

India, Indonesia And Phillippines Join Coal Transition Programme



- India, Indonesia and the Philippines will join South Africa as the first recipients of a multibillion-dollar pilot programme aimed at accelerating their transition from coal power to clean energy.
- It will invest in projects ranging from bolstering countries' domestic capacity to manage energy transitions to repurposing or decommissioning coal assets, and creating economic opportunities for coal-dependent communities.

IN PARTNERSHIP WITH ITALY

- **More than 100 countries promised to reverse deforestation by 2030.**
- **There's a pact to cut emissions of the world's second-worst warming gas, methane, by 30% by 2030. Big emitters China, Russia and India haven't signed, but it's hoped they will join later**
- **Prime Minister Modi has set aggressive targets for low-carbon power by 2030.net zero carbon emission by 2070.**
- **Forests declaration:-an ambitious declaration initiated by the United Kingdom to “halt deforestation” and land degradation by 2030.India, Argentina, Mexico, Saudi Arabia and South Africa are the only G20 countries that did not sign the declaration.**
- **Indian representative said, “The declaration interlinks trade to climate change and forest issues. Trade falls under the WTO and should not be brought under climate change declarations. We had asked the word “trade” to be removed, but they did not agree. So, we have not signed the declaration.”**
