

National News

1. EMINENT PLAYBACK SINGER KK PASSES AWAY



- Entire nation along with Bollywood is in utter shock and disbelief over the sudden and untimely demise of singer Krishnakumar Kunnath popularly known as KK.
- Condolence messages of celebrities from all walks of life expressing their grief and shock over the untimely demise of the popular singer are pouring in.
- Vice President M Venkaiah Naidu, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, I&B Minister Anurag Thakur expressed grief over the death of noted singer.
- In a tweet, the Vice President said he is anguished by the sudden demise of renowned singer, Shri Krishnakumar Kunnath.
- He said the singer is known for his soulful voice and melodious singing. Mr Naidu said Shri KK's demise is a huge loss to the world of music.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi was one of the very first people to offer condolences on KK's death on social media.

2. Two-day National Education Ministers' Conference begins in Gandhinagar, Gujarat

3. India and Pakistan hold routine talks on Permanent Indus Commission



• The 118th meeting of the Permanent Indus Commission (PIC) comprising of Indus Commissioners of India and Pakistan was held in New Delhi.

- Ministry of External Affairs said, the meeting was held in a cordial manner.
- The Commission appreciated the commitment of the two sides to interact frequently and resolve issues through bilateral discussions under the Indus Water Treaty.
- It was agreed to hold the next meeting of the PIC in Pakistan on mutually convenient dates.
- During the two-day meeting, the Indian delegation was led by the Indian Commissioner for Indus Waters AK Pal and the visiting Pakistan delegation was led by the Pakistan Commissioner for Indus Waters Syed Muhammad Mehar
- Ali Shah.

4. Today is World Milk Day



- Today is World Milk Day. The Day is marked to celebrate the contributions of the milk and dairy sector to the human population around the globe.
- World Milk Day was established by the Food and
- Agriculture Organisation of the United Nations in 2001, to recognize the importance of milk as a global food, and to celebrate the dairy sector.
- The theme for this year is "Dairy Net Zero".

5. Tata Motors Inks Pact For Potential Acquisition Of Ford India's Plant In Gujarat's Sanand



- Tata Passenger Electric Mobility Limited (TPEML), a subsidiary of Tata Motors Ltd, and Ford India Private Limited (FIPL) have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Government of Gujarat (GoG) for the potential acquisition of FIPL's Sanand vehicle manufacturing facility.
- The MoU includes the potential acquisition of the facility's land & buildings, vehicle manufacturing plant, machinery and equipment and transfer of all eligible employees of
- FIPL Sanand's vehicle manufacturing operations, subject to the signing of definitive agreements and receipt of relevant approvals.
- The Ford India vehicle manufacturing site at Sanand is a state-of-the-art site.
- TPEML would invest into new machinery and equipment which is necessary to commission and make the unit ready to produce its vehicles.
- With the proposed investments, it would establish an installed capacity of 300,000 units per annum, which would be scalable to more than 400,000 units.

6. PARAM ANANTA SUPERCOMPUTER COMMISSIONED AT IIT, GANDHINAGAR



- Param Ananta, is a state of the art supercomputer at IIT Gandhinagar dedicated to the nation under the National Supercomputing Mission (NSM).
- It is a joint initiative of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) and the Department of Science and Technology (DST), which was commissioned.
- This indigenous software stack is developed by C-DAC and is a Make in India initiative.
- A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between IIT Gandhinagar and the Centre for Development in Advanced Computing (C-DAC) on October 12, 2020, to establish this 838 TeraFlops Supercomputing Facility under NSM.
- The system is equipped with a mix of CPU nodes, GPU nodes, high memory nodes, high throughput storage, and high-performance Infiniband interconnect to cater to the computing needs of various scientific and engineering applications.

7. CANADIAN PM TRUDEAU ANNOUNCES NEW LAW TO FREEZE SALES ON HANDGUN



• Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau has unveiled new legislation that would implement "some of the harshest gun control measures" in decades, including a "freeze"

on the country's handgun purchases and sales.

- Trudeau cited a succession of mass shootings in Canada over the years, as well as recent assaults in the United States, as part of his government's motivation to propose Bill C-21 during a press conference in Ottawa.
- Canada has stronger gun ownership laws than the United States, gun control supporters have campaigned for tougher regulations in recent years in the wake of a number of mass shootings, including a 2017 attack on a Quebec mosque that killed six worshipers and a fatal shooting in Toronto in 2018.
- The AR-15 weapon, which was used by a shooter to murder 26 adults and children in the Sandy Hook tragedy in the United States in 2012, and the Ruger Mini-14 rifle, which was used by a gunman to murder 14 women at a Montreal engineering school in 1989, were among those banned.

• Long-gun magazines will also be permanently changed so that they can never store more than five rounds, and the sale and transfer of large-capacity magazines would be prohibited.

2. U.S. LIFTS CUBA FLIGHT RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED UNDER TRUMP



- In the United States, President Joe Biden administration has revoked a series of restrictions on flights to Cuba imposed by his predecessor Donald Trump.
- The revocations include ending a prohibition on US airline flights to Cuban airports other than Havana.
- The flight restrictions have been lifted with immediate effect.
- The US Transportation Department issued the order at the request of Secretary of State Antony Blinken.
- He said the action was in support of the Cuban people, and in the foreign policy interests of the United States.
- The White House last month had signaled the planned move as part of a broader revision of policy toward Cuba.
- The Trump administration had issued a series of aviation restrictions in 2019 and 2020 in a bid to increase US economic pressure on the Cuban government.

3. India defeat Japan 1-0 to win bronze at Asia Cup Men's Hockey



- In Asia Cup men's hockey 2022 at Jakarta, team India produced a gritty performance to beat Japan 1-0 and claimed the bronze medal today.
- An early goal from Rajkumar Pal and some fine defending works was enough for this young Indian side to overcome Japan in an engrossing game.
- India captain Birendra Lakra wins the player of the match award for his sturdy defensive work.

4. Indian women's shooting team bags gold medal in 10m air rifle event at ISSF WORLD CUP 2022 IN BAKU



- Indian women's shooting team of Elavenil Valarivan, Shreya Agarwal and Ramita bagged a gold medal for India in the 10m air rifle women's team event at the ISSF World Cup 2022 in Baku today.
- This was India's first medal at the ongoing ISSF World Cup in Baku. The trio from India defeated Denmark 17-5 in the gold medal match.
- Tokyo Olympian Elavenil Valarivan shot above 10 in all the 11 series' in the final.
- Meanwhile, the men's 10m air rifle team, featuring Rudrankksh Balasaheb Patil, Paarth


Makhija and Deaflympics champion Dhanush Srikanth, narrowly missed the podium after going down 16-10 to Croatia in the bronze medal match.

5. Uttarakhand's Valley of Flowers opens for tourists



- Flower lovers will now be able to see flowers in the world-famous UNESCO heritage site, Valley of Flowers of Uttarakhand as it has been opened for tourists.
- All preparations have been completed by Nanda Devi National Park. The entry check post at Ghangaria has also been activated.
- The Valley of Flowers is spread about 87 square kilometre at an altitude of 3,962, above sea level.
- On 6 November 1982, the Valley of Flowers was declared a national park, while in 2005 UNESCO declared it a World Heritage Site. More than 500 species of colorful flowers bloom here in the season.

6. Indian Navy to bid farewell to two ships INS Nishank, INS Akshay in Mumbai tomorrow

- Dockyard in Mumbai tomorrow.
- Both the ships will be decommissioned at Naval Dockyard after 32 years of being at the forefront of safeguarding the maritime interests of the nation.
- Commissioned in the freezing temperature of Poti Shipyard of erstwhile Soviet Union which is presently in Georgia, the ships will be decommissioned in the tropical temperature of Mumbai wherein the atmosphere will be laden with emotions and nostalgia of all the ex-crew of both the ships.
- All the seafarers bear the names of their ships as their own identity. Home to many a sea warriors, these ships will always remain source of honour and pride.

7. RPF rescues 150 girls, women during pan India drive Operation Mahila SURAKSHA



- Railway Protection Force (RPF) has rescued 150 women including many girls from becoming the victims of human trafficking during pan India drive Operation Mahila Suraksha.
- It has also arrested over 7000 men for traveling in coaches reserved for women.
- The force also organised 5742 awareness campaigns to educate rail users regarding their safety and Dos and Don'ts as safety and security of women have always been paramount to the Indian Railways.
- Meri Saheli, a pan India initiative with an objective of providing enhanced safety and security to lady passengers for their entire journey is also operational.
- RPF teams covering 223 stations across the Indian railways interacted with more than 2 Lakh 25 thousand ladies and provided them end to end security

8. Sammy received the 'Sitara-e-Pakistan' award



- Former West Indies captain, Daren Sammy has been conferred with the Sitara-i-Pakistan Award for Services to Pakistan during a ceremony.
- The 38-year-old all-rounder was being recognized for his role in helping bring international cricket back to Pakistan.
- It is the third-highest civil award conferred by Pakistan.
- He represented West Indies in 38 Tests, 126 ODIs, and 68 T20Is, has been one of the best captains that the world has seen in the T20 format and he captained a lot of franchises around the world.
- Sammy, who led the West Indies to two T20 World titles (2012 and 2016), was receiving his second civil honour from Pakistan in as many years.
- In March 2020, he received the highest civilian medal of Pakistan, Nishan-e-Pakistan, for his part in helping bring international cricket back to Pakistan.

- Along with Pandit Shiv Kumar Sharma, he is credited to have brought santoor, a lesser known Kashmiri instrument, into the global limelight.

3. KHELO INDIA YOUTH GAMES-2021 TO BEGIN IN HARYANA FROM TOMORROW





- With AMBER alerts users in these regions will soon get notifications of missing children in the area.


- The feature was already present on Facebook, and Meta said that it has helped find hundreds of children since it was introduced in 2015.
- AMBER alerts for Instagram was developed in partnership with various organisations like the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) in the United States and the International Centre for Missing & Exploited Children.
- AMBER alerts will also be specific to the search area, which means if a user receives one, it suggests that a search for a missing child is in progress in their vicinity.

6. SACHIN TENDULKAR TO CONTINUE AS UNICEF'S GOODWILL AMBASSADOR FOR 20TH YEAR



- Sachin Tendulkar will continue as UNICEF's 'Goodwill Ambassador' for a record 20th year, working for the welfare of underprivileged children.
- "It's been great working with UNICEF all these years. Wonderful memories of the impactful work the team has executed.
- The efforts towards giving wings to children's dreams are very satisfying. Looking forward to our next phase of partnership," Tendulkar tweeted.
- The iconic cricketer has been associated with UNICEF for long for various causes.
- In 2003, he was chosen to take lead in the initiative to create awareness and promote polio prevention in India.
- Later in 2008, he was roped in to create and promote hygiene and sanitation among communities and has been continuing to do so over the years.
- In 2013, he was appointed UNICEF Ambassador for South Asia to advocate good hygiene and sanitation across the region.
- In 2019, he went on a three-day trip to Nepal to raise awareness for UNICEF Nepal's 'Bat for Brain Development' campaign.

7. SENIOR IPS ZULFIQUAR HASAN BECOMES THE NEW DG OF BCAS



- Senior IPS officer, Zulfiquar Hasan has been appointed as the new Director-General of the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS).
- The official order stated that Zulfiquar Hasan has been appointed "for a tenure up to his superannuation on 31.10.2024".
- West Bengal-cadre 1988-batch IPS officer, Zulfiquar Hasan has been serving as the Special Director General of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) in Delhi.
- The post of the Director-General, BCAS has been vacant since January 4 after incumbent Nasir Kamal opted for voluntary retirement.

8. Frontier dethrones Fugaku as the world's fastest supercomputer



• According to the 59th edition of the Top500 list of the world's most powerful supercomputers unveiled by Germany, ORNL's Supercomputer Frontier from the US, a supercomputer built using Hewlett Packard Enterprise (HPE) architecture and equipped

- with Advanced Micro Devices (AMD) processors, outperformed Japan's Supercomputer Fugaku to become the world's fastest supercomputer.
- Frontier's nearest competitor, Fugaku, has a performance score of 442 petaflops on the Linpack benchmark, a standard for officially ranking global, publicly disclosed supercomputers.
- While Fugaku was based on Arm's core designs, US's Frontier is powered by AMD.
- The supercomputer Frontier, which was built for the US Department of Energy's Oak Ridge National Laboratory (ORNL), has broken the exascale speed barrier with a Linmark benchmark score of 1.1 exaslops, making it the world's first supercomputer to do so. Whereas, 1 exaslop is equivalent to 1,000 petaslops.
- Frontier features a total of 8,730,112 cores and is designed on the newest HPE Cray EX235a architecture with AMD EPYC 64C 2GHz processors.
- Frontier is also ranked number one as the world's most energy-efficient supercomputer, on the Green 500 list.

1. Sakshi Malik, Divya Kakran, Mansi Ahlawat win gold medals at Bolat Trukhanov Cup



• Rio Olympics bronze medallist Sakshi Malik won her first international gold medal in almost five years at the Bolat Turlykhanov Cup wrestling tournament- a UWW Ranking Series event - at Almaty in Kazakhstan on Friday.

- India's Mansi Ahlawat and Divya Kakran also finished at the top of the podium in their respective weight categories.
- Sakshi Malik began with a win by technical superiority against Kazakhstan's Irina Kuznetsova and followed that up with a 9-3 win over Uzbekistan's Rushana Abdirasulova.
- As Mongolia's Tserenchimed Sukhee forfeited her semifinal, Sakshi entered the final, where she pinned Irina Kuznetsova while leading 7-4, beating the home wrestler for a second time in the day.
- The last time Sakshi Malik won a gold was at the 2017 Commonwealth Championship even as she won two bronze medals at the Asian Championships in 2020 and 2022.

2. Gujarat villagers turn farm into artificial wetland to save Saras crane eggs



- A Saras crane couple in the family way has found surprise custodians in the people of Ganasar village, eight kilometers away from Motown Sanand.
- In their zeal to protect two eggs laid in a farm, villagers have turned the one-acre agricultural plot into a makeshift 'artificial wetland' filling it with water brought in pots and with a makeshift canal and are keeping an almost 24x7 vigil to ensure the two eggs are not attacked by wild animals or dogs.
- The farm owned by one Bachubhai Thakore is now the most frequented spot by villagers, who are brimming with excitement over the likely hatching of the eggs anytime next week. Saras cranes are a critically endangered species. In the last census by the State Forest Department in 2010, there were 1,900 of them in Gujarat.
- The number is feared to have declined to around 600 though a formal count has not taken place in the past decade.

3. Telemedicine service 'eSanjeevani' integrated with Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission




- The National Health Authority (NHA) has announced the successful integration of National Telemedicine ServiceeSanjeevani with its flagship scheme- Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM).
- The integration allows the existing users of e-Sanjeevani to easily create their Ayushman Bharat Health Account (ABHA) and use it to link and manage their existing health records like prescriptions and lab reports, etc.
- The users would also be able to share their health records with doctors on eSanjeevani which will help in better clinical decision making and ensuring the continuum of care.
- Speaking about the significance of this integration, Dr. R. S. Sharma, CEO of the National Health Authority said that Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission aims at building digital highways to bridge the gaps in existing digital health solutions and stakeholders in India.

4. MEGHALAYA MAKES INDIA PROUD, SAYS CM SANGMA AS STATE WINS BEST PROJECT AWARD AT UN WORLD SUMMIT



- At the United Nations World Summit on the Information Society Forum 2022, an initiative by the Meghalaya government Tuesday received the best project award in the category of "the role of governments in the promotion of ICTs for development".
- The initiative was named Meghalaya Enterprise Architecture.
- Houlin Zhao, Secretary-General of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU), presented the winner award to state Chief Minister Conrad K Sangma during the award ceremony held in Geneva.
- A total of 360 projects nominated from different countries passed the test of the UN jury. The voting was held to select the best 90 projects which were invited to Geneva for the final award.
- Meghalaya contested with Australia, China, Argentina, and Tanzania. Meghalaya Enterprise Architecture (MeghEA) is the only project from India to win the winner award this year.

5. UN AGREES TO CHANGE TURKEY'S OFFICIAL NAME TO 'TÜRKIYE'



- The United Nations has changed the Republic of Turkey's country name at the organisation from "Turkey" to "Türkiye", following a request from Ankara for the change.
- UN spokesman Stephane Dujarric had been received from the Turkish foreign minister Mevlut Cavusoglu addressed to Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, requesting the use of "Türkiye" instead of "Turkey" for all affairs.
- Turkey began the move to change its internationally recognised official name in English to Türkiye in December after Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan released a memorandum and asked the public to use Türkiye to describe the country in every language.
- Türkiye is the best representation and expression of the Turkish people's culture, civilization and values.

6. SHRESHTA TO COVER EDUCATION EXPENSES OF SC STUDENTS



- Union Minister of social Justice and empowerment Dr. Virendra Kumar has launched the Scheme "SHRESHTA"-Scheme for residential education for students in High school in Targeted Areas.
- The Scheme for Residential Education for Students in Targeted Areas (SHRESHTA) has been formulated with the objective to provide quality education and opportunities for even the poorest.
- Scheduled Caste students, as per the Constitutional mandate.
- The students from the Scheduled Caste communities, for long been subjects to inequality, were kept out of quality education and a situation that perpetuates the disadvantages carried forward for generations of lack of adequate education.
- The Governmental efforts to spread educational facilities without discrimination have worked well in achieving near universal access.
- However, the objective of providing access to quality education that provides a level playing field is still far from reality.
- Accordingly, the Department as a new initiative has introduced the scheme for providing
 quality education in top class private Residential Schools to the meritorious SC students
 who cannot afford the fee of such schoolstop class private Residential Schools to the

7. ISRO CHAIRMAN INAUGURATES NEW SPACECRAFT MANUFACTURING FACILITY



- Dr S Somanath, the chairman of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), inaugurated ANANTH Technologies' spacecraft manufacturing unit at Karnataka Industrial Area Development Board (KIADB) Aerospace Park.
- The new state-of-the-art spacecraft manufacturing facility can conduct assembly integration and testing of four large spacecraft simultaneously.
- This is a first of its kind facility in India, adding that since its establishment in 1992, Ananth Technologies has contributed to the manufacturing of 89 satellites and 69 launch vehicles built/launched by ISRO.
- The 15,000 sqm facility is capable of conducting the assembly, integration and testing of four large spacecraft at the same time, with four separate units present within the facility.
- Over the years, ANANTH Technologies has successfully contributed to major launches of ISRO. Our technology acumen is such that none of the sub-systems supplied by ANANTH Technologies has ever failed in orbit

1. CHINA SENDS THIRD MANNED MISSION TO BUILD ITS TIANGONG SPACE STATION




- China launched its third manned mission to its under-construction space station on Sunday, sending another three astronauts to continue the final stages of the construction work at the Tiangong Space Station's Tianhe core module for six months before returning to Earth in December.
- China plans to have Tiangong Space Station fully crewed and operational by December 2022.
- The astronauts lifted off on the Shenzhou-14 spacecraft at 10:44 a.m. local time, launched by a Long March 2F rocket from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Center in the Gobi Desert, Inner Mongolia.
- The crew includes Chen Dong, Liu Yang and Cai Xuzhe, according to Chinese state media. China Manned Space Agency (CMSA) announced about 20 minutes after take-off that the launch of Shenzhou 14 was successful.
- The first crewed mission, a three-month stay by three other astronauts, was completed in September 2021.

- The second, Shenzhou-13, saw three astronauts spend six months in space for the first time.

- Election Commission of India yesterday announced the schedule for the Election of 16th President of India. Announcing the poll schedule in New Delhi yesterday, Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar said, poll will be held on 18th of July.
- Notification for the poll will be issued on 15th of June and last date for filing of nominations will be 29th of this month. Scrutiny of nomination papers will take place on 30th of this month. The counting will be taken up on 21st of July. Term of office of President Ram Nath Kovind is ending on 24th of next month.
- The President is elected by an electoral college comprising elected members of Lok Sabha, Rajya Sabha and State Legislative Assemblies. It also includes Legislative Assemblies of Delhi and Puducherry.
- Mr. Kumar said, election will be held by secret ballot in accordance with system of proportional representation as per the Constitution.
- The Chief Election Commissioner said, total number of electors will be 4,809 including 776 Members of Parliament and 4,033 Members of Legislative Assemblies. Total value of the votes will be 10 lakh 86 thousand 431.

3. BANGLADESH-INDIA BUS SERVICES RESUME AFTER TWO YEARS



- The passenger bus services between Bangladesh and India resumed on Friday, June 10 with the flagging off of the bus from Dhaka to Kolkata in the morning.

- India has donated 15 thousand bicycles to Madagascar on the occasion of World Bicycle Day. The Indian Ambassador to Madagascar Abhay Kumar today called on Prime Minister Christian Ntsay and reviewed the progress made in the bilateral ties between India and Madagascar. He said that India will also be donating 5,000 metric tonnes of rice to the Island Nation.
- Mr. Abhay told that India considered Madagascar as a vital role in the collaborative maritime vision of Security and Growth for All in the Region (SAGAR).

7. European Central Bank to increase interest rates for first time in more than 11 Years in July



• The European Central Bank (ECB) has said that it intends to raise interest rates for the first time in more than 11 years next month. ECB President Christine Lagarde yesterday said, the hike will be of 0.25 percentage points and will take place in July. The bank also intends to end its bond-buying stimulus programme on 1st of July.

- The bank said, the ECB's main policy interest rate is currently at -0.50 per cent and it could be back at zero or above by the end of September. The last time it raised interest rates in the eurozone was in 2011.
- The ECB also cut its growth forecast for the eurozone from 3.7 per cent to 2.8 per cent for 2022 and from 2.8 per cent to 2.1 per cent for 2023.
- Several other central banks have already started raising interest rates as they try to slow inflation that has been accelerating amid surging energy costs.



1. Ex-registrar of MSU appointed MGNREGA ombudsman



- N J Ojha has been appointed as ombudsman for a two-year term under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme.
- An ombudsman has the power to receive complaints from MGNREGA workers, consider such complaints, pass awards within 30 days from the date of receipt of complaint and issue direction for conducting spot investigation and also initiate proceedings 'suo motu' if there are any grievance including on issues related to delayed payment of wages or non-payment of unemployment allowance. The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), also known as Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MNREGS) is Indian legislation enacted on August 25, 2005. The MGNREGA provides a legal guarantee for one hundred days of employment in every financial year to adult members of any rural household willing to do public work-related unskilled manual work at the statutory minimum wage. The Ministry of Rural Development (MRD), Govt of India is monitoring the entire implementation of this scheme in association with state governments.

2. Amandeep Singh Gill appointed as UN chief Guterres' Envoy on Technology



- Senior Indian diplomat Amandeep Singh Gill has been appointed by United Nations chief as his Envoy on Technology, with the world body describing him as a "thought leader on digital technology"
- Gill, who was India's Ambassador and Permanent Representative to the Conference on Disarmament in Geneva from 2016-to 2018, is the Chief Executive Officer of the International Digital Health and Artificial Intelligence Research Collaborative (I-DAIR) project, based at the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies, Geneva.
- Previously, Gill was the Executive Director and Co-Lead of the United Nations Secretary-General's High-Level Panel on Digital Cooperation (2018-2019).
- The United Nations (UN) is an intergovernmental organization whose purpose is to maintain international peace and security, develop friendly relations among nations, achieve international cooperation, and be a centre for harmonizing the actions of nations.
- It is the world's largest and most familiar international organization. The UN is headquartered on international territory in New York City, and has other main offices in Geneva, Nairobi, Vienna, and The Hague

3. UNGA ADOPTS INDIA-SPONSORED RESOLUTION ON MULTILINGUALISM, MENTIONS HINDI LANGUAGE FOR FIRST TIME



- The United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) has adopted an India-sponsored resolution on multilingualism that mentions the Hindi language for the first time.
- The resolution passed yesterday urges the United Nations to continue spreading vital communications and messages in both official and non-official languages, including Hindi.
- India's Permanent Representative to the United Nations T. S. Tirumurti said, multilingualism is acknowledged as a basic principle of the United Nations and expressed gratitude to the Secretary-General for supporting multilingualism.
- He said, for the first time, the Hindi language is mentioned in the resolution besides Bangla and Urdu for the first time in the resolution.

There are six official languages of the UN. These are Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish.

4. WTO Ministerial Conference to begin from June 12 in Geneva; Commerce & Industry Minister Piyush Goyal to lead Indian delegation



- The 12th World Trade Organisation, WTO Ministerial Conference will begin from tomorrow in Geneva, Switzerland after a gap of almost five years.
- The key areas of discussions and negotiations this year's conference include WTO's response to the pandemic, Fisheries subsidies negotiations and Agriculture issues including Public Stockholding for Food security.
- The Indian delegation will be headed by Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal. India has a vital stake in protecting the interests of all stakeholders in the country as well as the interests of the developing and poor nations that look up to the leadership of India at multilateral forums including WTO.

5. RBI doubles home loan limits of co-op banks



- The RBI allowed urban cooperative banks to provide doorstep banking services to meet the needs of customers, especially senior citizens and differently abled persons.
- In a big boost to the home loan segment, the Reserve Bank of India on Wednesday doubled the limit on housing loans from cooperative banks and also permitted rural cooperative banks (RCB) to finance residential real estate projects to support affordable housing and inclusive growth.
- The RBI allowed urban cooperative banks (UCBs) to provide doorstep banking services to meet the needs of customers, especially senior citizens and differently abled persons.
- The limits for tier-I and tier-II UCBs have been revised from Rs 30 lakh to Rs 60 lakh and Rs 70 lakh to Rs 1.40 crore, respectively. These limits were last revised for UCBs in 2011 and for RCBs in 2009.
- For rural co-operative banks, the limits have been revised from Rs 20 lakh to Rs 50 lakh for RCBs with assessed net worth less than Rs 100 crore and for other RCBs, the limits would increase from Rs 30 lakh to Rs 75 lakh.

6. FM LAUNCHES EASE 5.0 PUBLIC SECTOR BANKS COMMON REFORM AGENDA



Finance and Corporate Affairs Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, on Wednesday, launched

- The initiatives will be across diverse themes business growth, profitability, risk, customer service, operations, and capability building


9. Shangri-La Dialogue

1. ATHER ENERGY PARTNERS SBI FOR CUSTOMER RETAIL FINANCE



- Electric two-wheeler manufacturer Ather Energy has partnered State Bank of India to provide customers with vehicle financing.
- As part of the association Ather Energy customers will get instant loans at interest rates as low as 9.55 percent per annum. Pre-approved loans will also be administered, depending on the buyer's creditworthiness.
- SBI will offer the vehicle loans on their YONO mobile application as well as at their branch network, as the public sector lender ensures ease of adoption for the buyers.
- With this collaboration, the original equipment manufacturer (OEM) aims to accelerate the growth of the electric vehicle (EV) ecosystem in the country.
- The customers, depending on their profiles, will be eligible to avail loans up to 85 percent of the on-road prices of the electric two-wheelers.

2. Goa: Sitharaman inaugurates museum that showcases work that Customs do



- Union Finance Minister, Nirmala Sitharaman has inaugurated the National Museum of Customs and GST "Dharohar" in Goa as part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav Iconic week of the Ministry of Finance, being celebrated from June 6 to 12.
- The two-storey 'Blue building', which was earlier known as Alfandega, during the period of Portuguese rule in Goa, has been standing on the banks of the Mandovi River in Panaji for more than 400 years.
- Dharohar is one of its kind museum in the country that showcases not only the artefacts seized by Indian Customs but also depicts various aspects of work performed by the Customs Department while safeguarding the economic frontiers of the country, its heritage, flora & fauna and the society.
- Dharohar has 8 galleries viz: Introductory gallery, History of Taxation Gallery, Guardians of our economic frontiers gallery, Guardians of our Art & Heritage, Guardians of Flora & Fauna, Custodians of our social well being, Journey of Indirect taxes -Salt Tax to GST and the GST gallery.
- The Museum provides the rare opportunity of having a peep into the working of the Department over the years ushering in change in its methodologies to meet the emanating challenges while at the same time providing yeomen service to the Nation.

3. TENCENT BOUGHT STAKE IN FLIPKART WORTH RS 2,060 CRORE



- Chinese technology conglomerate Tencent has bought stake worth USD 264 million (about Rs 2,060 crore) in Flipkart from its co-founder Binny Bansal through its European subsidiary, according to official documents.
- Singapore-headquartered e-commerce firm Flipkart has operations in India only.
- Bansal holds around 1.84 per cent stake in Flipkart after selling part of his stake to Tencent Cloud Europe BV.
- Post the transaction, Tencent arm holds 0.72 per stake in Flipkart which is valued at around USD 264 million, as per last valuation of USD 37.6 billion disclosed by the e-commerce firm in July 2021.
- The company's valuation surged to USD 37.6 billion after raising USD 3.6 billion (about ₹26,805.6 crore) in funding round led by Singapore's sovereign wealth fund GIC, CPP Investments, SoftBank Vision Fund 2 and Walmart.

4. International Albinism Awareness Day 2022



- International Albinism Awareness Day is observed by the United Nations on June 13 every year.
- The day represents the importance and celebration of human rights of people with albinism.
- The United Nations Human Rights Council adopted this resolution and put its firm foot down for the prevention of attacks and discrimination against people with albinism.
- This day is mandated to remind people of the perils of the past and the path to the future in the case of albinism and the people living with it.
- The theme for International Albinism Awareness Day 2022 is "United in making our voice heard".
- According to the United Nations, the theme was chosen because including voices of persons with albinism is essential to ensure equality #Inclusion4equality
- Albinism is a rare, non-contagious, genetically inherited difference present at birth. In almost all types of albinism, both parents must carry the gene for it to be passed on, even if they do not have albinism themselves.
- The condition is found in both sexes regardless of ethnicity and in all countries of the world.
- Albinism results in a lack of pigmentation (melanin) in the hair, skin and eyes, causing vulnerability to the sun and bright light.

5. CHINA RELEASES WORLD'S MOST DETAILED MAP OF THE MOON



- China has released a new geological map of the moon, which it says is the most detailed to date, registering even finer details of the lunar surface than mapped by the US in 2020.
- The new map, which has details of craters and structures not charted before, will assist in further research of the moon.
- The world's most detailed map of the moon released by China is expected to make a great contribution to the scientific research, exploration, and landing site selection on the moon.
- The new comprehensive geological map of the moon released by China is to a scale of 1:2,500,000. It is the most detailed moon map to date. The moon map includes the 12,341 impact craters, 17 rock types, 81 impact basins, and 14 types of structures.
- The new significant details of moon map have provided abundant information about the geology of the moon and its evolution.
- The most detailed map of the moon was published by Science Bulletin on May 30, 2022.

6. ICICI BANK PARTNERS WITH ZESTMONEY TO EXPAND 'CARDLESS EMI' FACILITY



- The vaccine offers protection against both Delta and Omicron variants of the infection, the institute said as agriculture minister Narendra Singh Tomar launched Anocovax, the country's first indigenously developed Covid-19 vaccine for animals.
- The institute also launched antibody detection kits for animals.
- The vaccine contains inactivated SARS-CoV-2 (Delta) antigen with Alhydrogel as an adjuvant. It is safe for dogs, lions, leopards, mice and rabbits, it added.
- The COVID-19 vaccine for animals, Anocovax, is effective and capable of neutralising both Delta and Omicron variants of SARS-CoV-2.

- The policy, which comes into immediate effect, will govern the enrollment for the three services.

- Long distance great Hari Chand, a two-time Olympian and a double Asian Games gold medallist, passed away in Jalandhar. He was 69.

- He was eighth in his heats in Montreal, clocking 28:48.72s. And in the next Olympics, in Moscow 1980, he was 10th in the 10,000m heats and finished 31st in the marathon which had 74 runners.

- External Affairs Spokesman Arindam Bagchi termed the ASEAN, central to India's Act East Policy.


3. NAGALAND'S FIRST WOMAN MP IN RS TO ATTEND IPU GLOBAL CONFERENCE IN EGYPT

- In a tweet, Mr. Thakur said, Neeraj Chopra threw his javelin to 89.30 metres at Paavo Nurmi Games to create a new National Record.
- He said, absloutely thrilled; golden great Neeraj Chopra does it again.
- Neeraj Chopra is India's first-ever Olympic gold medallist in athletics and only the second individual gold medallist at Olympics.

5. Tamil Nadu triple jumper Praveen Chitravel sets new meet record of 17.18m



- In Athletics, Tamil Nadu triple jumper Praveen Chitravel set a new meet record of 17.18m at the ongoing National Inter-State Championships at the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium in Chennai today.
- The previous inter-state meet record was held by Punjab's Arpinder Singh 17.17m in Lucknow in 2014.
- The effort, which came in his second attempt, means that Chitravel has qualified for the upcoming World Championships in Oregon.
- The entry standard for worlds is 17.14m. Chitravel's jump of 17.18m is third on the all-time India list.

6. Microsoft's Internet Explorer is finally retiring after 27 years



• Microsoft has announced the retirement of 27-year-old Internet Explorer (IE) as the firm's oldest browser will be completely phased out from June 15.

- Microsoft released the first version of Internet Explorer in 1995 as an add-on package for Windows 95, the antediluvian era of web surfing dominated by the first widely popular browser, Netscape Navigator.
- The Internet Explorer project was started in the summer of 1994 by Thomas Reardon, who, according to the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Review of 2003, used source code from Spyglass, Inc.Mosaic, which was an early commercial web browser with formal ties to the pioneering National Center for Supercomputing Applications (NCSA) Mosaic browser.
- In late 1994, licensed Spyglass Mosaic for a quarterly fee plus a percentage of Microsoft's non-Windows revenues for the software.
- Although bearing a name like NCSA Mosaic, Spyglass Mosaic had used the NCSA Mosaic source code sparingly.

7. India's first AC railway terminal in Bengaluru to be inaugurated 'soon' by PM Modi



- The ultra luxury Sir M Visvesvaraya Railway Terminal in Karnataka's capital city Bengaluru was made operational.
- The Ernakulam Tri-Weekly Express chugged trough the station to mark this special occasion.
- According to the railway officials, the air-conditioned SMV Railway Terminal is a Rs 314 crore project. It has solar rooftop panels and rainwater harvesting mechanism.

- He lifted 160 and 163 kilograms in two rounds which were his lifetime best lifts.


3. Union Ministers inaugurate Squash Courts at Major Dhyanchand Stadium IN NEW DELHI

3. Japan is attending a NATO summit for the first time ever, prompted by Russia's invasion of Ukraine



- Japanese Prime Minister, Fumio Kishida will attend this month's NATO summit in Madrid, becoming the country's first leader to join a top meeting of the transatlantic alliance.
- The June 28-30 gathering is seen as a crunch moment for the 30 North Atlantic Treaty Organization allies, four months into Russia's war in Ukraine.
- Japan, a key U.S. ally and not a NATO member, has delivered defensive supplies to Ukraine and imposed tough sanctions on Russia in tandem with the other Group of Seven countries.
- Sweden and Finland, which have applied to join NATO, are sending delegations to the summit, and South Korea's new President Yoon Suk-yeol will also be the first leader from his country to attend.

4. Sustainable Gastronomy Day 2022



- Every year, the world observes Sustainable Gastronomy Day on 18 June.

5. ICC RETAINS NITIN MENON IN ELITE PANEL, SET FOR MAIDEN NEUTRAL APPEARANCE IN SRI LANKA



- Renowned Indian umpire Nitin Menon has retained his place in the ICC Elite Panel of umpires, making him the only Indian among 11 members.
- The 38-year-old is set to make his debut as a neutral umpire where he will officiate in Sri Lanka later this month.
- The International Cricket Council (ICC) recently gave a one-year extension to Menon who has been a leading umpire over the last three to four years.
- He was promoted to the Elite Panel at the start of the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020, becoming the third Indian to enter the club after S Venkataraghavan and S Ravi.

- However, he was limited to officiating international matches only within India with the ICC allowing local umpires due to the travel restrictions in place.
- "Menon has got a one-year extension from the International Cricket Council. He has been our leading umpire over the last three to four years.
- You will also see him making his debut as a neutral umpire later this month," news agency PTI quoted a BCCI official as saying.

6. India is China's top rice supplier during January-August this year



- China has emerged as the largest importer or buyer of broken rice from India.
- China takes over the largest importer of broken rice in India, which were the African countries.
- During the pandemic, China took the lead as the largest importer of broken rice in India.
- 7.7 percent has been imported to China which is 16.34 lakh metric tonnes, and India's total export is 212.10 Lakh metric tonnes in the year 2021-2022.
- According to the analysis of the trade, out of 16.34 LMT, 96 percent of the rice exported to China was broken rice. China has become the top buyer of broken rice from India.
- The total export for basmati and non-basmati altogether was 212.10 LMT in 2021-2022, which is 19.30 percent higher than the earlier export in 2020-2021 which stood at 177.79 LMT.
- During this time export of broken rice to China from India increased from 3.31 LTM to 16.34 LMT.

7. WORLD'S BIGGEST PLANT DISCOVERED OFF AUSTRALIAN COAST



- The world's largest living plant has been identified in the shallow waters off the coast of Western Australia.
- The sprawling seagrass, a marine flowering plant known as Posidonia australis, stretches for more than 112 miles (180 kilometers) in Shark Bay, a wilderness area protected as a World Heritage site.
- Using genetic testing, scientists have determined a large underwater meadow in Western Australia is in fact one plant. It is believed to have spread from a single seed over at least 4,500 years.
- The seagrass covers about 200 sq km.
- The plant is so large because it clones itself, creating genetically identical offshoots.
- This process is a way of reproducing that is rare in the animal kingdom although it happens in certain environmental conditions and occurs more often among some plants, fungi and bacteria.

1. CHINA LAUNCHES MOST ADVANCED 3RD AIRCRAFT CARRIER, EYES EXTENDED RANGE INTO INDO-PACIFIC



- China launched its third aircraft carrier named 'Fujian' on Friday, the country's most advanced as well as the first "fully domestically built" naval vessel, as an aggressive Beijing sought to project its naval power in the strategic Indo-Pacific region.
- Official media reported the launching ceremony of ship 'Fujian' was held at the Shanghai's Jiangnan Shipyard.
- Fujian is the name of China's eastern coastal province of Fujian.
- The launch of the ship was delayed by two months due to the COVID lockdown of Shanghai.
- It was due to be launched on April 23 around the 73rd anniversary of the People's Liberation Army Navy (PLAN). China's first aircraft carrier, the 'Liaoning', was a refit of the Soviet-era ship commissioned in 2012 followed by the indigenously built 2nd aircraft carrier 'Shandong' in 2019.
- Liaoning and Shandong are names of two provinces of China.


3. GUJARAT BECOMES FIRST STATE IN THE COUNTRY TO LAUNCH BALIKA PANCHAYAT

- Justice Rashmin M Chhaya of the Gujarat High Court has been appointed as the Chief Justice of the Gauhati High Court.
- The Ministry said, Telangana High Court Chief Justice Satish Chandra Sharma has been appointed to the Delhi High Court.

5. India-Bangladesh holds 7th Round of Joint Consultative Commission in New Delhi



2. New Advanced Light Helicopter Squadron 840 CG inducted in Indian Coast Guard





- Agniveers enrolled as regular cadre would be required to serve for a further engagement period of 15 years in the Indian Army.

- 2. Indian women's Wrestling team wins Under-17 Asian Championship with total of eight gold in Kyrgyzstan




- Indian women's Wrestling team has won five medals to claim Under-17 Asian Championship title with a total of eight gold at Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan.

- Single-use plastics, particularly those made of polystyrene and expanded polystyrene, will be illegal to produce, import, stock, distribute, sell, and use starting on July 1, 2022, nationwide.
- A national task group has also been established by the Environment Ministry to make coordinated efforts in this area.
- According to a response submitted by Minister of State for Environment Ashwini Choubey in Parliament, fourteen states and UTs have joined the special task force by July 23.
- The Delhi Environment Department will also launch a campaign on July 1 to guarantee compliance with the ban on 19 single-use plastics in the national capital, and any producers, suppliers, stockists, dealers, or sellers found in violation of the restrictions would be shut down.
- Earbuds, plastic balloon sticks, flags, candy sticks, ice-cream sticks, polystyrene (thermocol), plates, cups, glasses, forks, spoons, knives, straws, trays, wrapping or packaging films around sweets boxes, invitation cards, cigarette packets, plastic or PVC banners less than 100 micron, and banners made of less than 100 micron thick are among the 19 items identified as SUP

9. Shanan Dhaka, AIR 1 Of The First Women's NDA Batch



- GSAT-24 is a 24-Ku band communication satellite weighing 4180 kg with pan-India coverage for meeting DTH application needs.
- It was the first demand driven communication satellite mission undertaken by NSIL post space sector reforms.
- NSIL, a Government of India company under the Department of Space, has leased the entire satellite capacity to Tata Play.

4. DEADLIEST EARTHQUAKE IN DECADES CLAIMS OVER 1,000 LIVES IN AFGHANISTAN



- The Taliban in Afghanistan have appealed for international support, as the country deals with the aftermath of a devastating 6.1 magnitude earthquake.
- More than 1,000 people have died and at least 1,500 were injured.
- Paktika province in the south-east has been the most affected.
- The UN is scrambling to provide emergency shelter and food aid. The rescue efforts are being hampered by heavy rain and hail.
- The deadliest earthquake to strike the country in two decades is a major challenge for the Taliban, which regained power last year.
- The earthquake struck about 44 km from the city of Khost yesterday and tremors were felt as far away as Pakistan and India.
- Witnesses reported feeling the quake in both Afghanistan's capital, Kabul, and Pakistan's capital, Islamabad.

5. LISA STHALEKAR BECOMES FIRST FEMALE PRESIDENT OF FICA



- Former Australia cricketer Lisa Sthalekar has become the first female president of Federation of International Cricketers' Association (FICA), the sport's international player's association.
- Her appointment was made at a meeting of the organisation's executive committee in Switzerland, the first in-person meeting since the start of the Covid pandemic.
- Sthalekar played 8 Tests, 125 ODIs and 54 T20Is for Australia between 2001 and 2013, finishing her career with a World Cup win.
- Last year, she was inducted into the Australian cricket hall of fame and has been a regular member of the broadcasting media around the world.
- She has also worked with the Australian Cricketers' Association and has experience in player welfare.


6. 1ST INDIAN MOUNTAINEER TO CLIMB 2 PEAKS WITHOUT SUPPLEMENTAL OXYGEN

- Mt Annapurna is one of the most difficult among the 8000 meters height peaks in the world and is also known as the Killer Mountain due to its fatality to summit rate.
- Skalzang Rigzin said, a fellow Mountaineer and Founder of Boots and Crampons Bharath Thammineni supported the expedition of Mt Annapurna, while Nepal-based Peak Promotion Company helped in climbing the Mt. Lhotse, which is close to Mt Everest.

ranked fourth in the world for total solar energy installations (60.4 GW) by overtaking Germany at 59.2 GW and following China (305.9 GW), US (121.4 GW) and Japan (78 GW).

- The largest energy crisis in modern history started in the second half of 2021, and it was made worse by the Russian Federation's invasion of Ukraine in early 2022 and an unprecedented global commodities shock.
- The research states that India increased its hydroelectric capacity by 843 MW in 2021, bringing the total to 45.3 GW.
- India was the third-largest market globally and the second-largest market in Asia for new solar PV capacity (13 GW of additions in 2021).
- In terms of overall installations, it came in at number four (60.4 GW), passing Germany (59.2 GW) for the first time.

• India was in third place overall for installed wind power (40.1 GW), trailing only China, the US, and Germany.



- Fifteen Republicans joined Democrats in the Upper House of Congress to approve the measure by 65 votes to 33. The bill will have to be passed in the House of Representatives.
- The bill is also significant because it is the first time in decades that proposed reforms have received this level of support from both Democrats and Republicans.
- It follows mass shootings last month at a supermarket in Buffalo, New York and a primary school in Uvalde, Texas that left a combined 31 people dead.
- Meanwhile, the National Rifle Association (NRA) has opposed the bill and argued that it will not stop the violence.

4. WORLD OLYMPIC DAY CELEBRATIONS HELD IN MANIPUR



- In Manipur, Olympic Day Run, 2022 was held in Imphal as part of World Olympic Day celebrations which is observed on 23rd June, every year. Manipur Chief Minister N. Biren Singh flagged off the Olympic Day Run, 2022.
- The Olympic Day is observed in the State with the motto to stand together for a peaceful Manipur as games and sports had always played an important role in maintaining peace and promoting brotherhood in the State.

- The Chief Minister informed that the Government is planning to organise Chief Minister's Annual Sagol Kangjei (Polo) Championship and it would be of much support to Sagol


- Kangjei players and pony breeders.

5. Oracle introduced OCI dedicated region for Indian market



- US-based technology major Oracle Cloud Infrastructure (OCI), Oracle's cloud services platform, has introduced the 'OCI dedicated region' for the Indian market.
- It will enable customers to leverage public cloud services on their premises while meeting strict latency, data residency, and data sovereignty requirements.
- According to the company, the OCI dedicated region requires 60-75 per cent less data centre space and power on average, with a significantly lower entry price of around \$1 million a year for a typical customer.
- The new offering will allow Oracle to deliver over 100 OCI public cloud services to customers within their premises, which were earlier available only to public cloud consumers.
- It will also help boost the adoption of public cloud in the public sector, banking and other sectors that were so far restricted to do so due to regulatory and other requirements.

6. Ookla Speedtest Global Index: India ranked 115th



- The Speedtest Global Index released by network intelligence and connectivity insights provider Ookla showed that India recorded 14.28 Mbps median mobile download speeds in the month of May, slightly better than 14.19 Mbps in April 2022.
- With this, the country is now three notches up in its global ranking and is at 115th position.
- India also improved its global ranking for overall fixed median download speeds, from 76th in April to 75th in May, according to network intelligence and connectivity leader Ookla.
- In April, India had dropped four spots in rank globally for overall median fixed broadband speeds — from 72nd to 76th spot.

7. JAMMU AND KASHMIR TO HOST G-20 MEETINGS IN 2023



- Jammu and Kashmir will host the 2023 meetings of the G20, an influential group of the world's major economies.
- J&K government has set up a five-member high-level committee for overall coordination

- of G20 meetings to be held in the Union Territory.
- Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal was appointed as India's Sherpa for the G20 in September 2021.
- According to the Ministry of External Affairs, India will hold the G-20 presidency from December 1, 2022, and convene the first G20 leaders' summit in 2023.
- India's representation at G20 summits has been led by Prime Minister Modi since 2014.
- The G20 countries include Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, Germany, France, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, South Korea, Turkey, the United States and the United Kingdom.

8. Union Minister unveiled Seismology Observatory in Udhampur



- In Jammu and Kashmir, Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh today inaugurated the Seismology Observatory in Dandayal area Udhampur district today.
- The third such Centre in J&K has been set up by the Ministry of Earth Sciences at a cost of 20 lakh rupees.
- A complete seismic record of Udhampur, Doda, Kishtwar, Ramban and many other districts will be prepared at the observatory.
- Dr Jitendra Singh said that 152 Earthquake observatories are being established by the central government including three more in the Kashmir division in the next four months.

- How India Sees the World, his debut book, was released in 2017.

- He received the Spring Order Gold and Silver Star in May 2019 from the Emperor of Japan for fostering ties between India and Japan.


2. CHENNAI-BASED DRONE STARTUP TO SET UP PLANT IN MALAYSIA



• Garuda Aerospace Pvt. Ltd., an integrated drone manufacturer and drone-as-a-service

- (DAAS) provider based in India, would invest Rs 115 crore in the construction of a production facility in Malaysia.
- The decision is made to establish a drone manufacturing plant in Malaysia, with a daily production capacity of around 50 drones. The components would be imported from India and other nations.
- The city-based business has partnered with HiiLSE Global Sdn Bhd (HiiLSE Drones), a Malaysian drone start-up.
- This alliance will establish a drone ecosystem with cutting-edge artificial intelligence, machine learning, and deep learning technology.
- The partnership is not a joint venture in which the equity capital is shared by two entities.
- The Malaysian firm will make it possible for Garuda Aerospace to establish the factory and other commercial opportunities.
- Garuda Aerospace would conclude in July after raising USD 30 million.

3. US Supreme Court overrules women's constitutional right to abortion



- US Supreme Court has overturned a 50-year-old ruling that recognised a woman's constitutional right to an abortion.
- Supreme Court, in a 6-3 majority ruling, upheld a Republican-backed Mississippi law that bans abortion after 15 weeks.
- The judgement will transform abortion rights in America, with individual states now able to ban the procedure.
- Half of US states are expected to introduce new restrictions or bans.
- 13 have already passed trigger laws to automatically outlaw abortion following the Supreme Court's ruling.
- President Joe Biden has slammed the US Supreme Court for ending the right to abortion, accusing it of putting women's lives at risk in the name of an extreme ideology.
- In a White House speech, President Biden said it is a sad day for the court and the

country, calling the decision cruel and saying it takes America back 150 years.

4. US passes gun control bill; imposes tougher checks on young buyers



- The US Congress has passed a gun control bill, which is being considered the most significant firearms legislation in nearly 30 years.
- It imposes tougher checks on young buyers and encourages states to remove guns from people considered a threat.
- The measures enjoyed bipartisan support, with 14 Republicans joining Democrats in the House to approve the bill by 234 to 193 votes.
- Earlier, the bill also passed in the Senate, with 15 Republican Senators voting alongside their Democratic colleagues in favour of the bill.
- It ultimately passed in a late-night 65-33 vote. The bill is now headed to President Joe Biden to be signed into law.
- 5. ROAD TRANSPORT MINISTER NITIN GADKARI APPROVES THE DRAFT GSR NOTIFICATION TO INTRODUCE BHARAT NCAP



Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari has approved the Draft GSR Notification to introduce Bharat NCAP (New Car Assessment Program), wherein automobiles in India shall be accorded Star Ratings based upon their performance in

Crash Tests.

- In a series of tweets, Mr Gadkari, said Bharat-NCAP will serve as a consumer-centric platform allowing customers to opt for safer cars based upon their star-ratings, while promoting a healthy competition among OEMs in India to manufacture safer vehicles.
- The Minister said Star Rating of Indian Cars based on Crash Tests is extremely crucial not only to ensure structural and passenger safety in cars, but to also increase the export-worthiness of Indian automobiles.
- He said, the testing protocol of Bharat NCAP shall be aligned with Global Crash Test Protocols factoring in the existing Indian regulations, allowing OEMs to get their vehicles tested at India's own in-house testing facilities.

6. Spain Germany battle wildfires amid unusual heat wave



- On Sunday amid an unusual heat wave in western Europe and Germany struggled with wildfires. There has been used damage in several places in Spain and Germany.
- The Northwest province of Zamora is affected by over 25000 hectares. Up to 25000 hectares of the area have been consumed by the wildfire in Zamora.
- In Germany residents of three villages near Berlin have been ordered to leave their homes due to the approaching wildfire as requested by the officials on Sunday.
- On Sunday morning the Spanish authorities said that after 3 days of high-temperature high wind and low humidity some rest came with dropping temperatures.
- 650 firefighters along with water dumping aircraft were allowed to establish a perimeter around the fire which started in Zamora's Sierra de la Culebra.
- The authorities have won the people that there was still a danger of unfavorable shifts in weather and the revival of the blaze.
- Arjun Spain has been on alert for an outbreak of intense wildfire as the country suffers from the record temperature in many places in the country.

7. SOUTH KOREA LAUNCHES SATELLITE WITH ITS OWN ROCKET FOR THE FIRST TIME



- South Korea launched its first satellite successfully using a homegrown rocket, boosting the nation's expanding aerospace ambitions and proving it has the necessary technologies to build larger missiles and launch spy satellites in the midst of tensions with rival North Korea.
- The Science Ministry reported that the three-stage Nuri rocket successfully launched a working "performance verification" satellite to a target altitude of 435 miles from South Korea's space launch facility on a southern island.
- An unmanned South Korean station in Antarctica received signals from the satellite informing it of its condition.
- It is carrying four smaller satellites that will be launched for Earth observation and other missions in the following days.
- At a live-streamed press conference at the launch facility, science minister Lee Jong-Ho declared that "the science and technology of the Republic of Korea have achieved a remarkable advance." Together with the people, the government will continue its bold march toward becoming a space power.
- President Yoon Suk Yeol congratulated scientists and other launch participants in a video conference and promised to uphold his campaign pledge to create a state aerospace agency, according to his office.
- The 154-foot rocket was seen ascending in live TV footage among brilliant flames and copious amounts of white smoke.

8. BSE APPOINTS FORMER RBI DEPUTY GOVERNOR S S MUNDRA AS A CHAIRMAN



- S.S. Mundra, a public interest director to lead the world's largest stock exchange, according to the BSE. Justice Vikramajit Sen will be replaced by Mr. Mundra.
- After serving for three years, Mr. Mundra left his position as Reserve Bank of India's Deputy Governor in July 2017.
- Before that, he held the positions of Chairman and Managing Director at Bank of Baroda, until he retired in July 2014.
- Mr. Mundra has held a number of significant positions over his more than 40-year banking career, including Executive Director of Union Bank of India and Chief Executive of Bank of Baroda (European Operations), among others.
- Additionally, he represented the RBI as the G20 Forum's nominee on the Financial Stability Board and its numerous committees.
- Additionally, he served as the International Network on Financial Education's Vice-Chair for the OECD.
- He served on the boards of a number of multi-faceted businesses before to the RBI, including Clearing Corporation of India Ltd. and Central Depository Services (India) Ltd. (CDSL).

9. India jump two places to 104 in FIFA ranking after Asian cup qualification



- The Indian football team reaped a good harvest of its impressive Asian Cup qualification campaign as it gained two places to jump to 104th in the latest FIFA world rankings released.
- The Blue Tigers are placed just below New Zealand (103), who missed out on a 2022 FIFA World Cup spot after losing 0-1 to Costa Rica in the intercontinental play-off earlier this month.
- India's ranking among Asian Football Confederation (AFC) members, however, still remained static at 19th place.
- Iran retained the top spot among the Asian Football Confederation (AFC) countries (23).
- Brazil remained on top, three months after taking the top spot from Belgium (2nd).
- Argentina jumped one place to third at the expense of France (4th) who paid the price for four winless games in the UEFA Nations League.
- England, Spain, Italy, Netherlands, Portugal and Denmark complete the top-10.
- The next FIFA world ranking will be out on August 25.

1. G7 leaders pledge 600 billion for developing countries



- Leaders of the Group of Seven (G7) began three days of talks yesterday in Germany's Bavarian Alps.
- One of the first announcements was a 600 billion dollar infrastructure initiative to help developing countries tackle climate change.
- The initiative is seen as the West's response to China's massive Belt and Road Initiative (BRI).
- US President Joe Biden said, this is not aid or charity but an investment that will deliver returns for everyone, including the American people and the people of all our nations.
- It will boost all of our economies, he said. China has been accused of trapping low-income countries into unaffordable debts to be part of its trillion-dollar BRI push.
- EU Commission chief Ursula von der Leyen said G7 is offering sustainable, quality infrastructure and will be listening closely to the recipient countries.

2. IRAN LAUNCHES A SOLID-FUELED ROCKET INTO SPACE




- Iran has launched a solid-fueled rocket into space. Defense Ministry Spokesman Ahmad Hosseini said Zuljanah, a 25.5 meter-long rocket, is capable of carrying a satellite of 220 kilograms that will ultimately gather data in low-earth orbit and promote Iran's space industry.
- Zuljanah is named for the horse of Imam Hussein, the grandson of the Prophet Muhammad.
- However, it drew a rebuke from Washington ahead of the expected resumption of stalled talks over Tehran's nuclear deal with world powers.
- The White House said it is aware of Iran's announcement and criticized the move as unhelpful and destabilizing.
- The White House said it is committed to using sanctions and other measures to prevent further advances in Iran's ballistic missile program.
- Iran, which long has said it does not seek nuclear weapons, maintains its satellite launches and rocket tests do not have a military component.

3. MADHYA PRADESH CLINCH FIRST EVER RANJI TROPHY TITLE WITH SIX-WICKET WIN AGAINST MUMBAI



- In Ranji Trophy Final, Madhya Pradesh defeated Mumbai by six wickets to win their first-ever Ranji Trophy title at M.Chinnaswamy Stadium in Bengaluru today.
- Needing 108 runs to win in the second innings, the Aditya Shrivastava-led Madhya Pradesh took just 29.5 overs to achieve the target riding on Shubham Sharma's 30 and Rajat Patidar's unbeaten 30.
- Sharma and Patidar had also scored centuries in the first innings along with Yash Dubey. With the ball, Kumar Kartikeya picked up four wickets as Madhya Pradesh bowled Mumbai out for 269 in the first session of Day 5.
- Mumbai's Suved Parkar scored 51 off 58 while Sarfaraz Khan added 45 but Mumbai kept losing wickets at regular intervals to be bundled out for 269.

4. Qosanov Memorial Athletics Meet: Navjeet Dhillon Grabs Gold in Discus Throw



- Indian women's discus thrower Navjeet Dhillon won the gold medal at the Qosanov Memorial 2022 athletics meet in Almaty, Kazakhstan, yesterday.
- Navjeet Dhillon, who is looking to seal her place in the Indian team for Commonwealth Games, won the women's discus throw with a 56.24m effort.
- Local athlete Karina Vasilyeva with 44.61m and Uzbekistan's Yulianna Shchukina with 40.48m followed Navjeet Dhillon on the podium.
- Meanwhile, Dutee Chand produced a season-best 11.38s to top the 100m but failed to repeat the performance in the finals.
- Dutee Chand, who has been selected in the 4x100m relay team for CWG, clocked 11.49s in the 100m final to finish second behind Olga Safronova of Kazakhstan, who claimed

- gold in 11.40s.
- India's MV Jilna came third in 11.61s. India won 14 medals on the day, including seven golds..

5. SEAFARER DAY: 25 OF JUNE



- The International Maritime Organization (IMO) is celebrating Seafarer Day today.
- It is celebrated on the 25 of June each year to pay respect to Seafarers and sailors who help the entire world function by conducting sea transport.
- The day was proposed by International Maritime Organization in 2010 to celebrate the contribution of the seafarer to the world economy and civil society.
- Day of the Seafarer recognizes the invaluable contribution of seafarers to the worldwide commerce and economic system.
- Almost 90 per cent of the world's goods trade are transported by ships and behind these ships are the seafarers who work relentlessly to ensure the smooth flow of trade via water.
- The day honours their contributions and is celebrated to show reverence to them.
- The theme of this year is 'Seafarers: at the core of shipping's future.

6. Noted lyricist, author and journalist, Chowalloor Krishnankutty passed away



- In Kerala, noted lyricist, author and journalist, Chowalloor Krishnankutty passed away at a private Medical College Hospital in Thrissur last night. He was 86.
- A former Staff Artist with AIR, Krishnankutty penned over 3000 devotional songs and authored more than 200 books. He retired as an Assistant Editor with the Malayala Manorama daily.
- He won several awards including the Kerala Sahithya Academy Award for satire, Poonthanam Jnanapana and Revathy Pattathanam Awards among others.
- Chowalloor Krishanankutty also made his mark as a screen writer in Malayalam movies and produced documentaries on some well-known Kathakali artists. He also served as the Vice-Chairman of the Kerala Kalamandalam.

7. Odisha's Mo Bus Won UN's Public Service Award



- Mo Bus, Odisha-based public transport service has been honored with a prestigious United Nations award, for their role and efforts in helping the world recover better from Covid19.
- The public transport service has been recognised for its role in "promoting genderresponsive public services to achieve the SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals)", the UN said.
- Among the other winners of this year's awards, announced by Liu Zhenmin, United Nations Under Secretary-General for Economic and Social Affairs during a virtual event to commemorate the United Nations Public Service Day (celebrated on June 22), were public service initiatives from Thailand, Brazil, Canada, Ireland, Panama, the Philippines, Poland, Saudi Arabia, and Ukraine.
- The UN recognition said the "problem" was that "bus services in the city of Bhubaneswar needed improvement", as a result of which "the majority of people used private vehicles, two-wheelers and auto-rickshaw to commute instead of taking public transportation".

8. GUJARAT CM BHUPENDRA PATEL LAUNCHES 17TH 'SHALA PRAVESHOTSAV'



- In Gujarat, the Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel has launched the 17th 'Shala Praveshotsav', the drive to enrol students in primary schools in the state.
- The three-day enrollment drive begins from Memadpur primary school in Vadgam taluka of Banaskantha district. Chief Minister Patel said that the dropout rate of students' reduced drastically following the mass enrolment drives of the children.
- He said that the drop out rate has been reduced to just 3.07 percent from 37.22 percent in 2002.
- According to official sources, the state officials including IAS and IPS officers and Members of Parliament and Members of Legislative Assembly will visit different schools of the state and enrol children in Class I.



1. UN OCEAN CONFERENCE KICKS OFF IN LISBON



- A five-day UN Ocean Conference kicked off yesterday with the Kenya and Portugal being the co-hosts.
- Leaders from over 130 countries from across the world will deliberate for five days to find an international agreement on protecting the world's oceans, seas and marine resources.
- Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh is leading the Indian delegation. On the first day, the Minister had bilateral talks with a number of Ministers from different countries attending the meet.
- Today, Dr Jitendra Singh is scheduled to present India's statement before the full House of the UN meet.
- The Ocean Conference comes at a crucial juncture as the world is seeking to address many of the challenges requiring structural transformations and Innovative and Green solutions to achieve Sustainable Development Goal 14.
- The SDG calls for Conservation and Sustainable use of the oceans, seas and marine resources.

2. PALLONJI MISTRY PASSES AWAY



- Business tycoon Pallonji Mistry passed away at the age of 93 at his Mumbai residence Monday night.
- The construction magnate, who was born on June 1, 1929 in the metropolis, is survived by his four children two sons and two daughters.
- Mistry was the chairman of the Shapoorji Pallonji Group, which was established in 1865.
- Headquartered in Mumbai, the conglomerate operates in sectors such as construction, real estate, textiles, home appliances, power, biotechnology etc.
- At 18.4%, Pallonji was the highest individual shareholder in Tata Sons.
- His son, Cyrus, headed Tata Sons from November 2011 to October 2016. Cyrus, after his removal from the post, fought a legal battle with Ratan Tata, the-then chairman of Tata Sons.
- In April 2021, the Bloomberg Billionaires Index estimated Pallonji Mistry's wealth to be USD 28 billion, making him the wealthiest person in Ireland.

3. Ambubachi Mela 2022 at Assam's Kamakhya Temple



- The doors of the Kamakhya Temple were opened today morning for the devotees to pay their obisieiance during the Ambubachi Festival.
- According to the rituals, the doors opened after four days and with this the Ambubachi Mela concluded for the season.
- The festival had begun on June 22 amidst many restrictions but nonetheless pilgrims poured in to seek the blessings of Goddess Kamakhya.
- The festival marks the celebration of the goddess who is believed to undergo her annual menstrual cycle during these days.
- An annual Hindu festival known as the Ambubachi Mela takes place at the Kamakhya Temple in Guwahati, Assam.
- This annual festival is held in the middle of June, when the Brahmaputra River is at its highest flow, during the monsoon season, which also happens to fall within the Assamese month of Ahaar.

4. Tata Power Solar commissions India's largest floating solar power project



- Tata Power Solar Systems, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Tata Power, has accomplished a remarkable feat by commissioning India's largest floating solar power project in Kayamkulam, Kerala.
- On a 350-acre water body, backwaters area, having an installed capacity of 101.6 Megawatt Peak.
- Tata Power Solar successfully built a scaffolding platform on the water body to make the entire solar plant float on water.
- This project is the first one in the Floating Solar Photovoltaic (FSPV) through Power Purchase Agreement category. This plant boasts a floating inverter platform having a 5 Megawatt (MW) capacity.
- The entire array involving floats and solar panel modules had to be towed for 3 kilometers

- on a sea-linked National waterway, which was 15 meters deep, exposing the solar modules to high winds and gushing tides often reaching a height of about 3.5 meters.
- To operationalize the project, Tata Power Solar 's execution team was successfully able to synchronize the 33/220 Kilovolts Air Insulated Substation (AIS) with 220 Kilovolts existing Gas Insulated Substation (GIS).

5. IRARC'S AVINASH KULKARNI TO HEAD INDIA DEBT RESOLUTION COMPANY



- The chief govt of India Resurgence Asset Reconstruction Firm (IRARC), Avinash Kulkarni, has been chosen to head the India Debt Decision Firm (IDRCL).
- Kulkarni is a (SBI) veteran, having undertaken numerous roles on the public sector behemoth.
- His engagements on the SBI group have included assignments within the funding banking and advisory arm, Capital Markets.
- Kulkarni was selected from among a shortlist of about six candidates earlier this month.
- With this selection, the key executives are in place to start consolidating bad loans from banks through the NARCL.
- Kulkarni's appointment follows another SBI veteran Natarajan Sundar being selected as CEO of the National Asset Reconstruction Company Limited (NARCL) in April.

6. World's biggest bacterium found in Caribbean mangrove swamp



- In a Caribbean mangrove swamp, researchers found the largest bacterium known to science.
- While the majority of bacteria are tiny, this one is so large that it can be seen with the unaided eye.
- It is by far the largest bacterium known to date, according to Jean-Marie Volland, a marine biologist at the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory and a co-author of a paper reporting the finding in the journal Science.
- The thin white thread is about the size of a human eyelash.
- The cell has a shape that is unusual for bacteria, according to the researchers, but they have not yet been able to develop it in lab culture.
- One significant distinction is that it includes a sizable central compartment, or vacuole, which enables some cell functions to take place there rather than all across the cell.

7. Parameswaran Iyer to take over as Niti Aayog CEO as Amitabh Kant leaves



• Former Drinking and water Sanitation Secretary, Parameswaren Iyer has been appointed as the new Chief Executive Officer of NITI Aayog for 2 years.

- He will succeed Amitabh Kant. Kant was appointed as the CEO of the National Institution for Transforming India (Niti Aayog) on February 17, 2016, for a fixed two-year term. Kant was later given an extension till June 30, 2019.
- His term was further extended for two years, till this month-end, in June 2019.In June 2021, Kant received another one-year extension.

8. Tapan Deka is new IB chief, R&AW head Samant Goel gets another extension



- The Central government has appointed senior IPS officer Tapan Kumar Deka as Director of Intelligence Bureau.
- Tapan Kumar Deka, a 1988 batch Himachal Pradesh cadre IPS officer, was appointed for a tenure of two years from the date of assumption of the charge of the post or until further orders, whichever is earlier.
- Deka will succeed incumbent Intelligence Bureau Director Arvind Kumar, whose tenure ends on June 30.

9. India successfully conducts VL-SRSAM missile test off the coast of Odisha



Off the coast of Chandipur, in the state of Odisha, India successfully tested the Vertical Launch Short Range Surface to Air Missile (VL-SRSAM).

- Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO) and Indian Navy successfully conducted flight tests for the Vertical Launch Short Range Surface to Air Missile (VL-SRSAM).
- Off the coast of Chandipur, Odisha, the launch was carried out from an Indian Naval Ship.
- A ship-borne weapon system called VL-SRSAM is designed to eliminate close-range aerial threats such targets that skim the surface of the sea.
- A high-speed aerial target resembling an aeroplane was launched with the system, and it was effectively engaged.
- ITR, Chandipur deployed a variety of tracking sensors to track the vehicle's flight path and health indicators. Senior representatives from the Indian Navy and DRDO kept an eye on the test launch.
- Shri Rajnath Singh, the minister of defence, also expressed his gratitude to the DRDO, the Indian Navy, and the industry for the successful flight test and noted that the system's additional armour will improve the ability of Indian naval ships to defend themselves from aerial threats.

10. GOA CELEBRATES 'SAO JOAO' FESTIVAL 2022



- The people of Goa has celebrated the Sao Joao festival, the feast of St John the Baptist with traditional enthusiasm after a two-year coronavirus-induced gap.
- The festival is dedicated to Saint John the Baptist, who baptised Lord Jesus on the river of Jordan and is celebrated at the onset of monsoon.
- Siolim, a village in North Goa, hosts a traditional canoe parade on the occasion of Sao Joao.
- A large number of people participated in the boat parade in Siolim village of Goa's Bardez taluka, marking the beginning of revelry in the 'Sao Joao' festival.
- Traditionally, people jump into the well but since the wells are fast disappearing, people prefer to celebrate it in swimming pools.
- The festival is marked to herald the monsoon season in the state every year in June.
- People are often seen having a great time by enjoying and dancing in the artificial rain


1. Prime Minister to participate in 'Udyami Bharat' programme in New Delhi on June 30


• This has been done to provide necessary and timely support to the MSME sector, which has helped benefit crores of people across the country.

- In the opening two rounds, the 23-year-old Punia lost to eventual gold medallist Azizbek Fayzullaev of Uzbekistan and Nurtilek Karypbaev of Kyrgyzstan.
- However, he overpowered Satybaldy of Kazakhstan to settle for the bronze.
- India won 25 medals in all in the U23 meet in the event, including 10 gold medals.

3. 29TH JUNE IS CELEBRATED AS STATISTICS DAY



• This year's theme is Data for Sustainable Development. Union Government has been celebrating Statistics Day on 29th June every year since 2007 to mark the birth anniversary of late Professor Prasanta Chandra Mahalanobis, in recognition of his

- valuable contribution in the field of Economic Planning and Statistics.
- The major objective of celebrating Statistics Day is creation of public awareness, especially among the younger generation, on the role and importance of statistics in socio-economic planning and policy formulation for development of the country.
- On each Statistics Day, one particular theme of current national importance is chosen for intensive and focused discussions towards filling the data gaps and improvement in data collection, processing and dissemination.

4. NASA successfully launches a rocket from Australia's remote Northern Territory



- NASA has successfully launched a rocket from Australia's remote Northern Territory, making history as the agency's first commercial spaceport launch outside the United States.
- According to Equatorial Launch Australia, the rocket blasted off at just past midnight local time on Monday from the Arnhem Space Centre on the Dhupuma Plateau, near the township of Nhulunbuy.
- The rocket is expected to travel more than 300 kilometres into space on its mission to observe the Alpha Centauri 'A' and 'B' constellations, the nearest star systems to the Earth.
- Monday's Launch also made history for Australia as the first commercial space launch in the country.
- According to NASA, it was the first of three launches, with a further two planned for 4th and 12th of July.

5. 125 TH BIRTH ANNIVERSARY OF ALLURI SEETHARAMA RAJU, JULY 4TH



- Elaborate arrangements are being made for the 125th birth anniversary celebrations of revolutionary Alluri Sitarama Raju from June 27 to July 4 across the State, Special Chief Secretary (Youth Welfare and Culture) Rajat Bhargava.
- Alluri was born on July 4, 1897 and martyred on May 7, 1924 at a young age of 27 years.
- On Monday, orders were issued to all the District Collectors to make arrangements for celebration of the birth anniversary on a grand scale.
- As part of the celebrations, competitions will be held for schoolchildren in painting, essay writing, Rangoli, mono acting. Music concerts, patriotic songs and cycle rallies, blood donation camps, yoga and photo exhibitions will also be organised.

6. AKASH AMBANI NAMED RELIANCE JIO CHAIRMAN; MUKESH AMBANI RESIGNS



- Mukesh Ambani's eldest son Akash Ambani will take over as chairman of Jio Infocomm's board, the digital division of Reliance industries, in what is viewed as the 65-year-old billionaire's succession planning.
- Mukesh Ambani has resigned as the company director effective from 27 June.
- Pankaj Mohan Pawar was among the other selections made, and his five-year term as

managing director began on 27 June.

• KV Chowdary and Raminder Singh Gujral were named independent directors.

7. ZOMATO DIPS 6% AS BOARD APPROVES ACQUISITION OF BLINKIT FOR RS 4,447 CRORE



- Zomato (Online food delivery platform) has announced the acquisition of Blink Commerce (Blinkit), earlier known as Grofers India.
- The company's Board of Directors approved a proposal to acquire cash-strapped quick commerce company Blinkit for Rs 4,447 crore.
- Last year, Zomato extended USD 50 million loans to Grofers India Private Limited. Zomato already owned more than a 9 percent stake in Blinkit (earlier Grofers).
- While the earlier Blinkit deal value was around \$700 million, the drop in Zomato's share price reduced it to \$568 million.

1. India successfully tests high-speed expendable aerial target Abhyas off Odisha coast



- India has successfully flight-tested the indigenously developed high-speed expendable aerial target ABHYAS, from the Integrated Test Range (ITR) in Chandipur off the Odisha coast.
- The performance of the aircraft at low altitude, including sustained level and high maneuverability, was demonstrated during the test flight.
- The target aircraft was flown from a ground-based controller in a pre-designated lowaltitude flight path, which was monitored by various tracking sensors deployed by the ITR, including radar and an electro-optical targeting system.
- ABHYAS is designed and developed by Aeronautical Development Establishment of Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO).
- Defence Minister Rajnath Singh congratulated DRDO and the armed forces for the successful flight trial of ABHYAS.
- He said that the development of this system will meet the requirements of aerial targets.
- 2. ISRO TO LAUNCH ROCKET PSLV-C53, CARRYING THREE SINGAPORE SATELLITES THIS EVENING



- Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) is set to launch the rocket PSLV-C53, carrying three Singapore satellites at 6.02 pm today.
- The launch vehicle will lift off from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre at Sriharikota.
- The 25 hours countdown for the mission that began yesterday evening is progressing well.
- Six nano-satellites including those belonging to India's two private space start-ups also will go to space, in today's mission.
- "The second launch pad is bustling with activities in preparation of today's launch.
- PSLV-C53 is the second dedicated commercial mission of the NewSpace India Limited, a public sector unit under the Department of Space.
- It was formed after the recent space sector reforms. For the workhorse launch vehicle PSLV, this will be the 55th mission.
- Its primary payloads are the 365 kg earth observation satellite called DS-EO, a 155 kg NeuSAR satellite and the 2.8 kg Scoob-1 nano-satellite of the Nanyang Technological University, Singapore.

3. VICE PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON AUGUST 6



- The Vice Presidential Election will be held on the 6th of August. In a statement, the Election Commission of India ECI said, notification for the election will be issued on 5th July and nominations can be filed till 19th of next month.
- The scrutiny of nominations will be done on 20th July.
- The Commission said, the Electoral College for the Vice Presidential Election consists of 233 elected members of Rajya Sabha, 12 nominated members of Rajya Sabha and 543 elected members of Lok Sabha.
- The Secretary-General of Lok Sabha will be the Returning Officer for the Election.

4. IRAN APPLIES TO JOIN BRICS GROUP OF EMERGING COUNTRIES



- Iran has submitted an application to become a member of the BRICS, an Iranian official said yesterday.
- Iran, which holds the world's second-largest gas reserves, wants to join the BRICS group of Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa.
- The term BRIC was coined by Goldman Sachs economist Jim O'Neill in 2001 to describe the startling rise of Brazil, Russia, India, and China.
- The BRIC powers had their first summit in 2009 in Russia. South Africa joined in 2010.
- Iran's Foreign Ministry Spokesperson said that Tehran's membership in the BRICS group would result in added values for both sides. Russia said, Argentina had also applied to join.
- Argentine President Alberto Fernandez, currently in Europe, has in recent days reiterated his desire for Argentina to join BRICS.
- China has by far the largest economy in the BRICS grouping, accounting for more than 70 of the group's collective 27.5 trillion US dollars in economic might.
- India accounts for about 13 per cent, with Russia and Brazil each accounting for about seven per cent, according to IMF data.

5. Uddhav Thackeray resigns as Supreme Court refuses to stay floor test



- Uddhav Thackeray has resigned as the Chief minister of Maharashtra.
- This comes immediately after the Supreme Court refused to stay Maharashtra Governor's direction to the Uddhav Thackeray-led Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government to take a floor test in the Assembly.
- Late in the evening, Mr. Thackeray submitted his resignation to Mr. Bhagat Singh Koshyari at the Raj Bhavan in Mumbai.
- The Governor accepted the resignation of Mr. Thackeray and asked him to officiate as the Chief Minister until alternate arrangements are made.
- With Mr. Thackeray's resignation, the unique three-party experiment of the MVA, in which the Shiv Sena tied up with the Congress and the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP), has come to an end.
- The BJP, which is the single-largest party in the Assembly with 106 MLAs, is likely to stake claim to form the government.

6. ENGLAND CAPTAIN MORGAN RETIRES



Eoin Morgan has announced his immediate retirement from international cricket,

according to the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB).

- Morgan was the captain of England's men's white-ball team.
- The 35-year-old captained England Men to their first-ever ICC Men's Cricket World Cup victory at Lord's in 2019 throughout his 13-year international career with England.
- He also competed for England in the 2010 ICC Men's T20 Cricket World Cup, which was held in the Caribbean.
- In all ODI and T20I games, Morgan has scored the most runs for England Men overall and has received the most caps.
- He led England to the top of the ICC world rankings throughout his seven years as the Men's ODI captain, winning noteworthy series against all the major countries.
- He earned a record-breaking 225 ODI caps and amassed 6,957 runs—including 1300 at an average of 39.75—during that time.
- The highest win record by any England Men's ODI Captain in the history of the game was 76 victories in 126 games Morgan managed, with a win rate of 60%.

1. EKNATH SHINDE SWORN-IN AS CM OF MAHARASHTRA, DEVENDRA FADNAVIS AS DEPUTY CM



- Rebel Shiv Sena leader Eknath Shinde has been sworn-in as Chief Minister of Maharashtra, while BJP leader Devendra Fadnavis took over as Deputy Chief Minister.
- Maharashtra Governor has asked Chief Minister Shinde to prove majority of his government in the state assembly tomorrow. Chief Minister Shinde convened the first cabinet meeting of the new government yesterday.
- The Cabinet decided to convene a two-day special session of the state legislature on 2nd and 3rd this month.
- The Speaker of the assembly will also be elected tomorrow. The Cabinet also reviewed the Kharif season, rain water and crop insurance in the state.
- Maharashtra Chief Minister EknathShinde in his first cabinet meeting stressed on the importance of taking ahead the developmental works in the state in a fast and efficient manner.
- Acknowledging Deputy Chief minister Devendra Fadnavis's experience, Shri Shinde said
 he is fortunate to have an experienced Deputy Chief Minister like Fadnavis in his team
 whose presence will ease managing various affairs of the state including the developmental
 programs.

2. ISRAEL TO GO FOR ELECTIONS ON THE NOVEMBER 1ST



- Israel is set for election on the 1st of November as lawmakers dissolved the parliament today. It will be the fifth election for Israelis in less than four years.
- The Israeli parliament, the Knesset, voted 92-Nil, bringing an end to Prime Minister Naftali Bennett's run as premier-- one of the shortest terms in Israeli history.
- Tomorrow, Foreign Minister Yair Lapid will take over as caretaker prime minister under the terms of a coalition agreement made between the outgoing Prime Minister and Lapid last year.

3. NEERAJ CHOPRA CLINCHES SILVER MEDAL AT PRESTIGIOUS DIAMOND LEAGUE MEET



- Olympic champion javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra clinched his first-ever medal at the prestigious Diamond League meet in Stockholm yesterday as he broke his own national record for the second time in a month.
- Chopra finished 2nd at the Stockholm Diamond League with a massive throw of 89.94 meter.
- Reigning world champion Anderson Peters won the event with a best throw of 90.31 meter.

- Chopra broke his own national record of 89.30m that he set at the Paavo Nurmi Games in Turku earlier this month.
- The prestigious one-day meet at the Swedish capital is Chopra's biggest event ahead of the World Championships in Eugene, USA, next month.
- Chopra is the first Indian to win a gold medal in athletics at the Olympics.

4. Synergy conference of Indian Army and Defense Accounts dept discusses pay & allowances system for Agniveers



- In New Delhi, there was the fourth Synergy Conference between the Indian Army and the Defense Accounts Department (DAD).
- Senior commanders of the Indian Army and DAD attended the one-day meeting, which was co-chaired by Vice Chief of Army Staff (VCOAS) Lt Gen BS Raju and Controller General of Defence Accounts (CGDA) Shri Rajnish Kumar.
- Deliberations on the AGNIPATH plan and the timeline for the prompt implementation of a system for pay and allowances for Agniveers were on the conference's main agenda.
- Enhancing the performance of Pay and Accounts Offices (PAOs) for better service delivery to Junior Commissioned Officers/Other Ranks of the Indian Army was another item on the agenda. Senior officers from both sides were consulted as concrete action plans for the future were developed.
- The CGDA agreed with the department's goal of using technology to improve service delivery to the armed forces and to implement creative business process re-engineering to significantly alter the way that bills are processed and paid.
- He described the numerous DAD projects, including the future Centralized Pay System and DARPAN (Defence Accounts Receipt, Payment and Analysis). He also emphasised the importance of the Army's cooperation in achieving the goals.

6. Olympic medallist hockey player Varinder Singh passes away





- Indian hockey stalwart and member of the gold medal winning 1975 World Cup team, Varinder Singh passed away.
- He was 75. Singh was part of the gold medal-winning Indian team at the 1975 men's

- Hockey World Cup in Kuala Lumpur.
- Singh was also part of the bronze medal-winning team at the 1972 Munich Olympics and silver medal at 1973 World Cup in Amsterdam.
- In 2007, Varinder was conferred with the prestigious Dhyan Chand Lifetime Achievement Award.

7. PADMA, THE CENTRALISED PAY SYSTEM FOR INDIAN COAST GUARD LAUNCHED



- Pay Roll Automation for Disbursement of Monthly Allowances (PADMA), an automated Pay & Allowances module for the Indian Coast Guard was inaugurated by Shri Rajnish Kumar, Controller General of Defence Accounts (CGDA), Ministry of Defence.
- The CGDA emphasized that the Government has campaigned for Digital India to ensure dedicated services and reduce manual intervention at every level & to promote E-Governance in a big way.
- Launch of PADMA will strengthen the Digital India concept. Also, it is an 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' initiative as the entire module has been designed and developed by Indian entrepreneurs assisted by domain experts.
- PADMA is an automated platform leveraging latest technology which will provide seamless and timely disbursal of Pay & Allowances to around 15,000 Indian Coast Guard personnel.
- This module has been developed under the aegis of Defense Accounts Department and will be operated by Pay Accounts Office Coast Guard, Noida.

1. India's largest floating solar power project commissioned



- India's largest floating solar power project is now fully operational.
- NTPC declared commercial operation of the final part capacity of 20 MW out of 100 MW Ramagundam Floating Solar PV Project at Ramagundam, Telangana with effect from 1st of July.
- With the operationalisation of the 100-MW Solar PV Project at Ramagundam, the total commercial operation of floating solar capacity in the Southern Region rose to 217 MW.
- Earlier, NTPC declared commercial operation of 92 MW Floating Solar at Kayamkulam in Kerala and 25 MW Floating Solar at Simhadri in Andhra Pradesh.
- The 100-MW Floating Solar project at Ramagundam is endowed with advanced technology as well as environment-friendly features.
- Constructed with a financial implication of 423 crore rupees, the project spreads over 500 acres of its reservoir.
- An official release said that with the presence of floating solar panels, the evaporation rate from water bodies is reduced, thus helping in water conservation.

2. DRDO CARRIES OUT MAIDEN FLIGHT OF UNMANNED COMBAT AIRCRAFT



- The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) yesterday successfully carried out the Maiden flight of Autonomous Flying Wing Technology Demonstrator from Aeronautical Test Range at Chitradurga in Karnataka.
- With this success, India's secretive unmanned combat aerial vehicle UCAV programme under which a technology demonstrator called stealth wing flying test bed (SWift) is being developed reached a milestone.
- The programme is linked to the development of India's fifth-generation stealth fighter advanced medium combat aircraft or AMCA.
- The flight operated in a fully autonomous mode. The aircraft exhibited a perfect flight, including take-off, way point navigation and a smooth touchdown. This aircraft is powered by a small turbofan engine.

3. RAILWAYS RECORDS BEST EVER MONTHLY FREIGHT LOADING OF OVER 125 MILLION TONNES IN JUNE THIS YEAR



Railways has recorded best-ever monthly freight loading of over 125 million tonnes in

- June this year. The incremental loading has been a growth of 11.28 percent over the same period in 2021.
- Railway Ministry said, this growth has been fuelled by incremental loading of over 13 million tonnes in Coal, followed by Cement and Food grains.
- The cumulative freight loading in the first quarter of this financial year has been over 379 million tonnes as against 339 million tonnes achieved in 2021-22.

4. K.K. VENUGOPAL RE-APPOINTED AS ATTORNEY GENERAL FOR THREE MONTHS



- Attorney General (A-G), K.K. Venugopal has been re-appointed as the country's top law officer for a period of three months.
- Mr. Venugopal, whose current one-year term ends on June 30, agreed to a short tenure following a request from the government.
- The sources cited above said that he was initially not willing to continue in the Constitutional post due to "personal reasons".
- In July 2017, Mr. Venugopal, 90, was appointed by the President of India to succeed Mukul Rohatgi as the A-G. The government's top law officer enjoys a tenure of three years.
- However, when Mr. Venugopal's first term as A-G was to end in 2020, he requested the government to give him a one-year tenure keeping in mind his advanced age.
- Last year too, he was reappointed for one year.

5. Isro places 3 Singapore satellites, 6 experiments in orbit in second launch this year



- Three Singaporean satellites were successfully launched by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) as part of a commercial mission for the New Space India Limited.
- This was the space agency's second launch of the year; its first, had put an Indian Earth Observation Satellite in orbit.
- The space agency also carried six in-orbit experiments mounted on the fourth stage of the rocket on the current mission in addition to the commercial satellites.
- The nation's workhorse rocket, PSLV-C53, launched from Sriharikota and put the three satellites into precise orbits about 18 minutes later.
- The launch vehicle was deployed in the core-alone configuration, which only uses the four primary engine stages.
- The 365 kg Singaporean DS-EO satellite served as the mission's primary payload.
- It is an electro-optic earth observation satellite that can deliver full-color images for land classification and disaster relief operations.
- Its first small commercial satellite, weighing 155 kg, is called NeuSAR. It can transmit images in all weather conditions, day or night.

6. Dictator's son Ferdinand Marcos Jr. takes oath as Philippine president



- Ferdinand Marcos Jr, the son of late dictator Ferdinand Marcos Sr, won the elections on 9th May with 31.6 million votes and was swore as the 17th President of the Philippines.
- He took the oath at the National Museum of Fine Arts in Manila before the Supreme Court Justice, Alexander Gesmundo.
- The former President's daughter and his running mate, Sara Duterte Carpio, swore as vice president on 19th June. The two will be serving the nation until 2028.
- Marcos Jr. is more popularly known as "Bongbong" in the country and won on the platform of national unity, promising more jobs, lowering prices, and increasing investment in agriculture and infrastructure.
- Ferdinand Marcos Sr. was a dictator who ruled the country from 1965 to 1986 and was laid off due to abuse of human rights and increased corruption.
- During his reign, the country observed martial law from 1972-1981, where several people were tortured, imprisoned or killed for criticizing the government.

7. Malayalam Actress Ambika Rao Dies of Cardiac Arrest Aged 58



- Malayalam actor and assistant director Ambika Rao passed away at the age of 58.
- She entered the movie industry as an assistant director with the 2002 release 'Krishna Gopalakrishna' helmed by Balachandra Menon.
- She forayed into the film industry as an assistant director in early 2000.
- She has assisted several directors, including Balachandra Menon, Anwar Rasheed, Shafi, and Vinayan.
- She also acted in many movies. Recently, she made a mark with her performances in hit films like Virus and Kumbalangi Nights.
