.
- The All India Chess Federation (AICF) bagged the 'Most Active Federation' award conferred during the ACF annual summit, which is underway here.
- Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin has been conferred with Man-of-the-Year award for his effort in the successful hosting of the FIDE Chess Olympiad in August last year within a short notice of four months.
- The Indian women's team, comprising of Koneru Humpy, D Harika, R Vaishali, Tania Sachdev and Bhakti Kulkarni, was adjudged the 'Best Women's team of the Year' for its bronze-winning effort.

- Craig Fulton has nearly 25 years of coaching experience and earned 195 caps over a span of 10 years for South Africa. He also played Atlanta and Athens Olympic Games.

- History will be made today when the five-team Women's Premier League (WPL 2023) begins in Navi Mumbai.
- After years of wait and planning, the Board of Control for Cricket in India, BCCI, has finally been able to organise the standalone T20 franchise-based cricket league for women, on the lines of the popular Indian Premier League.
- The five teams taking part in the inaugural edition of WPL are Mumbai Indians (MI), Royal Chal lengers Bangalore (RCB), Delhi Capitals (DC), UP Warriorz (UPW) and Gujarat Giants (GG).
- India captain Harmanpreet Kaur has been named as MI captain while opener Smriti Mandhana will lead RCB's women's team.
- Australia's successful skipper Meg Lanning will be at the helm of Delhi Capitals, while Beth Mooney has been named as captain for Gujarat Giants.
- Australian wicketkeeper and batter Alyssa Healy is leading UP Warriorz in WPL 2023.
- First match between Mumbai Indians and Gujarat Giants will be played at DY Patil Stadium Navi Mumbai, at 7.30 pm on the 4th of March.

Odisha Hits Jackpot As Huge Gold Mines Found In Three Districts



- Steel and Mines Minister Prafulla Kumar Mallik has informed the state Assembly that Gold depos its have been found at different locations in three districts of Odisha, including Deogarh, Keonjhar, and Mayurbhanj.
- The Minister informed that the State Directorate of Mines and geology and the Geological Survey of India (GSI) conducted a preliminary survey and found the presence of gold deposits in the Adas area of Deogarh, Gopur, Gazipur, Kusakala, Adal, Saleikana, Dimirimunda, and Karadanga area of Keonjhar.
- The Gold deposits are also found in the Jashipur, Suriaguda, Ruansi, ladelkucha, Maredihi, Suleipat, and Badampahar areas of the Mayurbhanj district.
- The Minister also informed that the survey conducted by GSI has concluded that 1685kg of gold is present in the copper ore at the G2 Level in the Adas area.
- 6.67 million tonnes of copper, 0.638 million tonnes of silver and 0.10 million tonnes

- of nickel are estimated to have been present in copper ore in the region.
- In survey, two gold-carrying quartz veins were found in the Gopur area during a survey conducted by the State Mine and Geology Directorate from 1977-83, and 1989-96.
- The presence of gold is also found in Saleikana in the Quezon vein on the Southern side of Gopur and Saleikana Area.

Former Chief Justice of India AM Ahmadi passes away at 90 at his home



- Former Chief Justice of India AM. Ahmadi has passed away at the age of 90. Ahmadi was the chief justice from 1994 to 1997.
- His judicial career as a City Civil and Session Court judge in Ahmedabad, he was the only Chief Justice of India who started at the very lowest rank to rise to the highest position of the Indian judiciary.
- Justice Ahmadi was a felicitated jurist not only in India but across the world.
- He was invited by various international organisations, including UNO and World Bank to lead spe cial projects.
- He was the recipient of honors from highly reputable legal institutions such as American Inn of Laws and Middle Temple Inn of Honorable Society of Middle Temple, London.
- Apart from receiving the degree of Doctor of Laws (Honoris Causa) from six of the most reputable Indian universities, he was the author of numerous path breaking judgements.
- His expertise was wide ranging from constitutional law to human rights, freedom of speech, crim inal, taxation, centre-state and interstate relations. He was also the Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University.

RBI puts restrictions on Musiri Urban Co-operative Bank; caps withdrawal



- The Reserve Bank of India imposed a Rs 5,000 cap on withdrawals by individual customers from Tamil Nadu-based Musiri Urban Co-operative Bank as part of several restrictions slapped on the lender due to its deteriorating financial condition.
- The restrictions on the lender will remain in force for six months from the close of business on March 3 and are subject to review, the RBI said in a statement.
- With curbs in place, the cooperative bank, without approval of the RBI, cannot grant loans, make any investment, and disburse any payment. The lender cannot also dispose of any of its properties, among others.
- Meanwhile, the eligible depositors would be entitled to receive deposit insurance claim amounts of his/her deposits up to a monetary ceiling of Rs 5 lakhs in the same capacity and in the same right, from the Deposit Insurance and Credit Guarantee Corporation.
- The RBI, however, said the directions should not per se be construed as cancellation of the banking license.

Mumbai jumps to 37th place globally in price growth in luxury housing



- Mumbai's jumped to rank 37 from 92 in a global list of movement in prices ofluxury homes as the city saw a gain of 6.4 percent during the 2022 calendar year.
- Property consultant Knight Frank virtually released 'The Wealth Report 2023' in which Mumbai has ranked 37th.
- Knight Frank Report states that the value of the Prime International Residential

- Index (PIRI 100) which tracks the movement in luxury house prices across the world increased by 5.2 percent YoY (year-on-year) in 2022.

- Xi's trusted allies will be appointed to key government roles over the next two days as the first session of the 14th NPC will come to an end on Monday.
- Experts said, with Li Keqiang out of scene and Li Qiang heading the State Council China's cabinet, Xi will enjoy unbridled powers.
- This may lead to further blurring of the fine line between the CCP and the government as the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC) is expected to significantly increase its direct control of the government.

International Mathematics Day 2023: Know History, Theme, Significance of Pi day celebrations

- The value for Pi is 3.14. For people who follow the month/date format, March 14 represents the value of Pi (3.14). March is the third month of the year while the following number is 14, hence the March 14 date.
- The day was recognised in 1988 by physicist Larry Shaw as he organised a large-scale celebration at the San Francisco Exploratorium in the United States.
- It was first celebrated by cutting a Pi-shaped pie, and the recitation of the value of pi to as many decimal places as possible.
- It is celebrated by mathematics enthusiasts around the globe to recognise and appreciate the importance of mathematics in our daily lives.
- The day is celebrated by various schools, universities, and mathematics organisations globally with a unique theme with an aim of promoting mathematics education and awareness.
- The value of Pi was first calculated by a mathematician named Archimedes of Syracuse.
- It was later accepted by the scientific community when Leonhard Euler used the symbol of Pi in 1737.
- The theme for Pi Day 2023 is "Mathematics for Everyone", proposed by Marco Zarco Rotairo from Philippines' Trece Martires City National High School, according to the official website of the celebration.
- In 2019, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) in its 40th General Conference decided to observe Pi Day as International Mathematics Day.

US, Australia and Britain to provide Australia with nuclear-powered attack submarines



- The United States, Australia and Britain have announced the plan of providing Australia with nuclear-powered attack submarines.
- The move was a major step towards countering the ambitions of China in the Indo-Pacific.
- In a joint statement, US President Joe Biden, Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese and British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak announced the plan for the AUKUS project at the US naval base in San Diego, California.
- At the ceremony, PM Albanese said that the purchase of US nuclear-powered submarines and the target of constructing its own vessels marks the biggest investment ever made in the defence sector in the history of the country.
- The deal with the United States and Britain is "the biggest single investment in Australia's defence capability in all of our history," he said in San Diego, California, alongside British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak and US President Joe Biden.
- The prime minister made the statement as Australia entered the deal with the US and Britain, according to which it will be purchasing five US nuclear-powered submarines and will later work on building a new model with British and US technology as part of an ambitious plan.
- US President Biden was hosting his British and Australian counterparts, Prime Minister Albanese and Prime Minister Sunak, on a US naval base in San Diego, California for announcing the plan.

GoI announces Rs 1,18,500 crore budget for JK



- Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has unveiled Rs 1,18,500 crore budget for Jammu & Kashmir Union Territory for the next financial year.
- The total budget estimates for the fiscal is Rs. 1,18,500 crore, of which developmental expenditure is of the order of Rs. 41,491 crore.
- The capital component of the budget has increased substantially.
- The expected revenue receipts are Rs 1,06,061 crore whereas Revenue expenditure is expected to be Rs 77,009 crore, thereby making available revenue surplus for capital expenditure to the tune of Rs 29,052 crore.
- This was the fourth consecutive budget of Jammu and Kashmir to be presented in the Parliament.
- The budgets of 2020-21, 2021-22, and 2022-23 were also presented in the Parliament in absence of an elected government in the Union Territory.

Pfizer Buys Seagen for \$43B, Boosts Access to Cancer Drugs



- Pfizer is spending about \$43 billion to acquire Seagen to reach deeper into new cancer treatments that target tumor cells while sparing surrounding healthy tissue.
- The pharmaceutical giant said it will pay \$229 in cash for each share of Seagen Inc.
- Pfizer then plans to let the biotech drug developer "continue innovating," except with more resources than it would have alone, Pfizer Chairman and CEO Albert Bourla told.
- Together, Pfizer and Seagen seek to accelerate the next generation of cancer breakthroughs and bring new solutions to patients by combining the power of Seagen's antibody-drug conjugate (ADC) technology with the scale and strength of Pfizer's capabilities and expertise," Pfizer Chairman and CEO Dr Albert Bourla said in a statement.
- Bothell, Washington-based Seagen Inc. is a biotech drug developer.
- Its key products use monoclonal antibodies that bind to the surface of a tumour cell to deliver a cancer-killing agent while sparing surrounding healthy tissue.

Exercise La Perouse 2023: Navies Of India, Australia, US, UK, France And Japan Participate



- On March 13 and 14, 2023, the Indian Ocean Area will host the third edition of the multilateral exercise La Perouse.
- The Royal Australian Navy, French Navy, Indian Navy, Japanese Maritime Self Defence Force, Royal Navy, and United States Navy will all have people, ships, and essential helicopters participating in this event.
- Every two years exercise La Perouse, an exercise run by the French Navy, aims to improve maritime domain awareness and maritime cooperation among the participating navies in the Indo-Pacific region.
- The two-day exercise gives like-minded navies the chance to forge stronger connections in terms of planning, coordination, and information sharing for seamless maritime operations.
- Surface warfare, anti-air warfare, air defence drills, cross-deck landings, and tactical manoeuvres are only a few of the complicated and sophisticated naval operations that will be performed during the exercise.
- This version of the drill will feature participation from the fleet tanker INS Jyoti and guided missile frigate INS Sahyadri, both of which were built domestically.
- The Indian Navy's participation in the exercise demonstrates the allied navies' high levels of coordination, interoperability, and synergy as well as their dedication to the Indo-Pacific region's rules-based international order.

Two-day G20 flower festival begins in New Delhi



• Connaught Plaza in Delhi will host a Flower Festival beginning from, March 11. It aims to emphasize the diversity of G20 participants and invited nations.


- The festival, which is being held at Central Park and is being organized by the New Delhi Municipal Council, was opened today by Union Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav.
- Japan, Singapore, and the Netherlands are among the G20 nations taking part.

- For the purpose of showcasing the richness of the Indian subcontinent, flower plants in a variety of hues and kinds are on display in various configurations and installations.

Silicon Valley Bank Collapses, Biggest Banking Failure Since 2008



- Startup-focused lender Silicon Valley Bank Financial Group became the largest bank to fail since the 2008 financial crisis, in a sudden collapse that roiled global markets, left billions of dollars belonging to companies and investors stranded.
- Silicon Valley Bank, the nation's 16th largest bank, collapsed on Friday, forcing a
 government takeover and calling into question the fate of almost \$175 billion in
 customer deposits.
- Signature Bank, the 29th-largest bank in the U.S., also closed its doors, suggesting the financial panic had spread.
- Many bank stocks plummeted in early trading. First Republic Bank dropped 65% before trading was halted; Western Alliance Bancorp fell almost 60%. Charles Schwab, the eight-largest U.S. bank, dropped nearly 10%.
- Silicon Valley Bank's failure is the largest since Washington Mutual went bust in 2008, a hallmark event that triggered a financial crisis that hobbled the economy for years.
- The 2008 crash prompted tougher rules in the United States and beyond.

World Consumer Rights Day 2023



- World Consumer Rights Day is celebrated today, March 15 to raise the awareness about the rights of consumers.
- The theme of the World Consumer Rights Day, 2023 is "Empowering consumers through clean energy transitions".
- World Consumer Rights Day came into being in 1983.
- It was inspired by a speech given by John Fitzgerald Kennedy, the former president of the United States of America, to the U.S. Congress on consumer rights.
- In India, the government passed the Consumer Protection Act,1986 that outlines some basic consumer rights.
- Talking to Media, Additional Secretary, Department of Consumer Affairs, Nidhi Khare
 has said that in consonance with the theme, the primary thrust is on deployment
 of technology to reduce dependence of traditional energy sources such as fossil
 fuels, Ms Khare added that rapid transition to clean energy solutions will promote
 sustainability, security, affordability and access to consumers in the long term.

State Bank of India raises Rs 3,717 cr from its third AT1 bond sale



- State Bank of India (SBI) has raised Rs 3,717 crore through its third Basel III compliant Additional Tier 1 bond issuance in the current financial year at coupon rate of 8.25 per cent.
- SBI said the issue attracted overwhelming response from investors with bids of Rs 4,537 crore and was oversubscribed by about 2.27 times against the base issue of Rs 2,000 crore.

- The total number of bids were 53 indicating wider participation.
- The investors were across provident and pension funds and insurance companies.
- This issuance is also very significant as SBI has been able to successively diversify and raise long term Additional Tier 1 capital with a call option after 10 years and this will help the bank in managing its capital adequacy effectively.
- The country's largest lender says that the proceeds of bonds will be utilised in augmenting Additional Tier 1 Capital and overall capital base of the Bank and for strengthening capital adequacy in accordance with RBI Guidelines.

IDFC Mutual Fund (MF) has rebranded itself as Bandhan Mutual Fund.



- IDFC Mutual Fund has rebranded itself as Bandhan Mutual Fund. The change in name will be effective from March 13.
- All the schemes of the fund house will be renamed to replace the word 'IDFC' with the word 'Bandhan'.
- The rebranding includes a change of the name and the logo. According to the fund house, the name and ownership change will have no bearing on the investment strategy and processes of the schemes.
- The Securities and Exchange Board of India had cleared the Bandhan-linked consortium's proposed acquisition of IDFC Mutual Fund in December 2022.
- Earlier in 2022, a consortium of Bandhan Financial Holdings GIC, and Chrys Capital signed an agreement to buy IDFC AMC and IDFC AMC Trustee Company from parent IDFC for Rs 4,500 crore.
- The company, which was earlier a part of the IDFC group, was acquired by a Bandhan Financial Holdings-led consortium in April 2022.
- The deal was approved by the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) in November 2022.

International Day to Combat Islamophobia - March 15



- In 2022, the United Nations established the International Day To Fight Islamophobia, which is observed annually on March 15 across 140 nations.
- March 15 was selected as the date because it marks the anniversary of the Christchurch mosque massacres, which left 51 people dead.
- The UN has approved a resolution designating March 15 as the International Day to Fight Islamophobia, which was put forth by Pakistan and the Organization of Islamic Cooperation.
- The resolution was passed three years to the day after a right-wing fanatic attacked two mosques in New Zealand with a bomb, killing over 50 Muslims.
- The Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) had 60 member states, and the UN General Assembly approved a resolution that declared March 15 to be the International Day to Fight Islamophobia.
- The statement emphasises that no religion, nation, civilization, or ethnic group should be linked to terrorism or violent extremism.
- It urges an international conversation about fostering a culture of peace and tolerance based on adherence to human rights.

SPACEX LAUNCHES 40 ONEWEB INTERNET SATELLITES, LANDS A ROCKET.



- SpaceX launched a Falcon 9 rocket from Cape Canaveral Space Force Station with 40 more internet satellites for rival OneWeb, followed by the landing of the rocket's first stage booster back at the Florida spaceport.
- The two-stage Falcon 9 lifted off from Cape Canaveral Space Force Station in Florida at 2:13 p.m. EST (1913 GMT).

- The rocket's first stage came back to Earth right on schedule, touching down on a landing pad at Cape Canaveral about 7 minutes and 50 seconds after launch.
- SpaceX's 16th Mission of the Year:
- The mission, SpaceX's 16th flight of the year overall, was the third and final planned dedicated Falcon 9 launch for OneWeb, which switched launch providers from Russia's Soyuz rocket to SpaceX and Indian rockets last year after the Russian invasion of Ukraine.
- OneWeb has another reservation with SpaceX for a rideshare mission with Iridium later this year.

India eighth most polluted country in the world; Lahore most polluted city



- According to the 'Global Air Quality' study published by the Swiss company IQAir, India fell from the fifth to the eighth most polluted nation in the world in 2022.
- The research shows that the PM2.5 level in the most polluted Indian cities is 53.3.
- The two Indian cities that made the list of the most polluted cities in the world are Bhiwadi, which is a suburb of Delhi, and Delhi, which was not far behind at 92.6.
- At the same time, 39 out of 50 cities in the list of most polluted cities are from India.
- In India, the transport industry is responsible for 20–35% of the country's PM2.5 pollution. The use of biomass fuels, industrial facilities, and coal-fired power plants are other contributors of air quality degradation.
- Among the top 50 most polluted cities worldwide, Delhi comes in at number four. The city with the highest pollution is Lahore, Pakistan, followed by Hotan, China. Rajasthan's Bhiwadi is ranked third.
- According to the data, Delhi's PM2.5 concentration is about 20 times higher than the recommended amount.
- The research makes a distinction between "big" Delhi and the capital city of New Delhi because Delhi has historically been the most polluted capital in the world.
- Both cities rank among the top 10, but N'Djamena, in Chad, has the dubious distinction of being the world's most polluted capital.

• Pollution levels have decreased in NCR areas including Noida, Ghaziabad, Gurugram, and Faridabad.

Mumbai-Ahmedabad Bullet Train Coming This Year. Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw Shares Status Report



- The much anticipated Mumbai-Ahmedabad bullet train launch has been delayed by three years as only 26% of the work has been completed so far, said Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw.
- The original deadline for the launch of the Mumbai-Ahmedabad bullet train was December 2023.
- The Railway Minister took to Twitter to share the status report on the bullet train.
- Vaishnaw, in his tweet, said, "there is 26.33 per cent overall physical progress as on February 28, 2023.
- It mentioned that Maharashtra had completed 13.72 per cent of the overall work.
- Gujarat, on the other hand, had finished more than 52 per cent of the civil work and has a current completion rate of 36.93 per cent overall."

NASA unveils new generation of spacesuit for humanity's return trip to Moon



- NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration) has been unveiled a new generation of spacesuit for humanity's return trip to the Moon.
- The novel design of the spacesuit comes with specialist features to support astronauts as they conduct scientific experiments on the lunar surface.
- The prototype is said to be a better fit for female space travelers.

- NASA said that it hopes to have the updated suit ready for the Artemis III mission to the Moon in 2025.
- When NASA announced that humanity would return to the moon after more than five decades, they promised to send the first woman and person of colour to the lunar surface.
- However, previous plans to send female astronauts to space have been scuppered by the lack of spacesuits in their size.
- A well-fitting suit is crucial to prevent excessive fatigue and at worst, physical harm.
- The existing spacesuits worn by US space travelers have not been fully redesigned since 1981.

India remains world's largest arms importer, share of Russian imports fell to 45 per cent



India is still the world's largest importer of military equipment, despite an 11% decline in arms purchases between 2013–17 and 2018–22, according to a study by

the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (Sipri).

- The report is released at a time when India has intensified its efforts to become selfreliant in the defence manufacturing sector.
- This year's defence budget included about Rs 1 lakh crore for domestic purchases, compared to Rs 84,598 crore, Rs 70,221 crore, and Rs 51,000 crore in the three years prior.
- According to data published by the think tank that tracks weapons imports over a five-year period, India had the biggest percentage of the world's arms imports in the past five years at 11%, followed by Saudi Arabia (9.6%), Qatar (6.4%), Australia (4.7%), and China (4.7%).
- The most recent report supports the findings of the Sipri report from last year. India remained still the world's top importer of weaponry in 2022, despite a 21% decline in imports between 2012–16 and 2017–21, according to the report.
- A cumbersome procurement process and efforts to replace imports with local products, according to the latest research, were among the causes of the drop in India's imports.

India's worker-population-ratio rises to 52.9% in 2021-22



- The unemployment rate in the country is witnessing a declining trend. The unemployment rate was 4.8 per cent in 2019-20, which was subsequently, reduced to 4.1 per cent in 2021-22.
- This was stated by Minister of State for Labour and Employment Rameswar Teli in a written reply in Rajya Sabha on Thursday.
- He said, the worker-population ratio is witnessing an increasing trend as per the latest Periodic Labour Force Survey.
- The worker population ratio has increased from 50.9 per cent in 2019-20 to 52.9 per cent in 2021-22, reflecting higher engagement of people in productive activities, he added.

- Shaktikanta Das, Governor of the Reserve Bank of India, has been honored with the title "Governor of the Year" for 2023 by Central Banking, an international economic research journal.
- The publication praised Das for his steady leadership during challenging periods, including the collapse of a significant non-banking company, the initial and second waves of the COVID-19 pandemic, and inflationary pressures due to Russia's invasion of Ukraine.
- This is the second time an Indian central bank governor has received the award, with Raghuram Rajan being the previous recipient in 2015.
- Das's leadership at RBI was critical in implementing essential reforms, innovative payment systems, and growth-oriented measures during the pandemic.
- He skillfully navigated political pressures and economic crises, earning accolades for his efforts.
- Although the National Bank of Ukraine was also honored with the Central Bank of the Year award, Das was deemed a deserving recipient of the Governor of the Year award due to his leadership during times of crisis and his significant contributions to India's economic reforms.

Ram Sahaya Prasad Yadav elected as Nepal's third Vice President



- Janata Samajbadi Party leader Ram Sahaya Prasad Yadav has been elected as Nepal's third Vice President. In today's voting, Yadav defeated Astalaxmi Shakya of CPN (UML) and Mamata Jha of the Janamat Party.
- He had received support from the Nepali Congress, CPN (Maoist Centre), and the CPN (Unified Socialist) including the ruling alliance.
- A total of 311 federal lawmakers and 518 Provincial Assembly members took part in the poll.
- The polling centre for the election was set up at the New Baneshwor-based Federal Parliament Building in Kathmandu.

- According to the Constitution, the Vice-president may perform the duties of the President during the latter's absence.
- The term of the Vice President is five years, from the date on which he or she is elected.
- Ram Sahaya Prasad Yadav was the former Minister for Forests and Environment and a member of the first Federal Parliament of Nepal.

New Zealand to ban TikTok on devices linked to parliament



- New Zealand will ban TikTok on devices with access to the parliamentary network because of cybersecurity concerns.
- New Zealand's Parliamentary Service Chief Executive Rafael Gonzalez-Montero informed that TikTok will be banned on all devices by the end of this month.
- Yesterday, Britain also banned the app on government phones with immediate effect.
- The United States, Canada, Belgium and the European Commission have already banned the app from official devices.

International Ayurvet conclave on 'Veterinary and Ayurveda' inaugurated at Haridwar



Ordnance Factory Day 2023



- Ordnance Factory Day 2023: In India, Ordnance Factory Day is celebrated annually on March 18th, marking the establishment of the first Ordnance factory by the British in Cossipore, Kolkata, in 1801 during colonial rule.
- The Ministry of Defence celebrates this day by raising the Indian flag, singing the national anthem, and showcasing various artillery and military equipment used by the Indian Armed Forces to the public.
- Ordnance Factories are a government branch responsible for researching, developing, testing, producing, and marketing weapons for the military.
- The day is significant as it recognizes the contribution of Ordnance factories to India's defense capabilities and the tireless efforts of the personnel who work in these factories to ensure the safety and security of the country.
- It is an occasion to honor the achievements of the Ordnance factories and pay tribute to the brave soldiers who use the equipment produced by them to protect the nation.

US recognises McMahon Line as international boundary between China and Arunachal Pradesh



- The United States recognises the McMahon Line as the international boundary between China and Arunachal Pradesh, according to a bipartisan Senate resolution which sees Arunachal Pradesh as an integral part of India.
- The resolution, titled 'Reaffirmation of Arunachal Pradesh as Indian territory and condemnation of China's provocative activities in South Asia', came after a major clash between the Indian and Chinese forces in Arunachal's Tawang in December last year.
- The McMahon Line serves as the de facto boundary between China and India in the Eastern Sector. It specifically represents the boundary between Arunachal Pradesh and Tibet, from Bhutan in the west to Myanmar in the east.
- China has historically disputed the boundary and claims the state of Arunachal Pradesh as part of the Tibetan Autonomous Region (TAR).

ICC issues arrest warrant for Vladimir Putin over Ukraine war crimes



- The International Criminal Court (ICC) issued an arrest warrant for Russian President Vladimir Putin over the forced transfer of children to Russia after the Kremlin's invasion of Ukraine.
- Ukrainians accuse Russia of attempting genocide against them and seeking to destroy their identity partly through deporting children to Russia.
- The ICC issued the warrant for Putin's arrest on suspicion of unlawful deportation of children and unlawful transfer of people from the territory of Ukraine to the Russian Federation.

- This is the first time the ICC has issued warrants in relation to Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine, which began last February. It comes ahead of a visit to Russia by Chinese President Xi Jinping and will severely limit Putin's own potential range of diplomatic visits.
- Moscow has previously said it did not recognize the court's authority.

ISSF World Cup Shooting Championship to begin at Bhopal in Madhya Pradesh



- International Shooting Sports Federation- ISSF World Cup Shooting Championship is organised in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh from today to 27 March.
- The official opening ceremony will be held on 21 March while competitions begin on 22 March at Madhya Pradesh State Shooting Academy.
- Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan will formally inaugurate this
 event on 21 March. Around 325 shooters from 33 countries and more than 75
 technical officials will participate in the World Cup Shooting Championship.
- The Championship is being organized in collaboration with the Government of Madhya Pradesh and the Rifle Federation of India.
- It is the 8th World Cup organised in India and the first international shooting tournament to be held outside New Delhi.

- High Commissioner Pranay Verma and Minister of Education of Bangladesh Dr. Dipu Moni on Saturday jointly inaugurated the Indian Higher Education Meet 2023.

programme.


- In his address, the High Commissioner remarked that higher education has emerged as a centrepiece of India's deep rooted partnership with Bangladesh.

- Dr.Swadesh Singh, Sous Sherpa of C-20, while addressing in the pre-event press conference regarding Inception meeting of C-20 in Nagpur today informed that the two-day Conference will focus on the perspective of the Civil Society Organizations and non-government organisations.

In poll year, Ashok Gehlot announces 19 new districts, 3 divisions



- Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot on Friday announced in the Assembly the creation of as many as 19 new districts and three divisions, including creation of new districts out of state capital Jaipur.
- Reacting to the announcement, former CM Vasundhara Raje said, "This is an attempt to fulfil personal political self-interests.
- Several important facts have been overlooked in the process of creating new districts.
- And, so rather than facilitating things, people will have to face administrative difficulties due to creation of these new districts."
- Jaipur will now be divided into four smaller districts: Jaipur North, Jaipur South, and Dudu. Kotputli, which is also a part of Jaipur, will be merged with Behror in Alwar to create another district.
- Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot to make Anupgarh, Balotra, Beawar, Deeg, Didwana-Kuchaman, Dudu, Gangapur City, Jaipur North, Jaipur South, Jodhpur East, Jodhpur West, Kekri, Kotputli-Behror, Khairthal, Neem Ka Thana, Phalodi, Salumbar, Sanchore and Shahpura districts.
- The CM also declared adding three new administrative: Sikar, Banswara and Pali.
- Jaipur North, Jaipur South, Dudu and Phalodi districts have been carved out of Jaipur district.
- Jodhpur East, Jodhpur West and Kotputli-Behror districts have been carved out of Jodhpur district.
- For the new districts and divisions, Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot proposed a budget of Rs 2,000 crore for the first phase of implementation of infrastructure and human resource development.

Swimmer Sampanna Ramesh Shelar becomes fastest Indian in U21 group to swim across Palk Strait from Talaimannar in Sri Lanka to Dhanuskodi in Tamil Nadu



- Sampanna Ramesh Shelar, a Bachelor of Physical Education student, has set a new record by becoming the fastest Indian in the under-21 category to swim across the Palk Strait, from Talaimannar in Sri Lanka to Dhanuskodi in Tamil Nadu.
- He completed the 29 km distance in just 5 hours and 30 minutes, beating the previous record of 8 hours and 26 minutes.
- Shelar started his swim at 6:00 am on Thursday and reached Dhanushkodi at 11:26 am.
- He is coached by Mr. Jitendra Khasnis and plans to complete solo swims across the English and Catalina Channels to achieve the Oceans Seven Challenge.
- With this achievement, Mr. Shelar plans to swim solo across the English and Catalina channels soon, popularly known as the Oceans Seven Challenge, to eventually complete swimming across the Seven Oceans.

Lalit Kumar Gupta appointed as CMD of Cotton Corporation of India (CCI)



- Lalit Kumar Gupta has been approved as the new Chairman and Managing Director (CMD) of the Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) by the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC).
- CCI is a public sector undertaking under the Ministry of Textile.
- An order from the Department of Personnel & Training (DoPT) has been issued, stating that Gupta will assume the role of CMD of CCI with immediate effect, for a period of five years or until his superannuation, or until further orders, whichever comes first.
- Gupta was suggested by the PESB panel for the position of CMD of CCI, and he

currently holds the position of Director (Finnane) within the same organisation.

- Gupta has earned his MBA in Marketing from the ITM Business School located in Navi Mumbai, and he is a Chartered Accountant (CA) certified by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI). He is also a member of the Institute of the Company Secretaries of India (ICSI).

Afghanistan most impacted by terrorism for fourth straight year, India ranks 13th: Global Terrorism Index



- Afghanistan remains the country most impacted by terrorism for the fourth consecutive year, despite attacks and deaths falling by 75 per cent and 58 per cent, respectively, the tenth Global Terrorism Index (GTI) report showed.
- India ranked 13th on the index, marking only a marginal decrease from the previous year.
- In spite of being among the 25 worst-hit nations on the index, Indian respondents desisted from selecting war and terrorism as the biggest threat to their daily safety.
- The Global Terrorism Index is an annual ranking produced by the Institute for Economics and Peace. As even the definition of terrorism is hotly debated, it is essential to highlight that the methodologies used to measure terrorism are also contested.
- The Global Terrorism Index ranks 163 countries on four indicators weighted over five years. These four factors are: the number of terrorist incidents per year, the number of fatalities caused by terrorists per year, the number of injuries caused by terrorists per year, and total property damage caused by terrorism per year.
- The index provides a comprehensive summary of the key global trends and patterns in terrorism since 2000. It produces a composite score in order to provide an ordinal ranking of countries on the impact of terrorism.
- The GTI is based on data from the Global Terrorism Database (GTD) which is collected and collated by the National Consortium for the Study of Terrorism and Responses to Terrorism (START) at the University of Maryland.

- Bawa's distinct architectural style, which blended modernism with traditional elements, is highly acclaimed.
- He designed several prominent buildings in Sri Lanka, including the Sri Lankan Parliament, which is considered one of his most impressive works.
- Bawa's architectural designs also influenced many iconic buildings in India.
- His unique style has had a significant impact on modern architecture in Sri Lanka and beyond, inspiring architects and designers globally.

G Krishnakumar takes over as Bharat Petroleum Corporation's chairman



- Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL), a 'Maharatna' and a Fortune Global 500 Company, announced that G.
- Krishnakumar has taken over as the Chairman and Managing Director of the company.
- Krishnakumar, an electrical and electronics engineer from National Institute of Technology, Tiruchirappalli and a postgraduate in finance management from Jamnalal Bajaj Institute of Management Studies, Mumbai, was executive director in the company before his elevation.
- He replaces Arun Kumar Singh, who retired as chairman in October 2022.

- Post that, Gupta was holding additional charge of the chairman.
- Krishnakumar will hold the position of chairman and managing director till April 2025 or until any further notice, whichever is earlier, according to an official order.

Former Australia test cricket captain Tim Paine retires



- Tim Paine, the former captain of the Australian test cricket team, has announced his retirement from cricket after playing his last Sheffield Shield first-class match for Tasmania against Queensland.
- Paine led the Australian team in 23 tests from 2018 to 2021 and played a total of 35 tests in his career.
- He took over as captain after Steve Smith was stripped of the role following the ball-tampering scandal during Australia's 2018 tour of South Africa.
- Paine stepped down from the captaincy in 2021 after admitting to sending inappropriate messages to a former Cricket Tasmania employee.
- In his test career, Paine had an average of 32.63 with a highest score of 92 and made 157 dismissals as a wicketkeeper.
- He also played 35 one-day internationals for Australia.
- Paine, who hails from Hobart, played for Tasmania for over 18 years, debuting in 2005 and featuring in 153 first-class matches.

Rohan Bopanna becomes oldest ATP Masters 1000 champion by winning men's doubles title at Indian Wells



• Rohan Bopanna, a 43-year-old Indian tennis player, and his Australian partner Matthew Ebden have become the oldest duo to win an ATP Masters 1000 title.

- They won the men's doubles final at the Indian Wells Masters 2023 tournament in California by defeating the top-seeded team of Wesley Koolhof and Neil Skupski.
- Bopanna and Ebden won the first set 6-3 but lost the second set 2-6.
- However, they managed to win the match by clinching the deciding tie-breaker 10-8.
- Bopanna has now won 24 ATP titles, including five ATP Masters 1000, and has become the oldest player to win an ATP Masters 1000 title, breaking the record of Canadian Daniel Nestor, who won the 2015 Cincinnati Masters at the age of 42.
- This was Bopanna's second title this year, having won the Qatar Open with Ebden last month.
- In the semi-finals of the Indian Wells Masters, the unseeded Bopanna-Ebden pair defeated the defending champions John Isner and Jack Sock of the USA in straight sets.
- They also won their quarter-final match against the Canadian pair of Felix Auger-Aliassime and Denis Shapovalov in straight sets.
- Bopanna-Ebden received a walkover in the round of 16 and won their opening match against Rafael Matos of Brazil and David Vega Hernandez of Spain in three sets.

Joe Biden to present 2021 National Humanities Medals to Indian-American Mindy Kaling



- The White House has announced that US President Joe Biden will bestow the 2021 National Humanities Medals upon several recipients, including Indian-American actress, comedian, and writer Mindy Kaling, also known as Vera Mindy Chokalingam.
- The National Medal of Arts is the most prestigious award granted by the US government to artists, arts advocates, and organizations.
- It recognizes individuals and groups who have made outstanding contributions to the arts in America and served as role models through their exceptional accomplishments, assistance, or sponsorship.
- According to an announcement from the White House, US President Joe Biden will
 present the 2021 National Humanities Medals and National Medal of Arts to over a
 dozen recipients, including Indian-American actress and writer Mindy Kaling.

• These awards recognize individuals or groups who have made significant contributions to advancing the arts and humanities in America, broadening public engagement with subjects such as history, literature, languages, and philosophy.

- A core focus of World Water Day is to inspire action toward Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 6: Water and Sanitation for all by 2030.
- The day also focuses attention on the importance of freshwater and advocates for the sustainable management of freshwater resources.
- The focus of World Water Day 2023 is on Accelerating Change to solve the water and sanitation
- crisis.
- The government of India, under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has been implementing various schemes and programmes like Jal Jeevan Mission, Atal Bhujal Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana, Namami Gange, National Aquifer Mapping and Management programme, etc., for water conservation and for increasing the level of groundwater.
- As on 21st March 2023, over 11.49 crore households have been provided tap water connections and over 1.53 lakh villages have become Har Ghar Jal.
- Over 11 crore Individual Household Latrines have been built across all States and UTs since October 2014.

Bangladesh commissions its first submarine base



- Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina inaugurated the first submarine base of Bangladesh 'BNS Sheikh Hasina' at Pekua in Cox's Bazar on Monday.
- Hailing the newly inaugurated naval base as an 'ultra modern submarine base', Prime Minister called the event a proud chapter in the history of Bangladesh navy.
- Inaugurating the submarine base virtually from her official residence Ganabhaban in Dhaka, Prime Minister Hasina said that the newly commissioned submarine base would help navy increase its operational capacity to secure the vast marine resources.
- Ships passing through the Bay of Bengal also can take help from the base, said Sheikh Hasina.
- Prime Minister Hasina said that her government has been working on 'Forces Goal 2030' to transform its military force into a modern organization suitable for the times.
- She said that two submarines were added to the fleet of Bangladesh Navy in March 2017 which has turned it into a three dimensional naval force.
- She said the country is building ships in local shipyards for its own use as well as for others.
- Bangladesh Navy has completed the construction of five patrol craft including large ones in Khulna shipyard, she said.
- Highlighting the growing strength of Bangladesh Navy, Prime Minister Hasina said that in the last 14 years, a total of 31 warships, including 4 frigates, 6 corvettes, 4 large patrol crafts, 5 patrol crafts and 2 training ships were added to its fleet.

ISRO to launch OneWeb India-2 mission from Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota



- The Indian Space Research Organisation ISRO will launch OneWeb India-2 mission from Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota on March 26.
- Under a commercial agreement with NewSpace India Limited, ISRO will launch 72 satellites of the UK-based Network Access Associates Limited and place them in low Earth orbits.
- NewSpace is the commercial wing of ISRO. The first set of 36 satellites was launched on October 23 last year by the LVM3 M2 launch vehicle.
- In the second mission on March 26th, the remaining 36 satellites weighing about 5805 kgs will be placed in 450 km circular low Earth orbit by LVM3 M3 launch vehicle.
- The LVM3 had five consecutive successful missions, including the Chandrayaan 2 mission.
- The satellites offer space based broadband internet services to the corners of the world.
- After the launch, Access Associates Limited will have over 600 satellites in space offering internet from space services in various countries.

India Inaugurates Asia's Largest Liquid Mirror Telescope To Unravel Mysteries Of Space



- Dr. Jitendra Singh, the Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science & Technology, inaugurated Asia's largest 4-meter International Liquid Mirror Telescope at Devasthal, Uttarakhand, in the presence of Lt. Gen (Retd.) Gurmeet Singh, the Governor of Uttarakhand.
- The Aryabhatta Research Institute of Observational Sciences (ARIES) has declared that the 4-meter International Liquid Mirror Telescope (ILMT) is operational and can now be used to observe the deep celestial sky.
- The telescope recorded its first light in the second week of May 2022 and is located on the Devasthal Observatory campus of ARIES in the Nainital district of Uttarakhand.
- ARIES is an independent institute under the Department of Science and Technology (DST) of the Indian Government, situated at an altitude of 2450 meters.
- Dr. Jitendra Singh has stated that the International Liquid Mirror Telescope (ILMT)
 project involves collaborations with researchers from various institutes including
 ARIES in India, the University of Liege and the Royal Observatory of Belgium in

Belgium, Poznan Observatory in Poland, the Ulugh Beg Astronomical Institute of the Uzbek Academy of Sciences and National University of Uzbekistan in Uzbekistan, and Canadian universities such as the University of British Columbia, Laval University, the University of Montreal, the University of Toronto, York University, and the University of Victoria.

• The telescope was constructed by the Advanced Mechanical and Optical Systems (AMOS) Corporation and the Centre Spatial de Liege in Belgium.

Merlin Group plans to develop a World Trade Center in Kolkata



- Merlin Group has partnered with the World Trade Centers Association to develop a World Trade Center in Kolkata that will cover an area of 3.5 million square feet.
- The project's License Agreement was signed by Scott Wang, Vice President of the World Trade Centers Association (WTCA) Asia Pacific region, and Merlin Group's Chairman, Sushil Mohta, and Managing Director, Saket Mohta.
- The project, which is being built in Salt Lake, West Bengal, is estimated to require an investment of approximately Rs 1,500 crore.
- The oldest World Trade Center in India is located in Mumbai, and there are additional Centers in Bangalore, Chennai, New Delhi, Noida, Pune, and other cities.
- The construction of the proposed World Trade Center in Kolkata is expected to enhance the economic growth of West Bengal and Eastern India by promoting partnerships with international trade organizations and investors from other countries via other World Trade Center members.
- This development is projected to bring a substantial contribution to the state's finances and create employment opportunities for 30,000 people.

AFINDEX 2023: Second Africa-India joint military exercise begins in Pune today



- The Africa-India Field Training Exercise (AFINDEX-2023) has begun with the participation of 100 participants from 23 African countries, including Botswana, Egypt, Ghana, Nigeria, Tanzania, and Zambia, among others.
- The exercise aims to improve interoperability and operational readiness for UN peacekeeping missions, and focuses on Humanitarian Mine Action and Peace Keeping Operations.
- The joint exercise is divided into four phases, including training of trainers, a Humanitarian Mine Action and Peace Keeping Operations Phase, and a validation exercise to assess the results of the training.
- The exercise seeks to enhance peace and security, exchange ideas, and promote a collaborative approach in capacity enhancement of African armies.
- Tactical drills, procedures, and the ability to operate jointly with seamless interoperability are the primary focus of the joint exercise.
- The joint military exercise between India and 23 nations of the African continent, AFINDEX-2023, is a continuation of India's efforts to enhance its relationship with Africa, which began with the India-Africa Summit in 2008 and was subsequently held in 2015 and 2019.
- The exercise is focused on Humanitarian Mine Action and Peace Keeping Operations, with the aim of improving the interoperability and operational readiness of the participating countries for UN peacekeeping missions through military engagement and cooperation.

Pankaj Advani retains Asian Billiards title



- Pankaj Advani, the Indian cue sports champion, has retained his Asian Billiards title in the 100-up format after defeating his compatriot Brijesh Damani 5-1 in the final held at Qatar Billiards and Snooker Federation (QBSF) Academy.
- Advani, who has won the International Billiards and Snooker Federation (IBSF) world championship 25 times, won the match with a scoreline of 100(51)-18, 100(88)-9, 86(54)-101(75), 100-26, 100(66)-2, 101(64)-59
- In the women's category, Bai Yulu of China defeated Panchaya Channoi from Thailand 3-0 in the final.

- This is Advani's eighth Asian Billiards title, and he has previously received the Arjuna Award in 2004, Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna in 2006, Padma Shri in 2009, and Padma Bhushan in 2018. He had won the same title in Doha last year.
- Advani, who hails from Bengaluru and is 37 years old, has won the billiards world title 17 times, the IBSF World Billiards Championship 16 times, and the World Team Billiards Championship once.
- He has also won gold medals in English Billiards singles at the 2006 and 2010 Asian Games.

ISSF World Cup Shooting Championship: India win bronze medal in 10m Air Rifle Mixed Team event in Bhopal



- Indian pair Narmada Nithin Raju and Rudrankksh Balasaheb Patil won bronze medal as they beat China mix team by 16-8 in the 10m Air Rifle Mixed Team bronze medal match in ISSF World Cup shooting championship in Bhopal today.
- Earlier Nithin and Rudrankksh finished 3rd in qualification with 632 points. This is the third medal for India.

Venezuelan President appoints PDVSA head Pedro Rafael Tellechea as new oil minister



- Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro appointed Pedro Rafael Tellechea, the head
 of state oil company PDVSA, as the country's new oil minister on Tuesday, March
 21, a day after his predecessor resigned amid an extensive corruption investigation
 centred on the company.
- A Former Minister, Tareck El Aissami, resigned on Monday following the arrest of several government officials and judges in connection with the graft scam.
- According to sources familiar with the situation, more than 20 lower-level PDVSA

officials have also been detained in recent days.

- Mr.Tellechea has been the head of PDVSA since January and has ordered an audit into the massive losses suffered last year as tankers left the country without proper cargo payments.
- The government has provided few details about alleged corruption at the company, but a source said on Monday that the PDVSA arrests are linked to an investigation into the cargoes.

QS World Rankings 2023: IIT Delhi Enters List Of Top 50 Institutions For Engineering



- The Indian Institute of Technology-Delhi has been ranked among the top 50 engineering institutions in the QS World University Rankings by Subject 2023.
- Additionally, this year, a total of 44 programmes offered by Indian higher education institutions in various disciplines have been ranked in the top 100 globally.
- This represents an increase from last year's report, which saw 35 Indian programmes listed in the top 100.
- Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) has released a statement indicating that Delhi University has the highest number of entries (27) among Indian universities, followed by the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Bombay (25), and IIT Kharagpur (23). In the thirteenth edition of the QS World University Rankings by Subject, 66 universities from India have been ranked.
- Collectively, these universities have achieved 355 entries, which represents an 18.7% increase from the previous year's 299 entries.

Sergio Pérez wins Saudi Arabia Grand Prix but Max Verstappen keeps title lead



- At the Saudi Arabia Grand Prix of the 2023 Formula One season, Sergio Perez displayed a dominant performance and earned his first win.
- His teammate at Red Bull, Max Verstappen, secured the second position after starting from the 15th spot.
- Although Verstappen retained his lead in the championship standings with his fastest lap, Fernando Alonso was the focus of the battle for the final podium spot, finishing in third place.

Stadium named after hockey star Rani Rampal, first woman to get this honour



- Rani Rampal, a prominent player on the Indian hockey team, has achieved a significant milestone as the first woman in the sport to have a stadium named after her.
- The MCF Rae Bareli has renamed the hockey stadium to 'Rani's Girls Hockey Turf' in her honor.
- Earlier this year, Rani Rampal made a successful comeback to the Indian hockey team during the tour of South Africa, where she was selected as one of the 22 players in the squad.
- Prior to this, she had last played for India in the FIH Women's Hockey Pro League 2021-22 against Belgium, where she earned her 250th cap.
- After struggling with injuries since the Tokyo Olympics, the 28-year-old player was left out of both the 2022 World Cup and Commonwealth Games squads.
- However, she is now making a return to international hockey and has been included in the 22-member squad.

- The themes chosen for World Meteorological Day are related to current weather, climate, or water-related issues.


India, UK hold joint maritime exercise 'Konkan' in Arabian Sea



- Konkan 2023, a joint maritime exercise, was conducted between the Royal Navy of Britain and the Indian Navy from the 20th of March to the 22nd, off the Konkan coast in the Arabian Sea.
- The joint drill by the two navies demonstrated operational readiness, enhancing interoperability and improving the ability to conduct joint operations.
- The exercise will go a long way in bolstering the combined efforts of the Indian Navy and Royal Navy to strengthen maritime security and uphold a rules-based order in the region.
- INS Trishul, a guided missile frigate, and HMS Lancaster, a Type 23 guided missile frigate, participated in this edition and undertook multiple maritime drills to enhance interoperability and imbibe best practices.
- The exercises covered all domains of maritime operations, air, surface, and subsurface.
- India and UK agreed to significant new cooperation on Maritime Domain Awareness, which includes new agreements on maritime information sharing, an invitation to the UK to join India's Information Fusion Centre in Gurugram.

- India considers the defense sector as one of the major areas where the bilateral partnership could be expanded around the Make in India campaign.
- In maritime cooperation, the engagements between both countries are increasing.
- The UK will be deploying a Carrier Strike Group in the Indian Ocean region this year in line with its strategic tilt to Indo-Pacific.

- Anurag Behar, the CEO of Azim Premji Foundation and founding vice-chancellor of Azim Premji University, has authored a new travel book titled "A Matter of the Heart: Education in India".

Defense ministry inks contracts worth Rs 3,700 cr to enhance Indian Air Force's radar operations



- The Indian Defence Ministry has recently signed two contracts with Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL) worth more than Rs 3,700 crore, with the aim to enhance the operational capabilities of the Indian Air Force.
- Under the Buy Indian IDMM (Indigenously Designed Developed and Manufactured) category, both projects are part of the ongoing vision of Aatmanirbhar Bharat.
- The first contract, worth over Rs 2,800 crore, involves the supply of Medium Power Radars (MPR) 'Arudhra', which have been designed and developed by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and will be manufactured by BEL.
- The second contract, with a cost of approximately Rs 950 crore, relates to Radar Warning Receivers (RWR).
- The successful trials of the MPR have already been conducted by the Indian Air Force, and the RWR has been designed to enhance the capabilities of Su-30 MKI aircraft.
- In addition to Radar Warning Receivers, the projects are aimed at improving the surveillance, detection, tracking, and Electronic Warfare capabilities of the air force.
- They also aim to boost the manufacturing capability in the industrial ecosystem and generate employment of around two lakh man-days over a period of three and a half years.

NASA-ISRO Jointly Manufactures NISAR Earth Science Satellite



- Dr. Jitendra Singh, the Union Minister of State for Science & Technology, announced in the Rajya Sabha that NASA and ISRO have collaboratively built an earth science satellite called NISAR (NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar).
- The satellite's primary objectives are to design, develop, and launch a dual-frequency

(L and S band) radar imaging satellite, and to explore new application areas using L & S Band microwave data, particularly in surface deformation studies, terrestrial biomass structure, natural resource mapping and monitoring, and research on the dynamics of ice-sheets, glaciers, forests, oil slicks, etc.

- The NISAR satellite is equipped with an I-3K bus and a SAR instrument that uses the innovative Sweep SAR technique.
- It operates in both L and S bands and has polarimetric configuration, providing a wide swath and high resolution.
- The satellite will travel in a sun synchronous orbit at a height of 747 km and an inclination of 98.4 degrees, completing a 12-day cycle.
- NASA is responsible for providing the L-Band SAR payload, high precision GPS, and a 12m unfurlable antenna, while ISRO is responsible for the S-Band SAR payload, spacecraft bus, and launch facilitation.
- As of February 2023, ISRO has spent Rs. 469.40 Crore on the realization of the NISAR satellite, excluding launch costs.

Most silent ship INS Androth launched



- Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers (GRSE), a shipbuilding company in India, has launched INS Androth, a vessel claimed to be the "most silent ship in the country" for the Indian Navy.
- The vessel is the first in a series of eight anti-submarine warfare shallow-watercraft to be delivered to the navy.
- The ships will be used for patrolling, search and rescue operations, and other military missions.
- The INS Androth has been designed to accommodate 50 crew members and is equipped with state-of-the-art communication systems, radars, and sonars to detect and track enemy submarines.
- The ship also features a stealth design that reduces its acoustic signature, making it difficult to detect underwater.
- The INS Androth, launched by GRSE, is a 77-meter-long, waterjet propelled ASW

- Shallow water craft that is designed to operate in coastal waters for anti-submarine operations, mine laying operations, and Low Intensity Maritime Operations (LIMO).
- Despite their smaller size, these ships are equipped with lightweight torpedoes, ASW rockets and mines, close-in weapon system (30 mm gun), and 16.7 mm stabilized remote-controlled guns.
- They are also capable of full-scale sub-surface surveillance of coastal waters and coordinated ASW operations with aircraft. In addition, the ASW SWC has hull-mounted sonar and a low frequency variable depth sonar.

International Day for the Right to the Truth concerning Gross Human Rights Violations




- On the 24th of March every year, the International Day for the Right to the Truth Concerning Gross Human Rights Violations and for the Dignity of Victims is commemorated in honor of Monsignor **Óscar** Arnulfo Romero, who was assassinated on this day in 1980.
- Monsignor Romero was passionately involved in speaking out against the infringement of human rights suffered by the most marginalized people in El Salvador.
- The International Day for the Right to the Truth Concerning Gross Human Rights Violations and for the Dignity of Victims aims to honor the memory of victims who have suffered from gross and systemic human rights violations, while promoting the significance of the right to truth and justice.
- It also serves to pay tribute to individuals who have dedicated their lives to advocating for and protecting human rights for everyone, even if it meant sacrificing their own lives.
- In particular, the day recognizes the important contributions and values of Archbishop Oscar Arnulfo Romero from El Salvador, who was assassinated on 24 March 1980.
- Archbishop Romero vehemently condemned human rights abuses against the most vulnerable populations and upheld the principles of preserving life, respecting human dignity, and opposing all forms of violence.

Income tax dept launches AIS mobile app: How to download and register



- On March 22, the Income Tax Department launched a mobile application called "AIS for Taxpayer" that enables taxpayers to view their tax-related information in the Annual Information Statement (AIS) or Taxpayer Information Summary (TIS).
- The app has become essential and beneficial since starting from the new financial year on April 1, Form 26AS will only show information related to tax deducted at source (TDS) and tax collection at source (TCS).
- Taxpayers need to refer to the AIS for various details, including installments of advance tax paid, self-assessment tax, income-tax refund, Statement of Financial Transactions (SFT), and turnover as per Goods and Service Tax (GST) return, among other things.
- Taxpayers can get a detailed summary of their information from Form 26AS by referring to the Annual Information Statement (AIS). The AIS not only provides a comprehensive overview of the taxpayer's information, but it also has a feedback mechanism.
- Each section of the AIS includes reported and modified values based on the feedback received from taxpayers.
- The objectives of the AIS are to provide taxpayers with complete information and an opportunity to give online feedback, promote voluntary compliance, and enable easy prefilling of tax returns.

Ashneer Grover's new startup CrickPe is a fantasy sports app that will also reward cricketers



- Ashneer Grover, co-founder of BharatPe, has launched a new cricket-focused fantasy sports app named CrickPe ahead of the Indian Premier League (IPL) tournament.
- This app will compete against rivals such as Dream11, Mobile Premier League (MPL), and Games24x7's My11Circle.
- Third Unicorn Pvt Ltd, founded by Ashneer Grover, has raised \$4 million in seed funding from more than two dozen angel investors, including Anmol Singh Jaggi, Anirudh Kedia, and Vishal Kedia.
- Previously, Grover was associated with BharatPe and Grofers, both of which are unicorns.
- The app is targeting the upcoming IPL tournament for its launch and is allowing users to participate in contests for IPL matches starting from March 31, 2023.
