

National News

1. PARUL CHAUDHARY BREAKING NATIONAL RECORD AND SETS NEW NATIONAL RECORD IN WOMEN'S 3000 METERS



- Youth Affairs and Sports Minister Anurag Thakur has congratulated Parul Chaudhary for breaking the 6-year-old National Record and setting the new National Record in women's 3000 metres with a time of 8:57.19 at UA Sunset Tour in Los Angeles.
- In a tweet, Mr Thakur said, Parul Chaudhary is the first Indian athlete to clock a sub-9 minute time in Women's 3000 metres.

2. Stand-in India captain Jasprit Bumrah creates world record for scoring most runs in an over in Test cricket



- Stand In India captain Jasprit Bumrah smashed Stuart Broad for 29 runs to create a world record for maximum runs in a single over in Test cricket.
- The Indian skipper was not out on 31 off 16 balls with four boundaries and two sixes.
- With this, he has surpassed legendary West Indies batter Brian Lara, who hit South Africa's Robin Peterson for 28 in an over in 2003..

3. Union Minister Shri Piyush Goyal Launches A Three-Day "Grand Hackathon" On Agriculture Domain To Promote Open ECommerce Network



• Union Minister Piyush Goyal has virtually kicked off a three-day Grand Hackathon

that the Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC) is hosting in association with NABARD.

- The physical portion of this event took place at the Fort, Mumbai location of the Bombay Stock Exchange.
- The Grand Hackathon is divided into two categories: the Agri Grant Challenge and the Agri Innovation Hackathon, both of which will highlight innovations that will help the agriculture sector adopt eCommerce.
- Speaking at the event, Shri Goyal stated that the newly created ONDC-NABARD Grand Hackathon will give start-ups a platform to collaborate with ONDC and develop creative solutions for some of the most urgent problems in the agri-sector.
- Even though it might seem like a tiny move right now, in the long run, this will give farmers all throughout the nation more influence. Early signs suggest that this will likely affect not only the way e-commerce operates in India but maybe the entire world.
- According to the Minister, this Government has made tripling the income of farmers and ensuring their welfare a primary priority

4. SBI CELEBRATES 66TH FOUNDATION DAY



- The oldest commercial bank in the country, State Bank of India, is celebrating its 67th year on 1st July.
- SBI descends from the Bank of Calcutta founded in 1806 through the Imperial Bank of India.
- The Bank of Madras merged into the other two presidency banks, the bank of Calcutta and the bank of Bombay to form the Imperial Bank of India which in turn became the SBI in 1955.
- In the 19th century, three presidency banks were incorporated.
- The three presidency banks were the Bank of Madras (established on 2nd June 1806), the

Bank of Bombay (incorporated on 15 April 1840), and the Bank of Madras (incorporated on 1 July 1843).

- These three presidency banks were joint-stock companies. These presidency banks were consolidated on 27 January 1921 and the new entity was named Imperial Bank of India.
- Even after the consolidation, it remained as the joint-stock company but without government participation.
- RBI in 1955 acquired a controlling interest in the Imperial
- Bank of India. On 1st July 1955, the imperial bank of India became the State Bank of India.
- To avoid any conflict of interest since RBI is the country's banking regulatory authority, the government of India in 2008 then acquired the Reserve Bank of India's stake in SBI.

5. GOVERNMENT AUTHORISES SBI TO ISSUE AND ENCASH ELECTORAL BONDS



- The government gave its approval for the 21st tranche of electoral bonds to be issued, and the bonds' sales.
- In an effort to increase openness in political fundraising, electoral bonds have been proposed as a substitute for financial contributions to political parties.
- With effect from July 1 to July 10, State Bank of India (SBI), in the 21st phase of sale, has been granted authorization to issue and encash electoral bonds through its 29 authorised branches, according to a statement from the finance ministry.
- SBI branches in Lucknow, Shimla, Dehradun, Kolkata, Guwahati, Chennai, Patna, New Delhi, Chandigarh, Srinagar, Gandhinagar, Bhopal, Raipur, and Mumbai are among those that have been authorised.
- Gujarat and Himachal Pradesh are scheduled to hold their assemblies this year. In this year's March, elections were completed for five states: Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, and Goa.

6. KETANJI BROWN JACKSON SWORN IN, BECOMES 1ST BLACK WOMAN ON US SUPREME COURT



- Ketanji Brown Jackson has been sworn in to the Supreme Court, shattering a glass ceiling as the first Black woman on the nation's highest court.
- The 51-year-old Jackson is the court's 116th justice and she took the place Thursday of the justice she once worked for. Justice Stephen Breyer's retirement took effect at noon.
- Moments later, joined by her family, Jackson recited the two oaths required of Supreme Court justices, one administered by Breyer and the other by Chief Justice John Roberts.

7. NMCG creates Namami Gange Amrit Vatika at Kalindi Kunj Ghat on River YAMUNA IN NEW DELHI



- National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) has created Namami Gange Amrit Vatika at Kalindi Kunj Ghat on River Yamuna in New Delhi with the planting of 75 saplings under Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav.
- The plantation activities were carried out under the initiative Yamuna Ghat par Vriksharopan.
- Speaking on the occasion, Director General of NMCG, G. Asok Kumar said that cleaning of tributaries of River Ganga, especially, Yamuna, is one of the focus areas of the Namami

Gange Programme.

- He motivated the participants to become part of this Clean Yamuna campaign.
- Cleanliness drive on River Yamuna in Delhi is a regular activity organized on the 4th Saturday of every month by the National Mission for Clean Ganga.

1. ELORDA CUP: REIGNING YOUTH WORLD BOXING CHAMPIONS ALFIYA PATHAN AND GITIKA WIN GOLD MEDALS



- Reigning Youth World Boxing champions Alfiya Pathan and Gitika have won gold medals at the Elorda Cup in Nur-Sultan, Kazakhstan.
- Two other Indian female boxers Kalaivani Srinivasan and Jamuna Boro signed off with silver medals.
- In the women's 81-kilogram final, Alfiya thrashed 2016 world champion and a strong contender for the title, Lazzat Kungeibayeva, by a 5-0 margin.
- Gitika clinched a thrilling 4-1 win over compatriot Kalaivani in an intense all-Indian women's 48-kg final.
- Meanwhile, 2019 World Championships bronze medalist Jamuna gave her all against Uzbekistan's Nigina Uktamova but ended up with a 0-5 loss in the 54-kg final.
- With the addition of two gold, two silver, and 10 bronze medals on the final day, the 33-member Indian contingent concluded its campaign with an overall tally of 14 medals.

2. FORMER NEWSREADER OF AIR MINOTI CHATTERJEE PASSES AWAY IN NEW DELHI



- The former newsreader of All India Radio, Minoti Chatterjee passed away in New Delhi last night.
- Her last rites will be performed at the Lodhi Road crematorium at 1 PM today.
- She was also the former Principal of Kamala Nehru College, Delhi University.

5. 21-YR-OLD SINI SHETTY FROM KARNATAKA CROWNED FEMINA MISS INDIA 2022



- Sini Shetty on Sunday won the title of Femina Miss India 2022.
- Shetty will now represent India at the 71st Miss World pageant.

- Shetty, 21, was crowned Femina Miss India World 2022 by her predecessor Miss India 2020, Manasa Varanasi at JIO World Convention Center in Mumbai.
- Hailing from Karnataka, Shetty was born in Mumbai in 2001.
- The 21-yr-old, who holds a bachelor's degree in accounting and financing, is currently pursuing a course in Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA).

6. RAHUL NARWEKAR THE YOUNGEST ASSEMBLY SPEAKER IN COUNTRY



- Mumbai lawyer and first-time legislator, Rahul Narwekar has been elected as the youngest Speaker of Maharashtra Legislative Assembly and also becomes the youngest ever in India to hold this august Constitutional post.
- Narwekar scripted history to become the youngest legislator to be elected as the 16th Speaker (since 1960) and also is now the youngest ever lawmaker to occupy the coveted top legislative post in the country.
- Narwekar received a total of 164 votes in support and 107 went to Shiv Sena candidate's account.
- During the Speaker elections, 12 members were absent and 3 legislators abstained from the voting.
- Narwekar (45), a sitting MLA from Colaba, left Shiv Sena in 2014 to contest the 2014 Lok Sabha polls from Maval constituency as a NCP candidate.
- However, he suffered defeat but was elected to the Maharashtra Legislative Council and remained its member till 2019.

7. VISIONARY BRITISH THEATRE DIRECTOR PETER BROOK DIES AGED 97



- Peter Brook, one of the world's most innovative theatre directors who perfected the art of staging powerful drama in bizarre venues, has died aged 97.
- The British director mounted productions ranging from challenging versions of Shakespeare through international opera to Hindu epic poems.
- He brought a stunning nine-hour adaptation of the Sanskrit epic "The Mahabharata" from France to New York in 1987.
- Brook was called many other things: a maverick, a romantic, a classicist. But he was never easily pigeonholed.
- British by nationality but based in Paris since 1970, he spent years in commercial theater, winning Tony Awards in 1966 and 1971 for the Broadway transfers of highly original productions of Peter Weiss's "Marat/Sade" and Shakespeare's "A Midsummer Night's Dream."

1. DRDO SUCCESSFULLY CARRIES OUT MAIDEN FLIGHT OF UNMANNED FIGHTER AIRCRAFT



- The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) successfully carried out the Maiden flight of Autonomous Flying Wing Technology Demonstrator from Aeronautical Test Range at Chitradurga in Karnataka.
- The flight operated in a fully autonomous mode.
- The aircraft exhibited a perfect flight, including take-off, way point navigation and a smooth touchdown.
- The unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) powered by a small turbofan engine.
- It has been designed and developed by Aeronautical Development Establishment (ADE), Bengaluru, one of the research laboratories of DRDO.
- The focus is now on Atmanirbhar Bharat in defence and the government has urged the armed forces to buy the indigenous platforms and less imports.
- This year in the Union Budget, Rs 70,221 crore has been set aside for domestic defence procurement, and this accounts for 63 percent of the defence capital budget.

2. VETERAN FILMMAKER TARUN MAJUMDAR PASSES AWAY AT 91



- Veteran Bengali film director, Tarun Majumdar has passed away at the age of 92.
- Tarun Majumdar was known for helming popular Bengali films such as Smriti Tuku Thak, Shriman Prithviraj, Kuheli, Balika Badhu, Dadar Kirti, Chander Bari, among others in his lifetime.
- He created a significant impact in uplifting the Bengali film industry during the 60s, 70s and 80s.
- Tarun Majumdar was the recipient of the prestigious Padma Shri Award in 1990.
- He's the recipient of four National Awards, 7 BFJA Awards, 5 Filmfare Awards, and an Anandalok Award.
- 3. IGSS VENTURES SIGNS MOU WITH TAMIL NADU GOVT FOR SETTING UP SEMICONDUCTOR PARK



• In the presence of Chief Minister M.K. Stalin, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between Tamil Nadu and the Singapore-based M/s. IGSS Ventures Pte Ltd to build a 300-acre semiconductor high-tech park in the State with an investment and grants of 25,600 crore.

- At the function held at the Secretariat were Industries Minister Thangam Thennarasu, Chief Secretary V. Irai Anbu, and other top officials.
- In the next five years, the project is expected to directly employ more than 5,000 individuals, according to an official press release.
- By using renewable energy to cook, IGSS Ventures intends to take part in the India Semiconductor Mission and Project Surya, both of which aim to lessen air pollution and global warming.
- For a semiconductor fab that will produce wafers in three different technology nodes, including 28 nm, 45 nm, and >=65 nm, as well as an industry ecosystem infrastructure that includes semiconductor circuit designers, material suppliers, equipment suppliers, and outsourced semiconductor assembly and test players, Tamil Nadu has allocated nine strategic sites, including two near Chennai.
- According to the consortium, 1,500 semi-skilled and skilled workers might be employed when commercial production begins in two years.

4. World Zoonosis Day nationwide anti-rabies vaccine drive



- World Zoonoses Day is marked annually on 6 July to commemorate the first vaccination administered against a zoonotic disease like influenza, ebola and West Nile virus.
- Zoonotic diseases are caused by viruses, parasites, bacteria and fungi.
- These germs can lead to several kinds of illnesses, ranging in severity, in people and animals.
- Some can even cause death. Unlike in humans, animals may often appear healthy even when they carry such germs.
- World Zoonoses Day was instituted on 6 July 1885 to educate and raise awareness about zoonotic diseases that can transmit from animals to humans.
- It commemorates French biologist Louis Pasteur, who administered the first dose of the first vaccine against rabies.

5. Greenko, IIT-H sign pact to set up School for Sustainable S&T



- In order to establish a school where students would be trained toward sustainable goals like climate change mitigation, circular economy, energy transition, among others, the renewable energy company Greenko has partnered with IIT-Hyderabad.
- The Greenko School of Sustainable Science and Technology (GSSST) will open toward the end of this year, according to a statement from the company, and by June 2023, the first batch of students will be admitted for the MTech and Ph.D. programmes in sustainable science and technology, followed by the BTech programme.
- It will be the nation's first institution solely focused on teaching sustainable science and technology.
- Dharmendra Pradhan, the Union Minister for Education, was present when the MoU was signed.
- Dharmendra Pradhan stated that in order to achieve self-sufficiency and advance global welfare, we must innovate and create our own models.
- Technology is accessible in the twenty-first century to make the task easier.
- India will take the lead in the fourth industrial revolution, and IIT Hyderabad will have a significant impact on the internationalisation of the Indian brand.

6. MICHELLE POONAWALLA RECEIVES THE COVETED SHIROMANI AWARD AT NRI WORLD SUMMIT 2022



- Michelle Poonawalla has received the Shiromani Award at NRI World Summit 2022 in the United Kingdom for her contribution to the field of art.
- In addition to Poonawalla, the Shiromani Award was also awarded to Shri Sadhu Bhramvihari, Lord Rami Ranger, Rita Hinduja Chhabria.
- Michelle Poonawalla was a key note speaker at the House of Lords and accepted the Shiromani Award for her contribution to the field of Art.
- Poonawalla unveiled her artwork 'Reserve' at the JMS Foundation Charity Gala on 23 June.
- Her film 'Reserve' highlighted water scarcity as a global crisis and accentuated pollution and contamination of water reserves.

- The incubator will provide a complete and innovative eco-system for start ups in Bangladesh.
- Some 220 entrepreneurs, trainees, free lancers and potential startups will get financial and logistical services at the centre along with the mentoships.
- It will work as a bridge between the academia and the industrial and business sectors of the country.
- The incubator will also provide assistance to university graduates to develop themselves as entrepreneurs.
- It will seek to establish effective links between universities and the IT industry, as well as create opportunities of research and innovation activities for the faculty and students of the university, reports the official news agency BSS.

3. PT Usha, Ilaiyaraaja among 4 nominated to Rajya Sabha; PM praises the **NOMINEES**

- Other Indian American women who made it to the Forbes list are Neerja Sethi, cofounder of Syntel; Neha Narkhede, co-founder and former CTO of Confluent; former PepsiCo CEO Indra Nooyi, and Reshma Shetty, co-founder of Ginkgo Bioworks.
- Diane Hendricks, co-founder and chairman of ABC Supply, topped the list for the fifth year.

5. India's Lieutenant General Mohan Subramanian Appointed Force Commander of UN in South Sudan



- India's Lieutenant General, Mohan Subramanian has been appointed the Force Commander in the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS).
- He succeeds Lieutenant General Shailesh Tinaikar of India. United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres announced the appointment on July 5.
- Almost 20,000 peacekeepers serve with the United Nations Mission in South Sudan to protect civilians and build durable peace in the conflict-affected country.
- The civilian, police and military personnel from 73 countries carry out many duties under the mandate provided by the United Nations Security Council.

• Father and daughter pair Flying Officer Ananya Sharma, who was commissioned as a fighter pilot in December 2021, and Air Commodore Sanjay Sharma, an experienced

- At Air Force Station, Bidar, they flew in the same formation of Hawk-132 Advanced Jet Trainers (AJT).

- Developed at a budget of Rs. 130 crores by the Union Ministry of Science & Technology, TiHAN (Technology Innovation Hub on Autonomous Navigation) is a multidisciplinary initiative that will make India a global player in the futuristic and next generation 'smart mobility' technology.
- India's mobility sector is one of the world's largest markets and the TiHAN IITH will be the source of futuristic technology generation for autonomous vehicles.
- TiHAN Testbed will provide a unique platform for high quality research between academia, industry and R&D labs both at the national and international level, thus

making India a global leader in autonomous navigation technologies.

- He said the process of choosing new leader should begin now. In a tweet, deputy chairman of the Conservative Party Justin Tomlinson said that Johnson's resignation was inevitable.

5. OPEC SECRETARY-GENERAL MOHAMMAD BARKINDO DIES, JUST WEEKS SHY OF **DEPARTURE**




- Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) Secretary-General, Mohammad Sanusi Barkindo, passed away.

- It aims to manage the supply of oil in an effort to set the price of oil in the world market, in order to avoid fluctuations that might affect the economies of both producing and purchasing countries.
- It is headquartered in Vienna, Austria. OPEC membership is open to any country that is a substantial exporter of oil and which shares the ideals of the organization..

6. Indian Navy commissions the first ALH Squadron INAS 324 in Visakhapatnam

- The insignia of the squadron depicts a 'Kestrel' searching over vast blue waters and white sea waves, which signifies the role of Maritime Reconnaissance (MR) and Search and Rescue (SAR) role of the squadron.

7. Freedom fighter Gandhian P Gopinathan Nair dies at 100 in Kerala



- Freedom fighter P. Gopinathan Nair has passed away at the age of 100. He was known for following Gandhian ideology in his life and was honoured with the Padma award.
- He had participated in the freedom struggle.
- He had taken part in the Quit India Movement of 1942 and had worked alongside Vinoba Bhave to promote Bhoodan and Gramdan movements.
- The Government of India awarded him the fourth highest civilian honour of Padma Shri in 2016 for his contributions to society.




- India-born Gita Gopinath became the first woman and second Indian to feature on the 'wall of former chief economists' of the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

- Gopinath had served as the first female chief economist of the Washington-based global lender for three years.

1. WESTERN RAILWAY'S LONGEST SKYWALK CONNECTING BANDRA TERMINUS TO KHAR ROAD IN MUMBAI



- The Western Railway's (WR) longest skywalk from the Khar Road railway station to the nearby Bandra Terminus has been opened for the passengers to reach the platforms to board trains easily.
- The skywalk spans 314 meters long and is 4.4 meters wide. Western Railway's noted that the skywalk will allow passengers to reach Bandra (T) directly by deboarding at Khar station & taking south Foot Over Bridge.
- This skywalk has made travelling very convenient as earlier passengers travelling by suburban trains had to get down at Bandra or Khar Railway station to reach Bandra Terminus by walking.
- The new skywalk was built at an estimated cost of Rs 14 crore. Around 510 MT structural steel, 20 MT Reinforcement steel and 240 cum of concrete was used for the construction.
- This skywalk will connect all foot over bridges of Bandra Terminus.

2. Rajasthan govt set to introduce India's first right-to-health Bill



- The Rajasthan government is soon likely to introduce in the Assembly the Right to Health Bill, "the first of its kind in India", which aims to commit to quality and affordable health care services through government and private health care providers.
- In January, the government had prepared a draft bill that defines the rights of patients, their attendants and health care providers, as well as a system for addressing grievances of the stakeholders.
- The right to health bill is part of the Rajasthan government's bid to expand and strengthen medical services in the state.
- Recently, the chief minister approved Rs 117 crore towards expansion of the facilities in Mahila Chikitsalaya (women's hospital) at Sanganeri Gate in Jaipur The state has also ensured health security of every family by providing free treatment up to Rs 10 lakh to the people through Mukhyamantri Chiranjeevi Swasthya Bima Yojana.
- Along with this, an accident insurance of up to Rs 5 lakh is being given to the families registered in the scheme.
- Also, medicines and tests of the patients coming to government health facilities are being provided free of cost.

3. MANGARH IN RAJASTHAN TO BECOME MONUMENT OF NATIONAL IMPORTANCE



- A team from National Monuments Authority lead by Shri Tarun Vijay, Chairman, National Monuments Authority, submitted a report on declaring Mangarh hillock in Rajasthan as a monument of National Importance in the year of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav.
- This report carries relevant details about the Mangarh hillock and recommendations by National Monuments Authority.

- He also said 1500 Bhil tribal freedom fighters were brutally killed by the British army on 17th November 1913.

- The Union Minister also added that our younger generation is unaware of their sacrifice and Mangarh hillock, it will be our responsibility to highlight significance of and provide information about Mangarh Hillock.

4. SHINZO ABE, FORMER JAPAN PM, DIES AFTER BEING SHOT IN NARA



- Former Japan Prime Minister Shinzo Abe was assassinated in Nara on Friday while campaigning for the upcoming election, reported Reuters quoting public broadcaster NHK.
- The 67-year-old world leader was rushed to hospital in grave condition, Prime Minister Fumio Kishida said in an address to the nation. A suspect has been taken into custody.
- Police said a 41-year-old man suspected of carrying out the shooting had been arrested.
- Nippon Hōsō Kyōkai (NHK) Japanese public broadcaster quoted the suspect, identified as Tetsuya Yamagami, as telling police he was dissatisfied with Abe and wanted to kill him.

5. AKSHAYA PATRA MIDDAY MEAL KITCHEN IN VARANASI: ALL ABOUT MODI'S GREEN PROJECT THAT WILL FEED 1 LAKH KIDS



- Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the Akshaya Patra midday meal kitchen during his first trip to his Varanasi district after the BJP won the Uttar Pradesh assembly election.
- Modi will inaugurate and lay the cornerstone for development projects worth Rs 1,774 crore aimed at enhancing the country's infrastructure and quality of life during his visit.
- The LT College kitchen has the capacity to prepare lunch for 1 lakh pupils.
- Akhilesh Yadav, the leader of the Samajwadi Party, responded to the opening by stating that all 11 locations suggested during the SP administration should begin using kitchens.

6. UP first state to have 13 expressways in the nation



- Uttar Pradesh's largest expressway network now has a foundation thanks to Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath.
- The state will soon have better highway connectivity from many other nations throughout the world.
- The state now boasts 13 expressways, making it the first state in the nation to do so.
- Six of the 13 expressways totaling 3200 km are in use while the other seven are under construction.
- On July 16, Prime Minister Narendra Modi will officially open the 296 kilometre long Bundelkhand Expressway, which will link Bundelkhand and Delhi. In the last five years, CM Yogi has drastically altered the state's infrastructure.
- The BJP government has put a lot of effort into revitalising the roads after realising that infrastructure is the economic growth engine and that roads are a reflection of advancement.
- A network of roadways linking other states and other nations has been established, starting from the hamlet and continuing through the streets to block and district offices. In 70 years, just 1.5 expressways were constructed.

- Ramanuja is known to have revolted against the discrimination of untouchability and played a role in bringing a big change in society.
- He is a follower of Vaishnavism and taught people the principles of salvation.
- He wrote many books, including Sri Bhashya, Vedartha Sangraha and Bhagavad Gita Bhasya, based on his belief that is different from the teachings of Adi Shankaracharya.
- The saint is known for judging people not by their caste at birth, but by their character. He is believed to be the first Hindu acharya to initiate women into 'sanyasa' (renunciation of the world).
- He is also known for blending Vedanta methodology with 'bhakti'.
- After Ramanuja's demise, the female community of 'sanyasinis' faded away.

1. Novak Djokovic beats Nick Kyrgios to win 7th Wimbledon title and 21st Grand Slam and Elena Rybakina wins Wimbledon women's



- In Tennis, Serbian star Novak Djokovic won Wimbledon 2022 after beating Australia's Nick Kyrgios 4-6, 6-3, 6-4, 7-6 in London.
- The 35-year-old also became the fourth player in the open era after Roger Federer, Pete Sampras, and Bjorn Borg won four titles in a row.
- Djokovic has a total of seven Wimbledon titles with his last four titles coming in 2018, 2019, 2021, and 2022.
- It is Djokovic's 21st Grand Slam title overall, putting him one behind record-holder Rafael Nadal. Kyrgios was playing in his first Grand Slam final.
- Kyrgios, who got a walkover in the semi-final after Rafael Nadal pulled out due to an abdominal injury, churned out as many as 27 aces.
- 17th seed Elena Rybakina of Kazakhstan has clinched Wimbledon Women's Singles title defeating third seed Ons Jabeur of Tunisia in the final 3-6, 6-2, 6-2 this evening.
- Elena has become the first tennis player from Kazakhstan to win a Grand Slam singles championship.

2. WORLD POPULATION DAY IS BEING OBSERVED TODAY



- Today is World Population Day. The day is observed on the 11th of July every year.
- The objective of the day is to increase the awareness of the people towards the worldwide population issues.
- World Population Day, which seeks to focus attention on the urgency and importance of population issues, was established by the then-Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme in 1989.
- By a resolution in December 1990, the United Nations General Assembly decided to continue observing World Population Day enhance awareness of population issues, including their relations to the environment and development.
- The Day was first marked on 11th July 1990 in more than 90 countries. In 2011, the world reached a population of 7 billion.
- This year, the number will hit 8 billion. The theme for World Population Day 2022 is 'A world of 8 billion: Towards a resilient future for all Harnessing opportunities and ensuring rights and choices for all.

- Eid-ul-Azha is celebrated to commemorate the willingness of Hazrat Ibrahim to sacrifice his only son in obedience of God's command.

4. IFAD chooses its top finance executive, Alvaro Lario, as next president



- The governing council of the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) has been appointed as Spain's Alvaro Lario new President. Lario will take office on 1 October 2022 and serve a four-year term.
- He will succeed Gilbert Houngbo who has led the organisation since 2017.
- Lario, who would become IFAD 7th president, will lead the UN agency at a crucial time when global food prices are surging, induced by the Ukraine war, climate change, and the pandemic, with the World's poorest countries hardest hit.
- New figures published by five UN agencies including IFAD showed the world falling further behind in efforts to end hunger and poverty in line with the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals.
- The State of Food Security and Nutrition report showed that hunger globally rose to as many as 828 million in 2021, an increase of about 150 million since the outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic.

- In Shooting, India's Arjun Babuta have won his first gold medal at the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) World Cup stage at Changwon in South Korea.
- He defeated Tokyo 2020 silver medallist Lucas Kozeniesky of the USA 17-9 in the final yesterday. Arjun Babuta had also topped the eight-men ranking round with a score of 261.1 ahead of Lucas Kozeniesky's 260.4.
- Israel's Sergey Richter settled for bronze with a score of 259.9 while India's Paarth Makhija managed 258.1 for a fourth-place finish.
- Arjun Babuta had qualified second to make it to the eight-man ranking round behind Sergey Richter on Sunday. Paarth Makhija had qualified in fifth place from the 53-strong field.
- The third Indian shooter in the mix, Shahu Tushar Mane finished 30th. This was India's first medal under new national foreign rifle coach Thomas Farnik.

3. PM Modi unveils National Emblem cast on the roof of New Parliament Building

- This place is more than hundred years old and a witness to the beginning of social respect revolution heralded by Dr. Ambedkar.
- The National Monuments Authority has also recommended a place in Satara in Maharashtra where Dr Ambedkar received his primary education in Pratap Rao Bhosle High School to be declared as monument of National importance.
- The school register still shows with pride a child student Bhim Rao's signature in Marathi.

5. NASA RELEASED FIRST FULL-COLOR IMAGE CAPTURED BY JAMES WEBB SPACE TELESCOPE



- The first full-color image from NASA's James Webb Space Telescope was released yesterday. It provides glimpses of what the early Universe looked like.
- US President Joe Biden presented the image at an event at the White House.
- The clearest image to date of the early universe, going back 13 billion years, has been released and it was stunning.
- The image showed thousands of galaxies and some of the faintest objects observed, colorized in blue, orange, and white tones.
- The image, captured by the James Webb Space Telescope, the most powerful to be placed in orbit, covers a patch of the sky roughly the size of a grain of sand held at arm's length by someone standing on earth.
- The full-color image came on the eve of a larger unveiling of photos and spectrographic

data that NASA plans to showcase Today at the Goddard Space Flight Center in suburban Maryland.

6. RENOWNED ARCHAEOLOGIST PADMASHREE ENAMUL HAQUE PASSES AWAY



- Eminent archaeologist, historian and former Director-General of the Bangladesh National Museum Dr. Enamul Haque passed away in Dhaka yesterday.
- He was 85. Dr. Enamul Haque was conferred with Padma Shri for the year 2020 for his work on Bengal's Iconography and terracotta art.
- Dr. Enamul Haque was instrumental in setting up the Bangladesh National Museum.
- He was appointed its Director in 1973 and served as its Director-General between 1983-91.
- Dr Haque is credited with finding and protecting several invaluable sculptures from various archaeological sites in Bangladesh.
- During his illustrious career, he was awarded the Ekushey Padak in 2016 and the highest civilian award of Bangladesh Swadhinta Padak in 2020.
- Dr. Enamul Haque was a multi-faceted personality. He was a scholar, museologist, cultural activist, freedom fighter, song-writer and TV personality.
- His TV programme 'Amader Oitirjo' or 'Our Heritage' brought out the rich historical past of the country to the common people.

7. RAILWAYS TERMINATES SERVICES OF NHSRCL MD AND BULLET TRAIN PROJECT HEAD SATISH AGNIHOTRI



- Rajendra Prasad has been appointed as the Managing Director of National High-Speed Rail Corporation Limited (NHSRCL) after the government dismissed Satish Agnihotri over corruption allegations.
- He is working as Director of Project with NHSRCL since November 2017 and is overall in charge of civil engineering works of the Mumbai Ahmedabad High-Speed Rail Project, popularly known as the Bullet Train Project.

8. FORMER VSNL CHIEF, 'FATHER OF INTERNET IN INDIA', B K SYNGAL DIES



- Brijendra K Syngal, former Chairman of Videsh Sanchar Nigam Ltd (VSNL), passed away after a prolonged illness.
- He was 82. Syngal, who has been acknowledged as the father of the Indian Internet, was known for his strong views and fearlessness in taking on the establishment.
- As the Chairman of VSNL, he was unofficially known as the 'bulldozer' for his ability to push through bureaucratic hurdles, as a result of which VSNL grew from a \$125 million company in 1991 into a \$1.65 billion communications giant by 1998.
- Born in Ambala a year after World War II broke out, he started his schooling at DAV Model School in 1945, in Lahore.
- After the partition in 1947, he moved with his family to Delhi. During his school days, he took a liking for cricket and stamp collection.
- In 1957 he got into the Indian Institute of Technology-Kharagpur, where he pursued electrical engineering.

9. Union Min Jitendra Singh To Inaugurate IS4OM For Safe & Sustainable Space Environment



- With the help of the ISRO System for Safe and Sustainable Space Operation and Management (IS4OM), India has increased its ability to protect its space assets on its own.
- Mr. S Somanath, Secretary of the Department of Space and Chairman of the Indian Space Research Organization, are slated to officially launch the IS4OM in the presence of Dr. Jitendra Singh, Minister of Science and Technology, Earth Sciences.
- The IS40M system was developed with a comprehensive viewpoint, according to ISRO (Indian Space Research Organisation), to assure the safety and sustainability of the space environment while enjoying the benefits of sustainable use of space for national development.
- Additionally, as part of IS4OM, specialised labs for space debris reduction and cleanup,

compliance verification of UN/Inter-Agency Space Debris Coordination Committee (IADC) recommendations, and diverse R&D activities have been set up.

1. PM Modi to participate in First I2U2 (India-Israel-UAE-USA) Leaders' Virtual Summit tomorrow



- Prime Minister Narendra Modi will participate in the First I2U2 (India-Israel-UAE-USA) Leaders' Virtual Summit tomorrow along with Prime Minister of Israel Yair Lapid, President of the UAE Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan and President of the USA Joseph R. Biden.
- The Leaders will discuss the possible joint projects within the framework of I2U2 as well as the other common areas of mutual interest to strengthen the economic partnership in trade and investment in the respective regions and beyond.
- These projects can serve as a model for economic cooperation and offer opportunities for businesspersons and workers.
- The I2U2 Grouping was conceptualized during the meeting of the Foreign Ministers of the four countries held on 18th
- October last year. Each country also has Sherpa-level interactions regularly to discuss the possible areas of cooperation.
- I2U2 is aimed to encourage joint investments in six mutually identified areas such as water, energy, transportation, space, health, and food security.

2. Twitter sues Elon Musk for breaching 44 billion dollar contract



- Twitter has sued Elon Musk for violating 44 billion dollar deal to buy the social media platform. In its petition, the company asked a Delaware court in US to order Musk to complete the merger at the agreed 54.20 dollar per Twitter share.
- The suit urges the court to order the billionaire to complete his deal, arguing that no financial damages could repair the damage he has caused.
- The suit said, Musk's conduct simply confirms that he wants to escape the binding contract he freely signed and to damage Twitter in the process.
- The petitioner said, Twitter has suffered and will continue to suffer irreparable harm as a result of defendants' breaches.
- After weeks of threats, Musk late last week pulled the plug on the deal, accusing Twitter of "misleading" statements about the number of fake accounts.

3. WORLD MASTERS ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS: 94-YEAR-OLD BHAGWANI DEVI FROM INDIA WINS GOLD MEDAL IN 100 M SPRINT IN FINLAND



• In Athletics, Bhagwani Devi, a 94-year-old sprinter from India, won the gold medal in the

- 100 m sprint at the World Masters Athletics Championships held in Tampere, Finland.
- She won the gold with a timing of 24.74 seconds. Bhagwani also bagged a bronze medal in shot put.
- World Masters Athletics Championships was held in Tampere from June 29 July 10.
- It is a world championship-caliber event for the sport of athletics for male and female athletes aged 35 years and over.

- Dwarka Expressway will reduce pressure on the Delhi-Gurgaon Expressway (part of the Delhi-Jaipur-Ahmedabad-Mumbai arm of the Golden Quadrilateral) and arterial roads that experience severe traffic congestion, primarily from the commuters of West Delhi.
- It will be a 16-lane access-controlled highway with the provision of a minimum three-lane service road on both sides.
- The Expressway connecting Dwarka in Delhi to Gurugram in Haryana is being developed at a total cost of Rs 9,000 crores.
- It has a total length of 29 km, out of which 19 km falls in Haryana and the remaining 10 km is in Delhi.
- The expressway begins from Shiv-Murti on NH-8 (Delhi-Gurugram expressway) and ends near Kherki Daula Toll Plaza, through Dwarka Sector 21, Gurugram border and Basai.

6. DEUTSCHE BAHN BECOMES THE FIRST INTERMODAL PARTNER OF STAR ALLIANCE



- Deutsche Bahn (DB) will be the world's first Intermodal Partner of Star Alliance.
- With this, DB and the aviation industry are sending another strong signal for the environment-friendly evolution of the travel industry.
- Under the new cooperation, DB customers and passengers of Star Alliance member airlines will be able to start or end their long-distance journey comfortably on the climate-friendly train.
- Germany is the first market and DB is the world's first partner in the new Star Alliance initiative.
- An industry-first, Star Alliance's Inter modal Partnership model intelligently combines airlines with railway, bus, ferry or any other transport ecosystem, alliance-wide.
- It is designed to link loyalty systems and facilitate seamless airport/station/port transit. Star Alliance plans to expand intermodal partnerships in the future.



2. Indian scientists develop novel mechanism to inactivate SARS-CoV-2



• Indian scientists have developed a new class of synthetic peptides that can not only block the entry of the SARS-CoV-2 virus into cells but also clump the virus particles together,

- reducing their ability to infect the living cell.
- This novel mechanism provides an alternative to make viruses like SARS-CoV-2 inactive, promising a new class of peptides as antivirals.
- Scientists at the Indian Institute of Science in collaboration with researchers from the CSIR-Institute of Microbial Technology have exploited this approach to design these peptides.

7. FORMER NEW ZEALAND CAPTAIN BARRY SINCLAIR DIES AGED 85



- Former New Zealand cricket captain and batter Barry Sinclair died at the age of 85.
- The former skipper was the third Kiwi batter after Bert Sutcliffe and John R Reid to score 1,000 runs in Test cricket.
- Sinclair played 21 Tests for New Zealand between 1963 and 1968, scoring 1148 runs at 29.43, including three centuries against South Africa, Pakistan and England.
- Sinclair captained the side in three Tests, initially taking over the reins from an injured Murray Chapple on the morning of the second Test against England at Dunedin in 1966, retaining them for the final Test of the series at Auckland, and for the next Test against India, some two years later.

8. Union minister Piyush Goyal inaugurates new NIFT campus in Panchkula



• The 17th campus of the National Institute of Fashion Technology (NIFT) in Panchkula was officially opened by Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar and Union Minister Piyush Goyal, who referred to it as the "fulcrum of development of the textile sector in the state."

- According to Khattar, 20% of seats at this institute will be earmarked for people from Haryana in accordance with NIFT rules.
- He said that this campus' foundation stone was set on December 29, 2016, by Smriti Irani, who was the Union Textiles Minister at the time.
- The CM stated that the institute building, which was constructed across 10.45 acres of land in cooperation with the textile ministry, cost Rs 133.16 crore to build.
- The new NIFT campus will launch three online hybrid courses in photography for e-commerce, social media marketing, and digital designing for textiles. As part of the comprehensive training, developing co-curriculum with organizations like the National Institute of Design and the National Institute of Packaging can be considered.
- Similar to how IIM is known for management and IIT for engineering, NIFT has been recognised for fashion technology for the past 36 years.

- Nasscom Foundation and Google have announced setting up a call center in collaboration with a not-for-profit body

- DigiVaani will be one place where rural women entrepreneurs will be able to call and get information around various schemes available for them, which can help them scale up their business, be it government schemes or any other information that can be of help for them.

• A DigiVaani call centre has been set up at the Delhi and Lucknow offices of ISAP. The project is funded by Google, through its philanthropic arm Google.org..

2. Jaishankar launches 'Connecting through Culture' a first of its kind book on Indian soft power



- External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar launched 'Connecting through Culture', an anthology of essays on various aspects of India's soft power strengths, at Sushma Swaraj Bhavan in New Delhi, India.
- The Minister described the book as the "good cop" in diplomacy and said that it can be used to encourage others to work with India because "it creates a comfort about India.
- It takes different aspects of India and to some degree, it brings out the familiarity with different facets of India."
- The anthology in many ways is a very notable contribution to understanding India, appreciating India, and in many ways valuing India.
- 3. PM Modi at First I2U2 Summit: Agreed on Joint Investment in Food, Health, Energy Sectors; Roadmap Ready



- Prime Minister Narendra Modi participated in the first virtual I2U2 Summit. The I2U2 is a four-nation grouping, where "I" stands for India and Israel, and "U" for the US and the UAE.
- PM Modi was joined by United States President Joe Biden, Israeli PM Yair Lapid and UAE President Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan.
- The main focus of the virtual meeting was on the food security crisis and clean energy.
- The United Arab Emirates (UAE) also announced an investment of USD 2 billion to develop a series of integrated food parks across India to help tackle food insecurity in South Asia and the Middle East.
- This I2U2 grouping was conceptualised during the meeting of the foreign ministers of the four countries held on October 18 2021.
- I2U2 will bring together countries, governments and the private sector to tackle challenges.
- India will provide "appropriate land" for "food parks" across the country that will be built in collaboration with Israel, the United States and the United Arab Emirates.

4. FSIB RECOMMENDS FORMER UNION BANK OF INDIA MD FOR POST OF NABFID MD



- Rajkiran Rai G, a former managing director of the Union Bank of India, has been recommended by the Financial Services Institutions Bureau (FSIB) to lead the newly established NaBFID, which will cost Rs 20,000 crore.
- After conducting interviews with the five finalists, the headhunter for state-owned banks and financial institutions chose the managing director for the National Bank for Financing Infrastructure and Development (NaBFID).
- In May of this year, Rai finished his extended stint as managing director of the stateowned Union Bank of India.
- The FSIB has made this decision as its first decision after its incorporation. The former Banks Board Bureau (BBB) was transformed into the FSIB with some changes to its mandate.

- The institution will have one MD and no more than three DMDs, in accordance with the National Bank for Financing Infrastructure and Development (NaBFID) Act of 2021.
- In addition to the equity capital of Rs 20,000 crore, the government has pledged a grant of Rs 5000 crore.
- The government nominated senior banker KV Kamath to lead the NaBFID for three years in October 2021.

5. CRICKETER SHIKHAR DHAWAN COLLABORATES WITH WEB3 STARTUPS, BLIV. CLUB AND WIOM TO LAUNCH THE FIRST SPORTS CITY IN THE METAVERSE



- Shikhar Dhawan, an Indian cricketer, announced a partnership with Web3 metaverse startup WIOM and financial firm Bliv.Club to build the first sports city in the metaverse.
- It is planned to have a launch in September.
- The global sports market is anticipated to expand at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 41.3 percent, from \$354.96 billion in 2021 to \$501.43 billion in 2022.
- At a CAGR of 9%, the sports market is anticipated to reach \$707.84 billion in 2026.

6. Rohit Sharma Becomes First Captain in History to Win 13 T20Is in a Row



• Rohit Sharma, the captain of India, became the first captain in cricket history to win 13 straight T20Is.

- This accomplishment was made by Rohit in Southampton's first T20I of a three-match series against England.
- Rohit Sharma led the Men in Blue to victories over New Zealand, the West Indies, Sri Lanka, and now England after taking over as captain from Virat Kohli.

7. New policy for defence manufacturing targets Rs 1.75 lakh crore in five years



- Hoping that indigenous defence manufacturing sector will act as a driver for the economy, the government has come out with a draft policy for production and export with an aim to achieve a turnover of Rs. 1.75 lakh crore by 2025.
- The Defence Ministry released the Defence Production and Export Promotion Policy 2020 seeking feedback from stakeholders.
- "In order to provide impetus to self-reliance in defence manufacturing, multiple announcements were made under 'Atmanirbhar Bharat Package," the Defence Ministry said in a statement on Monday.

8. NRTI re-named as Gati Shakti Vishwavidyalaya; Gets nod for becoming a Central University



- National Rail and Transportation Institute upgraded as Gati Shakti Vishwavidyalaya, the deemed to be university will be upgraded to a central university.
- The university has been renamed as Gati Shakti Vishwavidyalaya.
- The Union Cabinet gave its approval to introduce a Bill in Parliament, namely, the Central Universities (Amendment) Bill, 2022 to amend the Central Universities Act, 2009 for setting up of Gati Shakti Vishwavidyalaya (GSV).
- The amendment would help in converting the National Rail and Transportation Institute (NRTI), a Deemed-to-be university into Gati Shakti Vishwavidyalaya, a Central University.
- The NRTI offers BSc in transportation technology, BBA in transportation management courses, and MSc in railway system engineering and integration.

4. KERALA REPORTS INDIA'S FIRST MONKEYPOX CASE




• The first case of monkeypox was confirmed in India after a person who had returned to

Kerala from UAE developed symptoms of the disease.

- His samples were sent to National Virology Institute in Pune which confirmed the disease. It was first found in monkeys in 1958.
- Monkeypox is a viral zoonotic disease with symptoms similar to smallpox, although with less clinical severity.
- The virus is transmitted through close contact with another infected person or animal and spreads from lesions, body fluids, respiratory droplets and contaminated materials such as bedding.
- The symptoms can include fever, headache, muscle ache and backache, swollen lymph nodes, chills, exhaustion, and rashes that can look like pimples or blisters on the face, inside the mouth and other parts of the body.



1. Mairaj Ahmad Khan becomes first Indian shooter to win gold medal in men's skeet event at ISSF World Cup



- In Shooting, two-time Olympian Mairaj Ahmad Khan created history by becoming the first Indian shooter to win the gold medal in the men's skeet event at the ISSF World Cup in Changwon, South Korea, yesterday.
- Mairaj Ahmad Khan recorded 37 hits out of a possible 40 in the final to win gold. South Korea's Minsu Kim struck 36 for silver while Ben Llewellin of Great Britain won bronze with 26 hits.
- In the qualifying round, Mairaj Ahmad Khan shot 119 from 125 over two days of the men's skeet shooting event.
- In the ranking round, Mairaj Ahmad Khan was up against Germany's Sven Korte, Minki Cho of South Korea and Nicolas Vasilou of Cyprus for another round of 30 targets.
- Mairaj Ahmad Khan topped the round with 27 hits. Sven Korte followed Mairaj Ahmad Khan to the medal round with 25 hits.
- Apart from the gold by Mairaj Ahmad Khan at the ISSF World Cup Changwon 2022, India also won a bronze in the women's 50m rifle 3 positions team event.

- Among farmer representatives, the committee will have National award-winning farmer Bharat Bhushan Tyagi, three members from SKM and five members from other farmer organisations include Gunwant Patil, Krishnaveer Choudhary, Pramod Kumar Choudhary, Guni Prakash and Sayyed Pasha Patel.
- Two members of the farmers' cooperative and group include IFFCO Chairman Dilip Sanghani and CNRI General Secretary Binod Anand are also part of the committee.

5. 13TH PETERSBERG CLIMATE DIALOGUE BEGINS IN BERLIN



- The 13th Petersberg Climate Dialogue began yesterday in Berlin. The two-day informal ministerial meet is being chaired by Germany and Egypt, hosts of this year's annual climate meet (COP-27).
- The informal ministerial meet proposes to build consensus and provide political direction to resolve divergences aimed at improving implementation of climate action, the core goal of COP-27.
- According to media reports, during the dialogue, ministers and delegations from several countries recalled the urgency to move to the implementation of all the previous resolutions made during the last meeting in order to limit global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius.
- As per the previous resolution, the fight against climate change requires the preservation of the Congo Basin forests, which alone absorb 1.2 billion tonnes of carbon globally per year.

6. ASHISHKUMAR CHAUHAN SET TO BECOME NSE MD, CEO; SEBI CLEARS HIS APPOINTMENT



- The National Stock Exchange (NSE) has announced the appointment of Ashish Kumar Chauhan as its new managing director and CEO.
- He will succeed Vikram Limaye whose 5-year term ended on 16 July 2022.
- He was one of the founders of NSE where he worked from 1992 to 2000.
- He is best known as the father of modern financial derivatives in India due to his work at NSE.
- This is Chauhan's second tenure in the BSE and under SEBI guidelines, a candidate cannot be appointed as MD & CEO for more than two tenures.
- BSE is also searching for a new CEO in place of Chauhan. As per Sebi norm, the MD and CEO of a stock exchange has to apply and compete with other candidates for the top job after the completion of the five-year term.

7. NARINDER BATRA RESIGNS AS FIH PRESIDENT, GIVES UP IOC MEMBERSHIP TOO



• Veteran sports administrator, Narinder Batra has resigned as President of the Indian Olympic Association (IOA), President of the International Hockey Federation (FIH), as well as a member of the International Olympic Committee (IOC), citing "personal

reasons".

- Mr Batra ceased to be President of the Indian Olympic Association (IOA) when the Delhi High Court, on May 25, struck down the post of 'Life member' in Hockey India, courtesy of which he had contested the IOA elections and won back in 2017.
- The 65-year-old Mr Batra took charge of the IOA for the first time in 2017 and was eligible to contest for re-election.
- The IOA elections were due in December last year but could not be held as per schedule due to ongoing amendments in the election process.
- Mr Batra became an IOC member in 2019 and later went on to become a member of the Olympic Channel Commission.

8. KERALA BECOMES FIRST STATE TO HAVE ITS OWN INTERNET SERVICE K-FON



- Kerala is now the first and only state in the country to have its own internet service, according to Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan, who made the announcement.
- The announcement followed the Department of Telecommunications' granting of an Internet Service Provider (ISP) licence to the IT infrastructure project of the Kerala Fiber Optic Network Ltd (K-Fon), which aims to provide everyone in the state access to the internet.
- K-Fon or Kerala Fiber Optic Network Ltd is a state government initiative that aims to eliminate the digital gap.
- As per the government, the infrastructure created by this project is expected to complement the state's current telecom ecosystem.
- The principle behind the establishment of K-Fon is "non -discriminatory" treatment, which means that no service provider or business segment receives preferential treatment, as recommended by the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI).

9. Made in India surgical robotic system installed at Rajiv Gandhi Institute



- Rajiv Gandhi Cancer Institute and Research Center, New Delhi (RGCI) have installed the first-ever Made-in-India Surgical Robotic System, "SSI-Mantra", devised by the newage Indian med-tech start-up SS Innovations.
- The ingenious SSI Mantra, a brainchild of World-renowned robotic cardiac surgeon Dr Sudhir P Srivastava, will be signifying the beginning of a new era of surgical procedures in India, making robotic surgery accessible and affordable for the people of our country.
- After two pilot projects where Dr Sudhir Rawal and his team from RGCI successfully performed a total of 26 surgeries with SSI Mantra, thereby validating safety, feasibility and effectiveness, the robot is now ready to provide an advanced method of surgery, which will be accessible to the general public at a much lower cost.

- After the fifth round of voting, the race will be taken over by the Conservative Party headquarters to organise hustings in different parts of the UK.

• Today is World Chess Day. The Day is observed to mark the date of the establishment of the International Chess Federation in Paris in 1924.


- On 12 December 2019, the UN General Assembly proclaimed 20 July as World Chess Day.

- BCCI Apex Council will prepare the ground for the home season media rights (2023 onwards) and a full-fledged domestic season after two years at its meeting.

4. ARTIST ACHUTHAN KUDALLUR PASSES AWAY



- An artist who believed that colours have a language of their own and experimented with their myriad forms in his abstract narratives, Achuthan Kudallur passed away on July 18 at a hospital in Chennai. He was 77.

- The National Academy of Agricultural Research Management is a national-level Natural Resource Service training institute for ARS cadre located in Hyderabad, Telangana, India. It was established by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research in 1976.

6. England all-rounder Ben Stokes announces retirement from ODI cricket



- England all-rounder Ben Stokes has made a surprise announcement to retire from ODI cricket. "Three formats are just unsustainable for me now," he said.
- The 31-year-old will play his last ODI against South Africaat his home ground in Durham. Stokes' ODI career will forever be remembered for his Player-of-the-Match performance in the 2019 World Cup final against New Zealand at Lord's.
- After making his ODI debut against Ireland in 2011, Stokes has scored 2919 runs, including three centuries, and taken 74 wickets in the format.

7. 2016 T20 WORLD CUP WINNERS ANNOUNCED RETIREMENT FROM INTERNATIONAL CRICKET



- Former West Indies skipper Denesh Ramdin announced his retirement from international cricket with immediate effect.
- He played his last match for West Indies in a T20I in December 2019. However, he will continue to play franchise cricket. He has played 74 Tests, 139 ODIs and 71 T20Is.
- He started out in Test cricket, making his debut against Sri Lanka in Colombo in July

- 2005. He played a part in West Indies T20 World Cup triumphs in 2012 and 2016.
- Meanwhile, West Indies batter Lendl Simmons also announced his retirement from international cricket.
- His decision came to the fore after his Caribbean Premier League franchise Trinbago Knight Riders posted a congratulatory message for the player.

8. KVIC gets a new Chairman: Manoj Kumar



- Manoj Kumar, former expert member of marketing at Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC), has been promoted to take charge as Chairman of the Government of India's statutory body.
- KVIC's former Chairman Vinai Kumar Saxena has moved on to take charge as the Lieutenant Governor of Delhi.
- Manoj Kumar was earlier part of KVIC as the Expert Member (Marketing) and has professional experience in the areas of marketing and rural development.
- KVIC is a statutory body incorporated under the Parliament Act with the aim to develop Khadi and other village industries in rural areas.
- The Khadi and Village Industries Commission is a statutory body formed in April 1957 by the Government of India, under the Act of Parliament, 'Khadi and Village Industries Commission Act of 1956'. Earlier this year KVIC had achieved Rs 1.15 lakh crore turnover in 2021-22, clocking a growth rate of 20.54 per cent from the previous year.

1. RANIL WICKREMESINGHE TAKES OATH AS PRESIDENT OF SRI LANKA



- In Sri Lanka, Ranil Wickremesinghe took oath as the President at the Parliament Complex this morning. He was elected to the post yesterday, receiving 134 votes.
- His closest rival, Dullus Alahapperuma, received 82 votes. In the 225-member Parliament, 223 MPs voted to elect a new President.
- Soon after Ranil Wickremesinghe's election, protesters hit the streets, saying they do not accept him as their President.
- Last week, protesters had burnt down his private home and also stormed his Prime Ministerial office in Colombo in demonstrations against his leadership.

2. Indian Men's team bags silver medal at ISSF World Cup



- The Indian men's 25m rapid fire pistol team comprising Anish Bhanwala, Vijayveer Sidhu and Sameer won thesilver medal on the last day of the ISSF World Cup Changwon 2022 in South Korea.
- The medal helped India retain the top spot on the medals table with five gold, six silver and four bronze.
- South Korea managed just one bronze on the final day andfinished with four golds, five silver and three bronze medals.
- The Indian trio had made the final after coming through two rounds of qualification, finishing second with 872 points in the first and topping the second round with 578 for a shot at gold. India started strongly to take a 10-2 lead.
- This is the second time this year that the Indian shooters had topped the ISSF World Cup medals table.
- India finished with four gold medals at the ISSF World Cup in Cairo.

3. India's javelin thrower Annu Rani qualifies for final of World Athletics Championships-2022



- India's star javelin thrower Annu Rani qualified for the final of World Athletics Championships-2022 in the US State of Oregon today.
- She finished with the best throw of 59.60 metres in her third and final attempt.
- The national record holder made it to her second successive javelin final at the World Athletics Championship.
- Parul Chaudhary failed to make it to the semifinals after finishing 17th in heat number-2.
- Olympic champion Neeraj Chopra will compete in the qualification round Group 'A' of men's javelin throw tomorrow.

- China ties with Bolivia for the 69th spot, with each of their passports allowing access to 80 destinations.

- The Gowthami, Vasista, Vainteya, and Vridha Gowthami islands in the Konaseema and East Godavari districts are a significant habitat for blackbucks, who travel throughout the area adjacent to populated areas. Blackbucks have occasionally been stolen downstream of Dowleswaram.
- Bobbarlanka, one of the many islands that are home to the animal, situated downstream of the Dowleswaram barrage and is where you may see blackbucks all year round.
- S.S.R. Vara Prasad, a forest range officer for wildlife in Kakinada, and D. Mahesh Babu, a wildlife researcher for the A.P. Forest Department, began the field study on Monday despite the danger of floodwaters in the Godavari and its branches. By boat, they traversed the islands.
- 8. Bangladesh Batter Tamim Iqbal Announces Retirement from T20 Internationals



- Bangladesh ODI captain, Tamim Iqbal has announced his retirement from T20Is and his decision came shortly after his side defeated West Indies 3-0 in the three-match ODI series.

1. Droupadi Murmu elected as the 15th President of India



- The first tribal woman and the youngest President to hold the post Droupadi Murmu has been elected as the 15th President of India. Returning Officer of the Presidential Election and Rajya Sabha Secretary General P C Mody announced the election of Ms Murmu after completion of counting of the votes last evening.
- He said, Ms Murmu bagged 64 per cent of the votes in the poll and opposition Candidate Yashwant Sinha got 36 per cent. The Secretary-General said, of the four thousand seven hundred 54 valid electors, Ms Murmu got votes of two thousand 824 lawmakers including 540 MPs and the value of the vote is Six lakh 76 thousand 803. He said, Mr Sinha got the votes of One thousand eight hundred 77 lawmakers including 208 MPs and the value of the vote is three lakh 80 thousand 177.
- Later, returning officer Mody went to Ms Murmu's residence and handed over the certificate to her.
- Ms Murmu is the first tribal woman and the second woman to hold the position of President of India. Chief Justice of India, Justice N V Ramana will administer the oath of office to Ms Murmu on Monday at the Central Hall of Parliament.
- 2. Indian students bags three Gold, sixteen Silver, and five Bronze medals IN INTERNATIONAL OLYMPIADS



- Indian students bagged three Gold, sixteen Silver, and five Bronze medals in various international Olympiads in Mathematics, Physics, Biology, and Chemistry.
- While the Mathematics Olympiad was held in Norway and Biology Olympiad in Armenia, the other two, hosted by Switzerland and China, were held virtually.
- In the International Mathematical Olympiad, (IMO) the Indian team got one gold and five bronze medals. Pranjal Srivastava scored a hat trick with his 3rd consecutive Gold medal at the IMO. He is the first Indian to win 3 Gold medals at the IMO.
- In the International Physics Olympiad (IPhO) all five students who participated in the competition won medals. Deevyanshu Malu won Gold medal, Abhijeet Anand, Anilesh Bansal, Dheeraj Kurukunda, and Harsh Jakhar bagged silver medals.
- All the four Indian participants of the International Chemistry Olympiad (IChO) also emerged victorious as Mahit Rajesh Gadhiwala, Nivesh Aggarwal, Tanishka Rameshchandra Kabra, and Chinmay Khokar bagged a silver medal each.
- Meanwhile, all the four students who participated in the International Biology Olympiad (IBO) also won medals. While Mayank Pandhari bagged a Gold medal, Amritansh Nigam, Prachi Jindal, and Rohit Panda bagged silver medals.

3. FICCI downgrades India's GDP growth forecast for 2022-23 to 7%



- Industry body FICCI on Thursday said India's economy is estimated to grow 7 per cent in the current fiscal, lower than the earlier projection of 7.4 per cent, mainly due to the ongoing geopolitical uncertainties.
- FICCI's Economic Outlook Survey (July 2022) also said the policy rate of the Reserve Bank of India is expected to reach 5.65 per cent by the end of this fiscal.
- Currently, the policy rate (repo) is 4.9 per cent.
- The present round of survey was conducted in June that covered leading economists representing industry, banking and financial services sector.
- The survey has projected an annual median GDP growth for 2022-23 at 7 per cent, with

- a minimum and maximum growth estimate of 6.5 per cent and 7.3 per cent, respectively.
- "Growth forecast has been downgraded from the 7.4 per cent estimate in previous survey round (April 2022) owing to geopolitical uncertainty and its repercussions for the Indian economy," FICCI said.
- The median growth forecast for agriculture and allied activities has been pegged at 3 per cent for 2022-23 while industry and services sectors are anticipated to grow 6.2 per cent and 7.8 per cent, respectively.

1. GOVT LAUNCHES THREE SCHEMES FOR PHARMA SECTOR MSMES



- The government launched three schemes to strengthen Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) in the pharmaceutical sector.
- Speaking at the launch event here, Union minister Mansukh Mandaviya noted that the schemes envisage technology upgradation, setting up of common research centres and effluent treatment plants in clusters for the pharma MSMEs.
- 1. The Pharmaceutical Technology Upgradation Assistance Scheme (PTUAS) would facilitate pharmaceutical MSMEs with proven track record to upgrade their technology.
- The scheme has provisions for a capital subsidy of 10 per cent on loans up to a maximum limit of Rs 10 crore with a minimum repayment period of three years or interest subvention of up to 5 per cent (6 per cent in case of units owned by SC/ST) on reducing balance basis.
- 2. Assistance to Pharma Industries for Common Facilities Scheme (API-CF) would strengthen the existing pharmaceutical clusters' capacity for sustained growth. It provides for an assistance of up to 70 per cent of the approved project cost or Rs 20 crore, whichever is less.
- In case of Himalayan and north-east region, the grant-in-aid would be Rs 20 crore per cluster or 90 per cent of the project cost, whichever is less.
- 3. Pharmaceutical and Medical Devices Promotion and Development Scheme (PMPDS) would involve preparation of study reports on topics of importance for the Indian pharma and medical device industry.
- The scheme is aimed at creating a database of pharma and medical device sectors. Mandaviya asked the industry to keep upgrading in order to cater to evolving requirements across global markets.
- 2. NTPC signs statement of intent with NITI Aayog to develop 'net zero

GHG EMISSIONS' ROADMAP



- Paving the pathway towards greening the power sector of the country, the Statement of Intent (SoI) seeks to formalise a framework of cooperation between the parties to facilitate NTPC to strategies on diversification of its generation mix to eventually reduce its carbon footprint and support India's endeavour towards achieving net zero by 2070, the ministry said in a statement.
- The collaboration will also help NTPC in achieving the targets for emissions and energy (portfolio mix) modelling including the development of scenarios for 2030, 2037, 2047 and 2070
- As the Government of India has announced the 'Panchamrit' goals during CoP 26, NITI Aayog is working on the development of different scenarios/ pathways for achieving Net Zero by 2070.

3. BAJAJ ALLIANZ LAUNCHES PAY AS YOU CONSUME MOTOR INSURANCE ADD-ON COVER

The promoters of the company (Vodafone Group and Aditya Birla Group) had infused Rs 4,500 crore into the company in March. With this infusion, the promoters' infusion would be to the tune of Rs 4,936 crore.

5. ASIAN DEVELOPMENT BANK PARES INDIA GROWTH HOPES TO 7.2% FOR 2022-23



- The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has lowered its growth forecast for India to 7.2% for 2022-23 from a 7.5% projection made in April, citing higher than anticipated inflation since April along with monetary policy tightening.
- In a supplement to its Asian Development Outlook report, the Bank on July 21 also moderated its growth hopes for 2023-24 to 7.8% from 8% and raised its inflation projection for that year to 5.8%, just a tad below India's 6% upper tolerance threshold for price rise, from 5% earlier.



7. India's battery storage potential to be 600 GWh by 2030: Niti Aayog



- India may have a battery storage potential of 600-gigawatthour (GWh) by 2030, and demand for electric vehicles, stationary storage and consumer electronics will mainly drive the adoption of battery storage, a Niti Aayog re- port has said.
- It said the current deployment of lithium-ion batteries in India is dominated by consumer electronics comprising smartphones, laptops, notebooks, and tablets.

8. NITI AAYOG RELEASES REPORT ON DIGITAL BANKS



- NITI Aayog's report makes a case and offers a template and roadmap for a licensing and regulatory regime for digital banks. It focuses on avoiding any regulatory or policy arbitrage and offers a level playing field to incumbents as well as competitors.
- The report was released today by NITI Aayog Vice Chairman Suman Bery and CEO Parameswaran Iyer and Senior Adviser Anna Roy, in the presence of other officials.

- 'Given the need for leveraging technology effectively to cater to the needs of banking in India, this report studies the prevailing gaps, the niches that remain under served, and the global regulatory best practices in licensing digital banks,' said CEO Parameswaran Iyer.
- Recommendations:
- The report recommends a carefully calibrated approach, comprising the following steps:
- 1. Issue of a restricted digital bank licence (to a given applicant) (the license would be restricted in terms of volume/value of customers serviced and the like).
- 2. Enlistment (of the licensee) in a regulatory sandbox framework enacted by the Reserve Bank of India.
- 3. Issue of a 'full-scale' digital bank licence (contingent on satisfactory performance of the licensee in the regulatory sandbox, including salient, prudential and technological risk management).
- In recent years, India has made rapid strides in furthering financial inclusion, catalysed by the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana and India Stack. However, credit penetration remains a policy challenge, especially for the nation's 63-million-odd MSMEs that contribute 30% to GDP, 45% to manufacturing output, and 40% to exports, while creating employment for a significant section of the population.
- Over the past few years, thanks to digitization—ushered in by the Jan Dan-Aadhar-Mobile (JAM) trinity and Aadhaar—financial inclusion has become a reality for Indians. This has only been furthered by the Unified Payments Interface (UPI), which has witnessed extraordinary adoption.
- UPI recorded over 4.2 billion transactions worth Rs. 7.7 trillion in October 2021. The platform approach taken by the government in conceptualizing UPI has resulted in valuable payment products being developed on top of it. As a result, payments can now be made with a click not just at retail outlets but also peer to peer—completely redefining the way in which money is transferred between individuals.
- A 'whole-of-India approach' towards financial inclusion has also resulted in Direct Benefit Transfer through apps such as PM-KISAN and extending microcredit facilities to street vendors through PM-SVANIDHI.
- India has also taken steps towards operationalizing its own version of 'open banking' through the Account Aggregator (AA) regulatory framework enacted by the Reserve Bank of India. Once commercially deployed, the AA framework is envisaged to catalyse credit deepening among groups that have been hitherto under-served.
- The success that India has witnessed on the payments front is yet to be replicated when it comes to the credit needs of its micro, small and medium businesses. The current credit gap and the business and policy constraints reveal a need for leveraging technology effectively to cater to these needs and bring the under-served further within the formal financial fold.

- This report has been prepared by NITI Aayog based on inter-ministerial consultations. Last year, NITI Aayog had released a discussion paper on the subject for wider stakeholder consultations. Comments received from 24 organizations were examined and have been suitably addressed in the final report.
- Department of Financial Services Additional Secretary (AS) Suchindra Misra, MeitY AS Amit Aggarwal, MSME Assistant Development Commissioner Dr Ishita Ganguli Tripathy and Indian Banks' Association Chairman Atul Kumar Goel were also present during today's launch.

1. Wasifa Nazreen becomes first Bangladeshi to scale world's second



- Mountaineer Wasifa Nazreen became the first Bangladeshi to scale the second highest mountain peak K2 in Pakistan.
- She climbed the 8611 metres or 28,251 feet high K2 mountain peak and returned to the base camp on Friday.
- A summit is technically complete when the climber returns back to the base camp from the peak.
- On completing this historic task, the 39-year-old mountaineer Wasifa paid tribute to all the known and unknown martyrs of Bangladesh from the language movement to the liberation war.
- She encouraged her countrymen to take inspiration from the past and never give up.
- From the summit of the world's most dangerous mountain, Wasifa thanked everyone who helped her in this and congratulated Bangladesh by saying, 'Happy 50th Bangladesh, here's to the next glorious 50'.

- Grenadian javelin thrower Anderson Peters won the gold medal with a throw of 90.54 meters.
- Neeraj Chopra is the first ever Indian to win a silver medal at World Athletics Championships.
- He is the second Indian after former long jumper Anju Bobby George, who won a bronze medal in long jump at 2003 in Paris.

2. Tunisians begins voting in referendum on new constitution



- Tunisians began voting today in a referendum on a new constitution that critics of President Kais Saied fear will maul the democracy that emerged from a 2011 revolution by handing him nearly total power.
- The vote is being held on the First Anniversary of Saied's ousting of an elected Parliament when he established emergency rule and began governing by fiat.
- But, it is not clear when the results will be announced after polls close at 2100 GMT.
- Under Saied's own rules for the referendum, no minimum level of participation is needed to approve the new constitution.
- They only stipulate it will come into effect once the final results are published and do not say, what happens if voters reject it.
- However, while nearly all major political parties and civil society organizations have denounced his unilateral approach to rewriting the constitution and the legitimacy of the referendum, they have failed to build a united front.

3. KARGIL VIJAY DIWAS BEING CELEBRATED ACROSS COUNTRY TODAY



- Kargil Vijay Diwas will be celebrated across the country today. The Nation will remember its war heroes and pay tributes to the Martyrs on Kargil Vijay Diwas.
- The day marks the victory of the Indian armed forces in Operation Vijay in 1999, when they evicted the infiltrators backed by the Pakistani army from high outposts in the Kargil sector.
- The Kargil war was fought for more than 60 days and ended with India regaining control of all the previously held territory.
- The victory of Tiger Hill was one of the crucial achievements in the 60- day long conflict.
- Indian soldiers fought the Kargil War under the toughest conditions, on difficult terrain, at an altitude of 18 thousand feet.


- pledged to preserve the country's constitution, democracy and national gains

- Twenty umpires including C Shamshuddin form the A group, 60 are in Group B, 46 in Group C and 11 in Group D which falls in the 60-65 age bracket.

6. Union Minister Parshottam Rupala Launches NDDB's subsidiary for manure management



- Union Minister of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Parshottam Rupala has launched NDDB MRIDA Limited, a wholly-owned subsidiary company of National Dairy Development Board to take forward manure management initiatives across the country.
- It was launched at a function in New Delhi in the presence of Minister of States for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Dr Sanjeev Kumar Balyan and Dr L Murugan.
- National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) has established NDDB MRIDA Limited, an Unlisted Public Limited Company under the Companies Act, 2013 on 1st of July this year.
- On the occasion, Mr Rupala said NDDB Mrida Ltd will open avenues of additional income to dairy farmers from sale of slurry or dung.
- He added that it will help in savings to the farmers by virtue of replacement of cooking fuel with biogas.
- He further said that efforts are being made for better utilisation of bovine dung but most are individual initiatives and this new company will provide structured impetus to manure management efforts.

- The International Cricket Council (ICC) has confirmed that India will host the 2025 ICC Women's ODI World Cup.
- India, Bangladesh, England and Sri Lanka were named as the four hosts for ICC women's white-ball events from 2024-27 yesterday.
- Bangladesh will host the 2024 Women's T20 World Cup, while the 2026 edition will be held in England.
- Sri Lanka has secured hosting rights for the Women's T20 Champions Trophy, slated for 2027, provided it qualifies for the event.
- The hosts were selected via a bidding process overseen by a ICC Board sub-committee which included BCCI President Sourav Ganguly.
- BCCI Honorary Secretary Jay Shah said that BCCI will leave no stone unturned to make it a memorable event for everyone concerned. Mr Shah said, we have the infrastructure in place and we will have a very successful edition of the World Cup.

2. 'ONE RUPEE DOCTOR' SUSHOVAN BANERJEE DIES



Prime Minister Narendra Modi has expressed deep grief on the demise of Padma Shri awardee Dr. Sushovan Bandyopadhyay.

- In a tweet, Mr Modi said, Dr. Sushovan Bandyopadhyay, epitomized the best of human spirit.

- He recalled his interaction with Dr Bandyopadhyay at the Padma Awards ceremony.

- Dr. Sushovan Bandyopadhyay, who was fondly known as "Ek Takar Daktar", has been treating patients for a long time at Bolpur in Birbhum for only 1 rupee per visit. He was 83 years old. Sushovan was once elected MLA from Bolpur for Congress.
- After the Trinamool Congress was formed, he became the first district president of the Trinamool in Birbhum.

3. THE FLAG CODE OF INDIA, THE AMENDMENTS AND THE OBJECTIONS



- The Flag Code of India 2002 was revised by the Ministry of Home Affairs to permit the flying of the national flag even at night as the federal government begins its Har Ghar Tiranga campaign.
- The flag could previously only be flown between sunrise and dusk.
- The flag code has already been altered by the government to permit the use of polyester and machine-made flags.
- The government amended paragraph 1.2 of Part I of the flag code in a notification last year.
- Flags produced by machines or of polyester were previously prohibited from use.
- India is celebrating Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav to mark 75 years of independence.
- From August 13 to August 15, the Har Ghar Tiranga campaign urges people to fly the flag in their residences.
- Additionally, in a letter to all government agencies on the campaign, Home Secretary Ajay Bhalla included files that outlined the key elements of the flag code as well as the updates made on December 30, 2021, and July 20, 2022.
- A list of frequently asked questions regarding the use and display of the national flag is also included with the letter.

4. KAMAL HAASAN RECEIVES UAE'S 10-YEAR GOLDEN VISA, SAYS 'I'M HONOURED'



- Kamal Haasan, a prominent figure in the Tamil cinema industry, has been given the prestigious Golden Visa by the United Arab Emirates.
- The Golden Visa has been given to others besides actor Kamal Hasan.
- Actors Nasser, Mammootty, Mohanlal, Tovino Thomas, Parthiepan, Amala Paul, and Shah Rukh Khan all have received it before Kamal Hasan.
- Kamal Haasan was last spotted, in the box office sensation Vikram.
- The leading actors of Lokesh Kanagaraj's Vikram include Kamal Haasan, Vijay Sethupathi, and Fahadh Faasil.
- Supporting actors included Kalidas Jayaram, Narain, Gayathrie, Vasanthi, and Santhana Bharathi.
- Raaj Kamal Films International produced the movie, and Udhayanidhi Stalin's Red Giant Movies distributed it throughout Tamil Nadu.

5. Bajram Begaj swore-in as 9th President of Albania



- The ninth President of Albania, Bajram Begaj, a retired military commander and politician, took the oath of office here in Parliament.
- The 55-year-old President said in his first speech before parliamentarians that he will support and respect both the work of the government and the opposition, advocating for

- cooperation between political parties rather than conflict.
- On June 4, 2022, Begaj won the presidential election. Begaj garnered 78 votes in favour, four politicians opposed, and one legislator abstained in the plenary session of Parliament, which was attended by a total of 83 MPs.
- He served as the head of general staff of the Albanian Armed Forces and was a major general.
- Begaj was joined by his wife Armanda and his two sons at his swearing-in ceremony.
- Ilir Meta, a former president who served from July 2017 for five years, posted his final statement to the public on social media.

6. Grand statue of Chandrashekhar Azad to be installed in Bhopal



- A grand statue of Amar Shaheed Chandrashekhar Azad will be installed in Bhopal.
- At the base of the statue, soil brought from Bhabra, the birthplace of Azad, will be used and the statue site will be developed as a source of inspiration for the youth.

- The initial group of QRFV was inducted by former Chief of Army Staff General MM Naravane.
- The QRFV, Infantry Protected Mobility Vehicle (IPMV), Ultra Long Range Observation System, Monocoque Hull Multi-Role Mine-Protected Armoured Vehicle, and Ultra Long Range Observation System were all introduced by the Army Chief.

1. Monsoon Session: Lok Sabha passes National Anti-Doping Bill, 2021



- The Lok Sabha has passed the National Anti-Doping
- Bill,2021 by voice vote. The bill provides for constitution of the National Anti-Doping Agency- NADA for regulating anti-doping activities in sports.
- Its functions include planning, implementing, and monitoring anti-doping activities as well as investigating anti-doping rule violations.
- It also seeks to give effect to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation
- International Convention against doping in sports and compliance of such other obligations and commitments.
- The legislation prohibits athletes, athlete support personnel, and other persons from engaging in doping in sports.
- Under the new legislation, violation of anti-doping rules may result in disqualification of results including forfeiture of medals, points, and prizes, ineligibility to participate in a competition or event for a prescribed period, and financial sanctions.
- The Bill also proposes to establish the National Board for Anti-Doping in Sports with a view to make recommendations to the government on anti-doping regulations and compliance with international commitments on anti-doping.
- The Board will oversee the activities of NADA and issue directions to it.

2. 83RD RAISING DAY OF CRPF BEING CELEBRATED TODAY



- Prime Minister Narendra Modi has greeted CRPF personnel and their families on the Raising Day of the paramilitary Force.

- The announcement comes as tensions rage between the Kremlin and the West over Moscow's military operation in Ukraine and several rounds of unprecedented sanctions against Russia.

- Yury Borisov also told Putin that in spite of this decision, space programme will continue to get top priority and Russia will start putting together a Russian orbital station before 2024.
- Sending the first man into space in 1961 and launching the first satellite four years earlier are among key accomplishments of the Soviet space programme and remain a major source of national pride in Russia.

NASA has made no immediate comment on Russian decision to quit the International Space Station after 2024.

- India men's hockey captain Manpreet Singh and shuttler PV Sindhu have been named as the nation's flag-bearers for the opening ceremony of the Commonwealth Games (CWG) 2022.
- The opening ceremony will be held on July 28, 2022, at Alexander Stadium in Birmingham.

- She was the flag-bearer at the opening ceremony of the 2018 Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast, where she won silver in the women's singles event.
- Olympic champion Neeraj Chopra, who was also the defending champion in the Commonwealth Games having won the gold in Gold Coast four years ago, was expected to be the flag-bearer.
- But a groin injury following his silver medal at the World Championships forced him to pull out and the Indian Olympic Association picked Sindhu to be the flagbearer from a three-member shortlist.

6. Atulananda Goswami, eminent Assamese writer, passes away at 87



- Veteran Assamese litterateur and winner of the Sahitya Akademi Award, Atulananda Goswami, has passed away.
- He was 87. Goswami was known as a short story writer, a litterateur and a novelist par excellence.
- He was awarded the Sahitya Academy award in 2006, for his novel 'Seneh Jorir Ganthi' in 2006.
- Some of his other notable works include 'Namgharia' 'Hamdoi Pulor Jon', 'Rajpaat', 'Polatok' and 'Ashray'.
- He had translated many English, Bengali and Odia works into Assamese, and also Assamese texts into English.

7. EU APPROVES SMALLPOX VACCINE FOR USE AGAINST MONKEYPOX



- European Commission has given permission for the Imvanex vaccine to be marketed as protection against Monkeypox, as recommended last week by the European Medicines Agency (EMA).
- Globally, over 16,000 cases of monkeypox have been reported from 75 countries. This vaccine is developed by Danish biotechnology company Bavarian Nordic.
- In the current outbreak in countries and amongst the reported monkeypox cases, transmission appears to be occurring primarily through close physical contact, including sexual contact.
- Transmission can also occur from contaminated materials such as linens, bedding, electronics, and clothing, that have infectious skin particles.
- Imvanex is a non-replicating smallpox vaccine developed in collaboration with the U.S. government to ensure the supply of a smallpox vaccine for the entire population, including immunocompromised individuals.
- The vaccine gained regulatory approvals in Canada (marketed as Imvamune) and the U.S. (marketed as Jynneos) where the approvals have been extended to include the monkeypox indication as the only vaccine obtained this to-date.
- The vaccine was approved by the European Commission in 2013 for immunization against smallpox in adults aged 18 years and older.

2. Indian Navy receives two MH 60R multi-role helicopters from United States



- The Indian Navy received two MH 60R multi-role helicopters from the United States at the Cochin International Airport today.
- The copters were delivered by the Special Air Assignment Mission Flight of the US Air Force.
- The helicopters were part of the 24 MH 60 R Multirole helicopters being procured by India from the United States at a cost of over 14,000 crore rupees.

- Serving Officers of the Gunner fraternity were also present on the occasion.



- Besides, the beverage major is also launching Limca Sportz, which comes with glucose and electrolytes.



9. Lulo Rose: Rare pink diamond, likely the largest in 300 years



- A rare pure pink diamond, believed to be the largest found in 300 years, has been unearthed in Angola, a country in Central Africa.
- The Lulo Rose is a type 2a diamond, meaning it has few or no impurities.
- It is the fifth largest diamond recovered from the Lulo mine a joint venture between Australia's Lucapa Diamond Company and the Angolan government.
- It is a 170-carat pink diamond & has been named 'The Lulo Rose'.
- It weighs 34 grams.
- Similar diamonds have been bought for tens of millions of dollars in the past, with one known as Pink Star selling at a Hong Kong auction for \$71.2m (£59m) in 2017.
