

CURRENT AFFAIRS MARCH 2022

National News

1. CENTER TO SEND FOUR CABINET MINISTERS TO COORDINATE EVACUATION MISSION "OPERATION GANGA"



- The government of India has launched an evacuation mission named Operation Ganga to evacuate Indian nationals from Ukraine due to the Russia-Ukraine tension.
- Due to the ongoing tension between Ukraine and Russia, Ukraine has been declared as a no-fly zone by the authorities for the safety and security of the nations.
- Due to this many Indian nationals were left stranded in Ukraine. To help the Indian citizens come back to the country, the government of India decided to conduct a special evacuation mission named Operation Ganga.
- The government will bring back Indian nationals via flight.

2. BANGLADESH-INDIA CULTURAL MEET KICKS OFF IN RAJSHAHI



- The fifth Bangladesh- India Cultural meet kicked off on Saturday with a colorful civic reception being given to the visiting guests from India and dignitaries in Rajshahi.
- The function was presided over by the Mayor of Rajshahi city AHM Khairuzzaman Liton.
- Several prominent public figures like the agriculture minister Dr. Abdur Razzak, State Minister for Foreign Affairs Shahriar Alam and High Commissioner of India to Bangladesh Vikram Doraiswami, Tripura State Minister Ramprasad Pal among others were present on the occasion.
- Friends of Bangladesh and Rajshahi City Corporation (RCC) are jointly hosting the four-day event between Feb 25-28 to celebrate the birth centenary of Bangladesh Mujibur Rahman, the golden jubilee of the liberation of Bangladesh and 50th year of Bangladesh India Friendship.

3. BHARTI AIRTEL TO BUY ADDITIONAL 4.7% STAKE IN INDUS TOWERS FROM VODAFONE



- Bharti Airtel has decided to acquire an additional 4.7 per cent stake in Indus Towers from Vodafone Group, the company announced.
- The two companies signed an agreement on the condition that Vodafone will use the proceeds to invest in Vodafone Idea (Vi) and the latter will clear its pending dues with Indus Towers.
- In addition, Airtel is also protected with a capped price, which is lower than the price for the block of Indus shares sold by Vodafone on February 24.
- This shall be value accretive to Airtel and protect its existing significant shareholding in Indus Towers.
- With the acquisition, Airtel's shareholding in Indus Towers will increase to 46.4 per cent.
- Vodafone holds a 28.1 per cent stake in the company at present and its shareholding will reduce to 21 per cent.

4. EDUCATION MINISTRY LAUNCHES BHASHA CERTIFICATE SELFIE CAMPAIGN



- Ministry of Education has launched a Bhasha Certificate Selfie Campaign to encourage cultural diversity and promote multilingualism and to foster the spirit of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat.
- Bhasha Certificate Selfie initiative aims to promote Bhasha Sangam mobile app, developed by Ministry of Education and MyGov India.
- Using the app, people can learn 100 sentences of daily use in 22 scheduled Indian languages.
- Ministry of Education in a statement said that the initiative, under the aegis of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat will aim to ensure that people acquire basic conversational skills in Indian languages.
- To achieve this, a target of 75 lakh people acquiring basic conversational skills has been set.

5. COCHIN AIRPORT TO BECOME POWER-POSITIVE WITH NEW SOLAR PLANT FROM MARCH 6

- The Cochin International Airport Limited (CIAL) is set to commission a 12 MWp solar power plant on March 6 near Payyanur in Kannur district of Kerala.
- With the commissioning of the new solar power plant, CIAL will get the status as a power positive airport, from its current status of being a power-neutral airport.
- In 2015, CIAL became the world's first airport to be fully powered by solar energy.




6. Mansukh Mandaviya Launched the "ICMR/DHR Policy on Biomedical Innovation



- For medical professionals, scientists, and technicians in medical, dental, and paramedical institutes, the Union health ministry has launched the ICMR/ DHR Policy on Biomedical Innovation and Entrepreneurship.
- By promoting the Government of India's Make-in-India, Start-Up-India, and Atma Nirbhar Bharat initiatives, it would assure multidisciplinary collaboration, promote start-up culture, and establish an innovation-led ecosystem at medical institutes across the country."
- "This Policy will ensure multi-disciplinary collaboration, promote start-up culture, and develop an innovation led ecosystem at Medical Institutes across the country by promoting Make-in-India, Start-Up-India, and Atmanirbhar Bharat initiatives," said Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya, Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare, speaking at the policy launch.
- This policy is in line with Prime Minister Harper's motto of "Innovate, Patent, Produce, and Prosper."

7. NATIONAL SCIENCE DAY: FEB 28



- Today is the National Science Day. The day is celebrated every year on 28th February to commemorate the discovery of the 'Raman Effect'.
- On this day, Indian Physicist Sir C.V. Raman announced the discovery of the 'Raman Effect' for which he was awarded the Nobel Prize in 1930.
- In 1986, Government of India designated 28 February as National Science Day. The day is aimed at spreading the message of importance of science and its application in human life.
- This year the theme of the National Science Day isIntegrated Approach in Science and Technology for Sustainable Future. On the occasion, theme-based science communication activities are carried out all over the country.
- Sharing his thoughts in his Mann Ki Baat programme yesterday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on this Science Day, has urged all the families to definitely start with small efforts to develop a scientific temperament in their children.

8. Polio National Immunization Day 27th February

- In 2022, the Government of India has organised the Polio National Immunization Day 2022 (NID) (also known as "Polio Ravivar") on February 27, 2022, to give two drops of oral polio vaccine (OPV) to every child in the country under the age of five.
- Over 15 crore children will be covered under the drive across all 36 States and UTs in 735 districts.
- The National Polio Immunization Drive for 2022 was launched by Union Minister for Health and Family Welfare Dr Mansukh Mandavia on February 26, 2022.
- India was removed from the list of polio-endemic countries in 2012 and in 2013 the entire Southeast Asia Region was declared Polio free.
- The last case of wild poliovirus reported in India was on 13th January 2011.



9. India's overall ranking on IP protection improves



- India has improved its overall IP score from 38.4 per cent to 38.6 percent, and the country is ranked 43 out of 55 countries on the International Intellectual Property Index 2022.
- This index was released by the Global Innovation Policy Center of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.
- In July 2021, the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Commerce released a Review of the Intellectual Property Rights Regime in India.

- This review is a welcome development and offers a comprehensive and detailed study of the strengths and weaknesses of India's national IP environment.

International News

1. UKRAINIAN PRESIDENT SIGNS FORMAL REQUEST TO JOIN EUROPEAN UNION



- Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskiy has said that he has signed an official request for Ukraine to join the European Union.
- Zelenskiy has asked the European Union to allow Ukraine to gain membership immediately under a special procedure as it defends itself from invasion by Russian forces.

2. FIFA AND UEFA SUSPEND RUSSIA FROM ALL COMPETITIONS UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

- FIFA and UEFA have suspended Russian national teams and clubs from all international soccer competitions until further notice.
- The suspension, which comes after Russia's invasion of Ukraine, will likely leave the Russian team out of the upcoming World Cup in Qatar.

- FIFA oversees soccer worldwide while UEFA, one of six continental organizations, governs the sport in Europe.
- UEFA also announced it ended its partnership with Gazprom, a Russian majority state-owned energy company that is one of UEFA's main sponsors.
- "The decision is effective immediately and covers all existing agreements including the UEFA



3. India bids to host 44th Chess Olympiad after FIDE cancels events in Russia



- India bids to host the 44th edition of the Chess Olympiad later this year after the event was moved out of Russia's capital Moscow.
- It was supposed to take place in Russia which got canceled due to war.
- All India Chess Federation Secretary Bharat Singh Chauhan disclosed this to ANI.

- If India gets the approval to host the 44th Chess Olympiad then it would be the second major world event to be held in the country after the World Championship match in 2013 between Viswanathan Anand and Magnus Carlsen in Chennai.
- The Chess Olympiad 2022 was supposed to take place from July 26th July to 8th August.
- The International Chess Federation FIDE took the Chess Olympiad and all other official competitions away from Russia.

National News

4. SMRITI IRANI LAUNCHES NEW MOTTO OF NATIONAL COMMISSION FOR PROTECTION OF CHILD RIGHTS



- Women and Child Development Minister Smriti Irani today launched the new motto of National Commission for Protection of Child Rights, NCPCR on its 17th foundation day at Red Fort, New Delhi.
- On the occasion, Mrs. Irani interacted with children from different states and answered their questions.
- Mrs. Irani said that these children are the future of the country and new India will definitely be made by them.
- Mrs. Irani visited the exhibition based on freedom fighters' stories organised by Border Security Forces, BSF in collaboration with NCPCR and remembered their sacrifices.
- She said that her ministry will expand this exhibition in all states.

5. DELHI CABINET APPROVED INDIA'S FIRST' E-WASTE ECO-PARK

- The Delhi Cabinet has approved setting up India's first of its kind electronic-waste eco-park. It has also agreed to devise 'Delhi Film Policy 2022', as a thrust to promote tourism.
- The electronic waste eco-friendly park is to be built on 20 acres of land in Delhi. Nearly, 2 lakh tonnes of e-waste are thrown by Delhi every year.
- This eco-park will recycle, refurbish and dismantle e-waste in a scientific and safe way.

- This eco-park will act as an Integrated Facility, by engaging in dismantling, segregating, refurbishing, material-wise storage, testing and plastic recycling.
- It will also have precious metal extraction facilities, especially from Printed Circuit Boards (PCBs) through high-end technologies.
- The Delhi Film Policy 2022 is to promote tourism in Delhi, making the National Capital- a Brand. It will also make it a hub for modern film-making, meeting European Standards.

6. SAMIRAN GUPTA TO HEAD PUBLIC POLICY FOR TWITTER IN INDIA



- Samiran Gupta will lead microblogging platform Twitter's public policy and philanthropy efforts in India and South Asia.
- Prior to joining Twitter, Gupta was the head of stakeholder engagement in South Asia for ICANN (Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers).
- Gupta was associated with The Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN), a non-profit organisation. He served there for seven years.
- He was also briefly the firm's head of stakeholder engagement for the South Asia market.
- The news of the appointment comes almost a year after the former Public Policy Director for India and South Asia Mahima Kaul resigned.

7. Pooja Jatyan Wins Silver At Para Archery World Championships; Ministers Laud Historic Feat



- Para-archer, Pooja Jatyan has scripted history as she became the first Indian to win a silver in an individual section of the Para World Championships in Dubai, UAE.
- She lost to Italy's Patrilli Vincenza in the final to be content with the silver medal. India ended its campaign with two silver medals, a first for the country.
- India has won 2 Silver medals for the first time in the Para Archery World Championship.
- The compound mixed pair of Shyam Sundar Swamyand Jyoti Baliyan had earlier opened India's account by winning a silver medal.

1. Union Minister Smriti Irani launches 'Stree Manoraksha Project'



- Women and Child Development Minister has assured that One Stop Centre will not be closed in the country.

- She stressed that process of empowerment must be started from childhood.
- She added that Stree Manoraksha Project is a life skill to provide help to women who are facing atrocities.

2. CCI to hold 7th National Conference on Economics of Competition Law on 4th March



- Competition Commission of India will hold the 7th National Conference on Economics of Competition Law on 4th March in virtual mode.
- CCI has been organizing the conference every year since 2016. Neelkanth Mishra, who is a Member of, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister will deliver the keynote address in the inaugural session.
- The Plenary at this year's conference is on the topic 'Reforms and Deepening of Markets'.
- The Conference is an endeavour to develop and sustain interest in the Economics of Competition Law and create a critical mass of antitrust economists.

3. GOVT INVITES APPLICATIONS FOR NATIONAL STARTUP AWARDS 2022



- Government has invited applications for National Startup Awards 2022 across 17 sectors and 7 special categories. Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade has launched the third edition of the National Startup Awards.
- In line with Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, the Awards will acknowledge startups and enablers who have been instrumental in revolutionising the development story of India.
- The 17 sectors include Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Construction, Drinking Water, Education and Skill Development, Energy, Enterprise Technology, Environment, and FinTech.
- A cash prize of 15 lakh rupees each will be awarded to one winning incubator and one winning accelerator.
- The applications for the National Startup Awards 2022 are open till 15th March.
- A cash prize of 5 lakh rupees will be awarded to each winning startup.

4. President Ram Nath Kovind inaugurates 'Arogya Vanam' at Rashtrapati Bhavan

- President Ram Nath Kovind today inaugurated a hub of medicinal herbs and plants 'Arogya Vanam' at Rashtrapati Bhavan in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and First Lady Savita Kovind.
- The Arogya Vanam has been developed in a 6.6 acre area and it has 215 types of medicinal plants like Neem, Tulsi, Bel, Arand, Arjun, Ashwagandha and Harsingar.

• Aroma Garden, Lotus Pond, Water Channels, Yog Manch and a ViewPoint are also part of Arogya Vanam.



5. Now Chennai's street animals get an ambulance of their own



- India's first ambulance for street animals has been started by the Blue Cross of India in collaboration with the international animal welfare organization "Four Paw". Madras High Court Justice Dr Anitha Sumanth launched the ambulance.
- The Stray Animal Care programme will be a "hospital on wheels" with an onboard veterinarian to provide on-site treatment to injured and sick street animals.
- Apart from the veterinarian, the animal ambulance will also include a para veterinary-worker-cumdriver. The ambulance will include a treatment table, two fans, an inverter, a fridge, and drawers for sterile products and bandages.

6. International Women's Day Week begins



- The Women and Child Development Ministry will celebrate the International Women's Day week from today as an Iconic Week as a part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav.
- As a part of the week-long celebration, the Ministry will organize various events and social media campaigns covering a variety of themes related to women's safety and empowerment.
- It will mark an occasion to celebrate the progress made towards achieving gender equity and women's empowerment but also to critically reflect on accomplishments and strive for a greater momentum towards gender equality.
- It will kick off tomorrow in collaboration with the Bureau of Police Research and Development to raise awareness on safety and security of women.
- On this day, the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights will also celebrate its Foundation Day.
- The focus of this event will be children, wherein an exhibition by children will be on display and children will be taken on guided tour of the Red Fort.
- The Ministry will launch the Street Manoraksha Project in collaboration with NIMHANS Bengaluru.
- On 3rd March 2022, the theme for the celebration is 'Women of Tomorrow'

7. ICC Women's Cricket World Cup 2022 to begin from 4th March in New Zealand



- The 12th ICC Women's Cricket World Cup is all set to begin from Friday, 4th March in New Zealand.
- The opening match will be played between the hosts and the West Indies at the Bay Oval in Tauranga.
- Eight countries will battle it out in 31 matches over 31 days at six cities of the island nation.
- The cities of Auckland, Christchurch, Dunedin, Hamilton, Tauranga, and Wellington will be hosting the matches across six different venues.
- The Teams participating are Australia, Bangladesh, England, India, New Zealand, Pakistan, South Africa, and West Indies.

8. Saurabh Chaudhary clinches India's first gold at ISSF World Cup in Cairo

- Saurabh Chaudhary clinched India's first gold medal at the ongoing International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) World Cup in Cairo, Egypt on Tuesday.
- The 19-year-old Indian defeated Michael Schwald of Germany 16-6 in the gold medal match of the Men's 10m Air Pistol event.
- Russian Artem Chernousov grabbed a bronze medal.
- India's Shreya Agrawal narrowly missed out on a place in the semi-finals of the World Cup's 10m air rifle event. Shreya shot a total of 629.3, which was 0.1 less than eighth semi-finalist Eszter Meszaros of Hungary.



9. US, EU, UK AGREE TO REMOVE SELECTED RUSSIAN BANKS FROM SWIFT



- The United States, European Union and United Kingdom on Saturday agreed to block "selected' Russian banks from the SWIFT global financial messaging system and to impose "restrictive measures" on its central bank in retaliation for its invasion of Ukraine.
- SWIFT stands for Society for Worldwide Interbank Financial Telecommunications and is an independent enterprise, which is based in Belgium.
- SWIFT serves as an internal communication mechanism between around 11,000 banks and financial institutions for more than 200 countries and territories.

1. MADHABI PURI BUCH TAKES CHARGE AS FIRST WOMAN CHAIRPERSON OF SEBI



- Ms. Madhabi Puri Buch on Wednesday took charge as the first woman Chairperson of the Securities and Exchange Board of India.
- She succeeds Mr. Ajay Tyagi, whose five year term ended on 28th February 2022.
- With over three decades of experience, Ms. Buch has served as SEBI's Whole Time Member, handling departments related to regulation, surveillance, investment management besides investor assistance and education.
- The 57 year old has also served as the Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer at ICICI Securities Limited and has worked with the New Development Bank in Shanghai and as the Head of a Private Equity Firm's Singapore office.
- A graduate in Mathematics from St. Stephen's College, New Delhi, Ms. Buch also holds a MBA from IIM-Ahmedabad. She has been given a three-year tenure as SEBI Chief.

2. AKSHAYE WIDHANI NAMED CEO OF YASH RAJ FILMS

- Film production and distribution company Yash Raj Films (YRF) has named Akshaye Widhani as chief executive officer.
- Widhani was serving as senior vice-president, finance and business Affairs and head of operations at YRF Studios.
- He used to head corporate and business development activities for YRF, including finance, business extensions, strategic alliances, joint ventures, co-productions.
- Widhani joined YRF 17 years ago, has been responsible for setting up and running several business verticals for the company.
- His first stint was as studio manager, in charge of setting up operations for YRF Studios in 2005.
- Yash Raj Films is one of India's biggest film production houses.

• Aditya Chopra is the Chairman and MD of Yash Raj Films. Yash Raj Films was founded by Yash Raj Chopra, in the year 1970.




3. Ashneer Grover resigns as BharatPe MD



- Ashneer Grover, who had lost an arbitration that he filed against BharatPe, on March 1 resigned from the fintech firm as managing director of the company.
- Grover had filed an arbitration with the Singapore International Arbitration Centre challenging BharatPe's decision to conduct a governance review.
- Ashneer Grover, who owns a 9.5% stake worth Rs 1915 crore in BharatPe, will continue as the single largest individual shareholder of the company.

4. Anup Jalota released book "Udaan Ek Majdoor Bachhe Ki" authored by Mithilesh Tiwari





- In 2021, WHO launched the World report on hearing that highlighted the increasing number of people living with and at risk of hearing loss.
- The World Hearing Day 2022 with the theme "To hear for life, listen with care" will focus on the importance and means of hearing loss prevention through safe listening.


8. NASA LAUNCHES LATEST GENERATION SATELLITE TO TRACK HAZARDOUS WEATHER



- US space agency, NASA, successfully launched the third in a series of four next-generation weather satellites, Geostationary Operational Environmental Satellite (GOES), from Cape Canaveral Space Force Station, Florida.
- The satellite is named as GOES-T. Once the satellite gets positioned in its geostationary orbit it will be renamed from GOES-T to GOES-18.
- GOES-T will be used by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) to forecast weather and hazardous environmental conditions in the Western Hemisphere.

9. NITI AAYOG DEVELOPING NATIONAL GENDER INDEX



- NITI Aayog is in the process to develop a National Gender Index.
- The objective of the National Gender Index is to measure the progress and identify the persisting gaps in gender equality to make informed policy decisions.
- It will serve as a tool to map the progress of India's States and UTs on defined gender metrics and build the foundation for positive change.
- The information was released in the Annual Report 2021-22 of NITI Aayog.

10. 148 AIRCRAFT TO DISPLAY IAF POWER AT VAYU SHAKTI IN POKHRAN RAJASTHAN

- Indian Air Force (IAF) will conduct the Exercise Vayu Shakti that will take place at Pokharan range in Jaisalmer, Rajasthan on March 7.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi will be the Chief Guest of this event. A total of 148 aircraft of the Indian Air Force (IAF) will participate in this exercise.
- Rafale aircraft will participate for the first time in this exercise. Exercise Vayu Shakti is organised by Indian Air Force once in every three years.
- The last Vayu Shakti Exercise took place in 2019.


1. Ujjain sets Guinness record by lighting over 11.7 lakh oil lamps on Mahashivratri



- Ujjain in Madhya Pradesh has created a Guinness record by lighting 11.71 lakh clay lamps (diyas) in 10 minutes.
- The diyas were lighted as part of the 'Shiv Jyoti Arpanam Mahotsava' on the occasion of Mahashivratri.

- With this they broke the earlier record of lighting 9.41 lakh diyas created in Ayodhya, Uttar Pradesh on 03 November 2021. Ujjain is also known as the 'Land of Mahakal'.
- The certificate was received by Madhya Pradesh chief minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan.
- It was a zero-waste programme. The clay from the lamps will be used to prepare idols, while the oil left in the lamps will be offered to gaushalas.
- The plastic used for the I-cards will be used to make chairs and other items for public gardens.

2. BIODEGRADABLE NANOPARTICLE DEVELOPED BY IIT KANPUR



- Researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kanpur have created a biodegradable nanoparticle
 that can be used as an alternative to chemical-based insecticides to protect crops from bacterial and
 fungal illnesses.
- Abhay Karandikar, who is the director of IIT Kanpur said that because farmers suffer a variety of issues, IIT Kanpur has worked tirelessly to improve the farming environment as a whole.
- Nanoparticles would reduce the risk of crop infection while also increasing agricultural productivity.
- IIT Kanpur has devised a number of ways to increase agricultural output and address many of the issues that plague Indian agriculture.
- In December 2021, the institute released Bhu Parikshak, a soil testing equipment that can detect soil health in 90 seconds.
- It was created to address the issue of time spent having solid health examined in labs.
- In most cases, farmers must wait days for lab results.

3. Tata Motors Launches 'Anubhav', showroom on wheels to tap rural markets



- Tata Motors has launched a mobile showroom (showroom on wheels) named 'Anubhav,' to target rural customers by increasing their reach in rural areas and providing them with a doorstep car buying experience.

- These mobile showrooms will be operated by dealerships under Tata Motors' supervision and guidance.
- All the dealerships will define monthly routes for these vans on which they will ply and cover the targeted village or tehsil.
- A total of 103 mobile showrooms are being deployed across the country to enhance the Tata Motors brand awareness in rural India.
- These mobile showrooms will help existing dealerships offer a doorstep sales experience to customers and assist them with information about Tata Motors' products.
- These products include a new forever range of cars and SUVs, accessories, avail finance schemes, book a test drive and evaluate existing cars for exchange.

4. AFSPA extended in Assam for 6 more months with effect from Feb 28

- The Assam government has extended the contentious Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, 1958 (AFSPA) in the state for six more months.
- The notification came into effect from February 28. Initially, it was the Assam Disturbed Area Act of 1955 during the agitation by Nagas in undivided Assam.
- This Act gave freehand to some extent to the Army that was repealed with the incorporation of the Armed Forces (Special Power) Act, 1958.
- AFSPA was imposed in Assam in November 1990 and has been extended every six months since then after a review by the government.
- AFSPA, which gives sweeping powers to the security forces to maintain public order in 'disturbed areas', has been a contentious issue in the north-east states.

• Civil society members and activists have claimed that AFSPA gives security personnel a free hand to carry out excesses.



5. Adani Green Energy's subsidiary receives LoA to set up 150 MW solar power project



- Adani Green Energy Ltd stated that its subsidiary Adani Renewable Energy Holding Fifteen Limited has obtained a letter of award (LOA) to build a 150-megawatt solar power plant. For a period of 25 years, the fixed rate for this project capacity is \$2.34/kWh.
- According to a statement issued by the Adani Group company said in a stock exchange filing, Adani

Renewable Energy Holding Fifteen Limited, a Wholly-owned Subsidiary of Adani Green Energy Limited, participated in a Tender which was issued by the Punjab State Power Corporation Limited for the acquisition of 250 MW Solar Power from ground-mounted grid-connected solar PV power plants and has received the Letter of Award for setting up a 150 MW Solar Power Project.

- Adani Green presently has a totally renewable energy project portfolio of 20.434 MWac capacity, with 5.410 MWac of operational projects.
- According to the firm, 11,591 MWac projects are now under construction, with 3.433 MWac projects nearing completion.

6. ISSF World Cup: Shri Nivetha, Esha, Ruchita win gold in women's 10m air pistol



- India's Shri Nivetha, Esha Singh, and Ruchita Vinerkar have won the gold medal in the women's 10m air pistol team event of the ISSF World Cup in Cairo, Egypt.



- It will be organised in other districts of Gujarat and other State/UTs in subsequent phases.



- The nation and the Indian Army will always be indebted to his invaluable contribution and service to the nation.





- SLINEX aims to enhance inter-operability, improve mutual understanding and exchange best practices and procedures for multi-faceted maritime operations between both navies.
- The Harbour Phase would include professional, cultural, sporting and social exchanges.

3. Country's first indigenous Flying Trainer HANSA-NG successfully completes sea level trials

- The country's first indigenous Flying Trainer HANSA-NG designed and developed by CSIR-National Aerospace Laboratories, Bangalore, has successfully completed the sea level trials at Puducherry from 19th February to 5th March.
- The aircraft was flown to Puducherry covering 140 nautical miles in one and half hours at a cruising speed of 155 km per hour on 19th February.
- AIR Correspondent reports, The objectives of sea level trials were to evaluate handling qualities, climb and cruise performance, balked landing, structural performance power plant and other systems performance.

• CSIR-NAL sources said that all the objectives of the sea level trials are met and aircraft has been ferried back to Bangalore yesterday after completing 18 hours flying at Puducherry.



4. Indigenous anti-collision system 'Kavach' to avoid rail accidents successfully tested by Indian Railways



Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw has announced that 'Kavach' System, the anti-collision test
conducted by the Indian Railways to check the indigenous developed system to avoid rail accidents is
successful.

- He held an on-site inspection today near Secunderabad.
- The indigenously developed Automatic Train Protection (ATP) system, Kavach, was designed to help the Railways achieve zero accidents.
- 'Kavach' automatically stopped the train before 380 metres of other Locomotive at the front.
- The test involved two trains one with the railway minister on board and the other with the Chairman of the Railway Board hurtle towards each other at full speed.
- Both the trains stopped 380 metres apart. The Kavach will be the world's cheapest automatic train collision protection system.

5. PM Narendra Modi inaugurates Pune Metro Rail Project



- The Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi has inaugurated Pune Metro Rail Project on March 06, 2022, and also interacted with differently-abled, visually impaired students present inside the metro coach, during his 10-minute ride in the Pune Metro.
- Pune Metro Rail Project has been built at a total cost of INR 11,420 Crore. It has a total length of 33.2 km and 30 stations.
- Pune Metro is the first metro project in the country to have Aluminum body coaches, indigenously manufactured under the Make in India policy of GoI.

6. Indian Navy successfully demonstrates accuracy of Brahmos supersonic cruise missile from stealth destroyer INS Chennai

- Indian Navy successfully demonstrated the accuracy of an extended-range land-attack Brahmos supersonic cruise missile from the stealth destroyer INS Chennai yesterday.
- The missile hit its intended target with pinpoint accuracy after traversing an extended range trajectory and performing complex manoeuvres.
- This achievement establishes the Indian Navy's ability to strike even deeper and influence land operations further away from sea, when and where required.

- This year, Germany is the rotating president of the Group of Seven advanced economies.





- To begin with, the first event under this celebration has been organized in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh at Rani Kamlapati Railway Station, on March 08, 2022, which also marks International Women's Day.
- Jharokha is a PAN India programme that will be held at 16 locations in 13 states and UTs, as part of the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsay.
- The event in Bhopal will celebrate womanhood and the contribution of women in the field of art, craft and culture.
- Kamlapati Railway Station is named after the brave and fearless Queen Kamlapati of the Gond kingdom of Madhya Pradesh.

4. C-DAC INSTALLED "PARAM GANGA" SUPERCOMPUTER AT IIT ROORKEE



- The Center for Development of Advanced Computing (C-DAC) has designed and installed a supercomputer named "PARAM Ganga", at IIT Roorkee, under Phase II of National Supercomputing Mission (NSM).
- PARAM Ganga has a supercomputing capacity of 1.66 Petaflops.
- NSM is a joint initiative of the Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeiTY) and the Department of Science and Technology (DST).
- The mission is implemented by the Center for Development of Advanced Computing (C-DAC) and the Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bangalore.
- The NSM Mission aims to build and deploy 24 facilities with cumulative compute power of more than 64 Petaflops.
- Till date 11 systems have been deployed by C-DAC at IISc, IITs, IISER Pune, JNCASR, NABI-Mohali and C-DAC under NSM Phase-1 and Phase-2 with a cumulative computing power of more than 20 Petaflops.

International News

5. Iran successfully test fire second military satellite Noor-2




- Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) successfully launched a military satellite, Noor-2, into orbit at an altitude of 500 kilometres (311 miles) from the earth.
- This is the second military satellite launched by the Islamic Republic.
- The first military satellite, Noor, was launched in April 2020 at an orbit of 425km (265 miles) above the earth's surface. Noor means light in the Persian language.
- Putting the second satellite in space would be a major advance for Iran's military, raising concerns about the country's nuclear and missile programs.
- The three-stage Qased, or "Messenger", the carrier launched the Noor 2, from the Shahroud spaceport.

6. Russia becomes world's most sanctioned country

- Russia has become the most sanctioned country in the world, due to its invasion on Ukraine, according to a New York-based sanctions watchlist site Castellum.AI.
- Russia faced 2,778 new sanctions since February 22, 2022, led by the US and European nations, bringing the total sanctions to 5,530.
- The country already had 2,754 sanctions in place before February 22.
- Countries across the world are putting sanctions on Russia to stop its invasion of Ukraine.
- Russia has now surpassed countries like Iran and North Korea in terms of a number of sanctions.
- Before this, Iran was the most sanctioned country, facing 3,616 sanctions against it over the last decade, while Syria and North Korea have 2,608 and 2,077 sanctions, respectively.

7. T Raja Kumar named President of the Financial Action Task Force



- T Raja Kumar, a Singaporean, has been named president of the Financial Action Task Force (FATF), the world's anti-money laundering and anti-terrorism financing agency.
- His appointment is for a set two-year term, which begins on July 1. During the FATF plenary, he was chosen to succeed Dr Marcus Pleyer of Germany.
- Mr Raja's nomination marks the first time Singapore has assumed the president of the organisation, according to a joint news release issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), the Ministry of Finance (MOF), and the Monetary Authority of Singapore (MAS) on March 7.

- Mr Raja is a senior advisor at MHA and has been the leader of Singapore's FATF mission since January 1, 2015. Since July 2018, he has also been a member of the steering group, which advises the FATF president.
- The FATF is an intergovernmental organisation set up by the G7 in 1989 to prevent and combat money laundering, terrorism, and proliferation finance.

8. PAKISTAN SHOULD CONTINUE TO BE PLACED IN FATF GREY LIST, SAYS REPORT



- The global money laundering and terrorist financing watchdog, Financial Action Task Force (FATF), retained Pakistan in the grey list and asked the country to work on money laundering investigations and prosecutions.
- FATF also added the United Arab Emirates (UAE) to its grey watchlist.
- The decision has been taken after the conclusion of the four-day FATF Plenary from March 1-4, 2022. The event took place in hybrid mode from Paris, France.
- Pakistan has been on the grey list of FATF since June 2018 for failing to check money laundering and terror financing. It was given a plan of action to complete it by October 2019 but it fails to comply with the FATF mandates.

9. DELHI HC CHIEF JUSTICE DN PATEL NEXT TDSAT CHAIRPERSON

- The Central Government has appointed Justice Dhirubhai Naranbhai Patel, Chief Justice of Delhi High Court, as the Chairperson of Telecom Disputes Settlement and Appellate Tribunal (TDSAT).
- He was appointed as Chief Justice of Delhi High Court on June 7, 2019, and is now given the Chair of TDSAT, days before his retirement on March 12, 2022.
- Ministry of Law and Justice issued a notification regarding the approval of his appointment by the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC), stating that he will serve the Chair for a period of

- 4 years from the date of assumption of charge of the post, or till attaining the age of 70 years, or until further orders, whichever is the earliest.
- The conditions of his service will be governed by the provisions of the Tribunals Reforms Act, 2021 and the Tribunal (Conditions of Service) Rules, 2021.

1. SIKKIM: ALL NON-WORKING MOTHERS TO GET RS 20,000 EACH



- Chief Minister of Sikkim, Prem Singh Tamang has announced that the State Government will soon implement 'Aama Yojana, a scheme for helping non-working mothers & 'Bahini Scheme' benefitting girl students of the state.
- Aama Yojna scheme aims to inculcate the habit of saving among non-working mothers in the state and hence the Government will provide them Rs. 20,000 each in their bank accounts annually.
- The scheme covers only those whose names are enrolled in the electoral roll of the state and a sum of Rs. 100 crores have been allocated for it in the budget.
- Bahini Scheme is to reduce the dropout rate of girl students due to the lack of accessibility/availability of Sanitary Napkins & also to ensure menstrual health and hygiene.
- Under this scheme, over 18,000 girl students who study in class 9 and above are provided with free sanitary napkins in the state.


2. Chhattisgarh govt launches 'Kaushalya Matritva Yojana'

• In a state-level women's conference held at BTI Ground in Raipur, Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel introduced the 'Kaushalya Matritva Yojana' by handing out Rs 5000 checks to five beneficiaries for safe motherhood.

- Haryana government has announced Matrushakti Udaymita Scheme to provide support to women entrepreneurs, on International Women's Day.
- Under the scheme, the women whose family annual income is less than 5 lakh rupees based on Parivar Pehchan Patra (PPP) verified data, will be provided access to soft loans by financial institutions to the extent of 3 lakh rupees.
- Subsequently, the interest subvention of 7% will also be provided for three years through the Haryana Women Development Corporation.

4. BODH GAYA TO HAVE INDIA'S LARGEST RECLINING STATUE OF LORD BUDDHA



- India's largest reclining statue of Lord Buddha is being built in Bodh Gaya. Built by Buddha International Welfare Mission, the statue will be 100 feet long and 30 feet high.
- Lord Buddha is in the sleeping posture in the statue. The construction of the giant statue started in the year 2019.
- It is being made with fiberglass and built by sculptors from Kolkata.
- Bodh Gaya is an important pilgrimage center for Buddhism and is visited by devotees from all over the world.
- The idol of this posture of Lord Buddha is in Uttar Pradesh's Kushinagar where he attained his Mahaparinirvana.
- The giant statue of Lord Buddha will be open for devotees from February 2023.

5. Indian GM S L Narayanan wins Cattolica International Open chess tourney

- In Chess, Indian Grandmaster, S L Narayanan was declared the winner in the Grand Scacchi Cattolica International Open, held in Italy. Meanwhile, his compatriot R Praggnanandhaa came second.

1. ISSF WC 2022: India top medal tally with 4 gold, 2 silver, one bronze in Cairo

- India have taken first place in the medal standing in International Shooting Sport Federation, ISSF World Cup 2022 in Cairo.
- The Indian team finished on the top of the medals tally with a total of seven medals comprising of four gold, two silver and one bronze.

- Norway, who won six medals- three gold, one silver and two bronze claimed second spot on the medals tally. France were third, with three golds out of the 20 on offer.
- Indian shooters won two medals on the final day of the ISSF World Cup 2022 in Cairo, Egypt on Monday.
- In the last event of the tournament, Rhythm Sangwan and Anish Bhanwala won the 25m rapid fire pistol mixed team gold medal match against Thailand by defeating them 17-7.
- Earlier in the day, the Indian trio of Gurpreet Singh, Anish Bhanwala and Bhavesh Shekhawat lost the gold medal match of the men's 25m rapid fire pistol team competition to Germany 7-17.

2. NATIONAL LAND MONETIZATION CORPORATION: CABINET CLEARS AGENCY TO MONETISE GOVT LAND



- The Union Cabinet on Wednesday approved the setting up of the National Land Monetization Corporation (NLMC) to monetise surplus land and building assets of Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) and other agencies linked to the Government.
- To be fully owned by the Center, under the administrative jurisdiction of the Finance Ministry, NLMC will have an initial authorized share capital of Rs 5,000 crore and paid-up share capital of Rs 150 crore.
- "With monetisation of non-core assets, the Government would be able to generate substantial revenues by monetising unused and under-used assets.
- CPSEs currently have a large amount of surplus, idle, and underutilised non-core assets in the form of land and buildings.
- The monetization of excess land and side assets is critical for CPSEs experiencing strategic disinvestment so that their value can be unleashed. Monetization of the assets will be taken care of and carried out by NLMC.
- This will also allow for the productive use of underutilised assets, resulting in private sector investments, new economic activity, a boost to the local economy, and thegeneration of financial resources for economic and social infrastructure.
- On behalf of CPSEs and other government organisations, NLMC will have the technical expertise to competently manage and monetize land holdings.

3. K'TAKA GOVT LAUNCHES WOMEN @ WORK PROGRAM



- The government of Karnataka has launched 'Women@Work' program to provide five lakh jobs within 2026 to women with necessary employable skills.
- The program aims to focus on the efforts of corporate programs on attracting a female workforce.
- It has been developed by Karnataka Digital Economy Mission (KDEM) in association with KTECH, Karnataka Skill Development Corporation.
- It will act as an enabler for women to actively participate and join the workforce through industry upskilling.
- All efforts are being made to provide 5,000 jobs for women as part of the Karnataka Digital Economy Mission and added that the government is keen to actualise this mission in the coming days.

4. GOVT APPOINTS SBI MANAGING DIRECTOR ASHWINI BHATIA AS SEBI MEMBER



- The cabinet has appointed Ashwani Bhatia, managing director (MD) of the State Bank of India (SBI), as a whole-time member (WTM) of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI).
- According to some sources, the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) has also approved Ashwani Bhatia's appointment as a whole-time member of SEBI for three years from the date of his assumption of the command.
- According to the sources, with Ashwani Bhatia's appointment as a Whole-time member, the Securities and Exchange Board of India now only needs to appoint one Whole time member.
- In August 2020, Ashwani Bhatia, who will be retiring in May 2022, that is this year, was promoted to the post of managing director of State Bank of India.

5. Union Minister RK Singh Launches Virtual Smart Grid Knowledge Center and Innovation Park



- Union Minister for Power R.K. Singh on Tuesday launched the Virtual Smart Grid Knowledge Center (SGKC) and Innovation Park virtually as part of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav Programme.
- Minister of State for Power Krishan Pal Gurjar was also present on the occasion.
- The SGKC has been established by POWERGRID for demonstration and advancement of frontier smart grid technologies.
- SGKC aims to be one of the leading Centers of Excellence globally to foster innovation, entrepreneurship and research in smart grid technologies and create capacities in the power distribution sector.
- The Virtual SGKC that was launched today enables a digital footprint of the physical setup of SGKC, the need for which was felt during COVID-19 pandemic.

6. Sports Minister Anurag Thakur to inaugurate National Youth Parliament Festival



- The 3rd edition of the National Youth Parliament Festival (NYPF) has been organised jointly by the Lok Sabha Secretariat and the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports on March 10 and 11, 2022, in the Central Hall of Parliament, New Delhi.
- Union Sports Minister Anurag Thakur will address the inaugural session of NYPF on March 10, while the Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla will address the valedictory function on March 11.
- The objective of the NYPF is to hear the voice of the youth, between 18 and less than 25 years of age, who will join various careers in the coming years, including public services.
- The top three National level youth winners will get an opportunity to speak before the Lok Sabha Speaker during the valedictory function.

7. KOREA'S NEW PRESIDENT YOON SUK-YEOL



- Yoon Suk-yeol has been declared as the winner of the 2022 South Korean presidential election to be elected as the new President of the country.
- He is scheduled to assume office as president on May 10, 2022, for a fixed term of five years. Yoon Sukyeol will succeed incumbent President Moon Jae-in.
- With more than 98 per cent of the ballots counted, Yoon had 48.6 per cent of the votes against his rival Lee Jae-Myung's 47.8 per cent.
- Yoon is to take office in May and serve a single five-year term as leader of the world's 10th-largest economy.

8. Andhra Pradesh retains top rank in Skoch State of Governance ranking in 2021



- Andhra Pradesh has retained its number one spot in the SKOCH State of Governance rankings for the second consecutive year.
- According to a release, the State retained the first rank for the second consecutive year.
- In 2020 too, Andhra Pradesh bagged top rank in governance. Andhra Pradesh was ranked at second position in 2018 and later it slipped to 4th position in 2019, according to Skoch.
- The second rank was bagged by West Bengal and Odisha was ranked 3, Gujarat was ranked 4 and Maharashtra was ranked 5. Neighbouring Telangana was ranked 6.

9. S Sreesanth announces retirement from all forms of first-class cricket

- India pacer S Sreesanth has announced his retirement from all forms of domestic cricket. Sreesanth played 27 Tests and 53 ODIs for India, taking 87 and 75 wickets respectively.
- He has also taken seven wickets in 10 T20 Internationals.
- The temperamental pacer was also popular for his exuberant celebrations after taking wickets but his life and career went downhill after the spot-fixing scandal.



10. STALIN OPENS FLOATING SOLAR PARK IN TUTICORIN



- Tamil Nadu Chief Minister, M K Stalin has inaugurated India's largest floating solar power plant constructed at a cost of Rs 150.4 crores.
- The floating plant is established in Southern Petrochemicals Industries Corporation Limited (SPIC) factory at Thoothukudi in Tamil Nadu to provide clean energy.

- It aims to provide environmentally sustainable power generation and to reduce carbon footprint.
- The floating power plant has the capacity to produce 42 million units of electricity per annum.
- The solar power plant is owned by Greenam Energy, a wholly-owned subsidiary of AM International. SPIC worked with France-based floating solar power specialists and global leader Ceil & Terre for the constructions and designs.

2. Debasish Panda appointed as IRDAI Chairperson

- Panda, a 1987-batch IAS officer of the Uttar Pradesh cadre, retired as financial services secretary in January this year after a two-year stint.

- The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has approved Panda's appointment as chairperson of the insurance regulator initially for a period of three years from the assumption of charge.
- The appointment of IRDAI chairman comes nearly 9 months after the vacancy was created following Subhash Chandra Khuntia completing his term in May last year.

3. RBI directs Paytm Payments Bank to stop onboarding of new customers



- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has directed Paytm Payments Bank Ltd to stop the onboarding of new customers with immediate effect.
- The bank has also been directed to appoint an IT audit firm to conduct a comprehensive System Audit of its IT system.
- The RBI took the decision in exercise of its powers under section 35A of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.
- RBI has advised Paytm Payments Bank to appoint an IT audit firm to conduct a comprehensive System Audit of its IT system.
- Once the audit is over, RBI will review the reports of IT auditors and based on the reports grant or review its permission for onboarding of new customers.

4. First Drone School established in Madhya Pradesh's Gwalior

- With the aim to create an ecosystem for drone operations in the country, Union Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia along with Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan inaugurated the first drone school in Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh.
- The Chief Minister said that drone technology opens huge technology opportunities for youngsters.
- He further stated that this drone school is the first drone school in the state and will prove to open employment opportunities in this industry as drones can be used for various purposes.
- The first drone fair in the country was organized last year in the month of December in Gwalior city of Madhya Pradesh that witnessed the biggest congregation of drone manufacturers, service providers, drone enthusiasts and user communities, especially students, farmers and common man of the city. During the event, Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia stated that five Drone Schools will be

- opened in different cities of Madhya Pradesh including Gwalior, Bhopal, Indore, Jabalpur and Satna.
- The inauguration of the first drone school in Gwalior is a step towards making advancements in the use of drone technology in Madhya Pradesh.



5. SIX INDIAN AIRPORTS NAMED THE ACI WORLD'S ASQ AWARDS 2021



- From India, six airports have found a place among the 'Best Airport by Size and Region', by the Airports Council International (ACI), in its Airport Service Quality (ASQ) survey for the year 2021.
- The airports have been adjudged among the Asia Pacific region in different categories based on annual passenger traffic.
- The ACI Airport Service Quality (ASQ) Awards takes into account 33 parameters related to passenger amenities to recognize airport excellence in customer experience.

6. SC APPOINTS EX-JUDGE SIKRI AS CHAR DHAM PROJECT PANEL HEAD



- The Supreme Court of India has named Justice (retd) AK Sikri as Chairperson of the High Powered Committee (HPC), of the Chardham project.
- The previous Chairperson Professor Ravi Chopra had resigned from his post in February 2022, after being appointed as the chairperson of the HPC on August 8, 2019.
- A bench of Justices DY Chandrachud and Surya Kant accepted the resignation of Professor Ravi Chopra as chairperson of the committee after he wrote a letter in January wishing to relinquish his post.
- The HPC would look after the environmental concerns and other issues related to the Chardham project as well as the cumulative and independent impact of the Chardham project on the entire Himalayan valley.
- On December 14, last year, the top court had allowed double lane widening of the strategic Chardham highway project in Uttarakhand, observing that the country's security concerns may change over time and the recent past has thrown serious national security challenges.

7. India's first 100% women-owned industrial park begins operations in Hyderabad

- India's first fully owned by women industrial park opened its doors in Hyderabad.
- The park, that is promoted by the FICCI Ladies Organization FLO in collaboration with the State government, consists of 25 units which represent 16 different sectors of green category, and all of them are owned and controlled completely by women.
- This FLO industrial park exemplifies the power and self-reliance of women in the business, from electronics to packaging, medical devices, wellness, engineering, and food processing.
- The FLO members has contributed a substantial amount of money for the construction of the park, while the government has provided the roads, electricity, water, sewerage, and sub-station.


8. TIGER WOODS INDUCTED INTO WORLD GOLF HALL OF FAME



- Famous Golfer, Tiger Woods was formally inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame.

- She was a senior member of the Bharatiya Janata Party, served as India's Minister of External Affairs during the first Narendra Modi government (2014–2019).
- After Indira Gandhi, she was the second woman to occupy this position.

- Pandey, a 1984-batch Maharashtra cadre IAS officer, retired as revenue secretary in February last year.
- The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) has approved the appointment of former revenue secretary ABP Pandey as the chairperson of NFRA for a period of three years from the date of assumption of charge or till the incumbent attains the age of 65 years.

2.First ever GI-tagged Kashmir carpets flagged off to Germany



- The Government of Jammu and Kashmir has launched quick response (QR) code for its GI-tagged Kashmiri carpet, to preserve the authenticity and genuineness of the hand-knotted carpets.
- The main objective of this QR Code attached to the GI tag is to help in reviving the sheen and glory of the Kashmiri carpet industry.
- The QR code will contain relevant information of the artisans, manufacturer, weaver, district, raw material used etc.
- Since the QR code label cannot be copied or misused, it will discourage the counterfeit production of carpets.
- Meanwhile, the first-ever consignment of GI-tagged hand-knotted carpets were exported to Germany from New Delhi on March 11, 2022.

3. Indian Railways' earnings to enhance! First Gati Shakti Cargo Terminal commissioned in Asansol Division

- The Asansol Division of Indian Railways has successfully commissioned private siding of Maithan Power Limited at Thaparnagar, Jharkhand, in accordance with the Prime Minister's vision Gati Shakti and the Ministry of Railways' policy regarding the Gati Shakti Multi-Modal Cargo Terminal or also known as GCT, informed the Ministry of Railways.
- Chairman and CEO of the Railway Board, V K Tripathi, said at the GCT's commissioning that the Maithan Power Project was commenced in the year 2009, and power generation began in the year 2011.
- The coal needed for the power plant was delivered via road, which is estimated to yield 120 inbound coal rakes every month.
- Somewhere between two to four outward rakes of Fly Ash are expected to be handled from the siding area.

- Rashtriya Raksha University (RRU) was set up to meet the need for high quality trained manpower in various wings of policing, criminal justice and correctional administration.

5. Tamilnadu Petroproducts Becomes the World's First LAB Manufacturer Accredited with the BIS Certification

- LAB can be used to make biodegradable detergent, making it a more sustainable option than conventional detergent formulations.

6. Ex student protest leader becomes Chile's youngest president

- Left-leaning former student leader Gabriel Boric vowed to improve the lives of all Chileans and attack deep inequality that has sparked massive protests, hours after being inaugurated Friday as the youngest president in the country's history.
- At 36, Boric was only 4 years old when democracy returned to the South American nation following a 17-year military dictatorship that both bloodied and set the groundwork for modern Chile.
- As a student representative, Boric became one of the leading figures of the 2011–2013 Chilean student protests.
- Boric was twice elected to the Chamber of Deputies representing the Magallanes and Antarctic district, first as an independent candidate in 2013 and then in 2017 as part of the Broad Front, a left-wing coalition he created with several other parties.



environment minister Gopal Rai.




3. Mahanadi Coalfields Limited becomes largest coal producing company in India

- The fund will be backed by the government, private companies, and VCs.
- The lab has technical teams working in collaboration with multiple labs at IISc.
- It will also work with other technical institutes and bodies, including the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kanpur, IIT Jodhpur, the University of Aalto in Finland, Indian Council of Medical Research and the All India Institute of Medical Sciences.

5. India's first 'World Peace Center' will be established in Gurugram



• Ahimsa Vishwa Bharti organisation established by Ambassador of Peace, Eminent Jainacharya Dr Lokeshji will establish India's first World Peace Center in Gurugram, Haryana.

- For this, the Haryana Government has allotted a plot to the organization in Sector 39 of Gurugram opposite Medanta Hospital and adjacent to Delhi-Jaipur Highway.
- 'World Peace Center' will work for the establishment of peace and harmony in the world.
- The Ahimsa Vishwa Bharti had got the plot by depositing the entire amount in the Government treasury, on which the construction work of about 25000 square feet will be completed in two years.
- He expressed his gratitude to the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Haryana, Manohar Lal Khattarji.

6. India's maternal mortality rate dips by 10 points; Kerala, Maharashtra mark sharpest decline

- The day was first observed in the year 1995.



1. ISRO SUCCESSFULLY CONDUCTS GROUND TEST OF SOLID BOOSTER STAGE FOR SSLV



- Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) has successfully completed the ground test of the solid
- fuel-based booster stage (SS1) of its new Small Satellite Launch Vehicle (SSLV) at Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC), Sriharikota at Andhra Pradesh.
- It completes the ground testing of all three stages of the launch vehicle.
- The vehicle is now ready for its first development flight, which is scheduled for May 2022.
- Other stages of SSLV like SS2 & SS3 have successfully undergone necessary ground tests and are ready for integration.
- At present, the launch of small satellites has been dependent on 'piggy-bank' rides with big satellite launches on the PSLV (Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle) of ISRO, which has completed around 50 successful launches

2. MOTOR VESSEL RAM PRASAD BISMIL BECOMES LONGEST VESSEL EVER TO SAIL ON BRAHMAPUTRA RIVER

- The MV Ram Prasad Bismil has become the longest vessel ever to sail from Ganga to the Brahmaputra.
- The 90 meters long and 26 meters wide flotilla, loaded with a draft of 2.1 meters, achieved the feat on March 15, 2022, when it successfully completed the pilot run of heavy cargo movement from Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port in Haldia, to Pandu port in Guwahati.
- The cargo vessel was flagged off from the Haldia Dock in Kolkata along with two barges (DB Kalpana Chawla and DB APJ Abdul Kalam) by Union Minister of Ports, Shipping & Waterways (PSW), Sarbananda Sonowal on February 16, 2022, and docked at Pandu port in Guwahati on March 15, 2022.

• Carrying 1793 metric tonnes of steel rods, the vessel covered the distance from Haldia to Pandu through Bangladesh on the Indo-Bangladesh Protocol Route (IBPR).

- It is located in Mamallapuram, one of the famous tourist sites in India and a UNESCO World Heritage Site of seventh- and eighth-century Hindu monuments.

5. UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY DECLARES MARCH 15 INTERNATIONAL DAY TO COMBAT ISLAMOPHOBIA

- The U.N. General Assembly approved a resolution to proclaim March 15 as the International Day to Combat Islamophobia every year, starting from 2022.
- The resolution, adopted by the 193-member UN General Assembly, was introduced by Pakistan's ambassador Munir Akram on behalf of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), on March 15, 2022.
- It marks the day when a gunman entered two mosques in Christchurch, New Zealand, killing 51 worshippers and wounding 40 others in the terror attack.
- The main objective of International Day to Combat Islamophobia will be curtailing systematic hate speech and discrimination against Muslims; respect for religious symbols and practices; along with the elimination of all forms of intolerance and discrimination based on religion or belief



6. Delhi govt launches 'My EV' portal for purchasing, registering e-autos; buyers to get additional relief



- The Delhi government launched an online portal "My EV" for the purchase and registration of electric autos in the city.
- The government will also provide a 5 percent interest subvention on the purchase of e-autos on loans under the Delhi Electric Vehicle Policy, an official statement said, adding Delhi has now become the first state to provide such a facility.
- CESL has empanelled six Financial Institutions (FIs) Mahindra Finance, Akasa Finance, Mannapuram Finance, RevFin, and Prest Loans to provide loans to EVs at attractive terms.
- The Interest subvention on the purchase of EVs is in addition to the applicable purchase incentive of INR 30,000 and scrapping incentives of up to INR 7,500 under the Delhi EV Policy.
- The consumer will be able to avail of up to INR 25,000 additional benefits.


7. India gets First Digital Water Data Bank to aggregate water resources under a platform

- India, along with its regional allies, submitted a candidacy to host the 36th International Geological Congress in India in 2020 at the 34th International Geological Congress in Brisbane in 2012. The bid was won by India.
- On the occasion of the 36th IGC, three commemorative Postage Stamps will be issued, as well as a First Day Cover.

• India held the 22nd session of the IGC, which was the first IGC on Asian land, 58 years ago.



4. 'Green Triangle' named after Mahatma Gandhi inaugurated in Madagascar's capital



- Mahatma Gandhi Green Triangle' has been unveiled in Madagascar to mark Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav.
- Ambassador of India to Madagascar, Abhay Kumar celebrated the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav by inaugurating a Green Triangle, along with Mayor of Antananarivo Naina Andriantsitohaina.
- The word green in the plaque signifies their commitment to sustainable development and saving the environment.
- The naming of this park as Mahatma Gandhi Green Triangle is an apt tribute to Mahatma Gandhi.
- While addressing the ceremony, the Ambassador of India said that the Government of India has launched an initiative: Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM) to celebrate and commemorate 75 years of progressive India.
- The event was attended by members of local government, diplomatic corps, heads of international organisations, and members of the Indian Diaspora in Madagascar.

5. NCRTC unveils coaches of India's first rapid rail for Delhi-Meerut corridor



- The coaches for the Delhi-Meerut Rapid Rail Corridor were launched by the National Capital Regional Transport Corporation (NCRTC).
- In the following months, deliveries of these semi-high-speed aerodynamic trainsets with dispersed power will begin.
- A total of 210 cars will be delivered from the Savli manufacturing factory for the first Regional Rapid Transit System corridor.
- It consists of trainsets providing regional transit services on the Delhi-Ghaziabad-Meerut line as well as local transit services in Meerut. In the present year, the NCRTC will start the trial runs on the Delhi-Ghaziabad-Meerut RRTS corridor's Priority Section.
- The RRTS is a first-of-its-kind system in which trains running at 180 kmph will run every 5–10 minutes and cover the distance between Delhi and Meerut in 55 minutes with 14 stops.
- The entire 82-kilometre Delhi-Ghaziabad-Meerut RRTS route, which will have 25 stations in total, is now under construction, with two depots at Duhai and Modipuram and one stabling yard at Jungpura.

- National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) designed the "UPI Lite On-Device wallet" ("UPI Lite") functionality for UPI users for small value transactions.
- About 75% of the total volume of retail transactions (including cash) in India are below Rs 100 transaction value.
- Further, 50% of the total UPI transactions are having a transaction value of up to Rs 200/-. To easily process such small value transactions, NPCI has launched this facility of "UPI Lite".
- UPI Lite will process transactions in near offline mode i.e. debit offline and credit online, and at a later point, UPI Lite will process transactions in complete offline mode i.e. debit and credit both offline.
- The upper limit of a UPI Lite payment transaction shall be Rs. 200.
- The total limit of UPI Lite balance for an "On-device wallet" shall be Rs. 2,000 at any point of time.

6. CRPF celebrates 83rd Raising Day



- Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) has celebrated its 83rd Raising Day with zeal and ceremonial fervor on 19 March 2022.
- The 83rd Raising Day parade was organized at the Maulana Azad Stadium in Jammu.
- This was for the first time that the CRPF celebrated its Raising Day outside the national capital.

- This was the first Formula One race of 2022.

8. PANKAJ ADVANI BAGS ASIAN BILLIARDS TITLE FOR 8TH TIME



- Indian cueist Pankaj Advani has defeated Dhruv Sitwala to win his eighth title at the 19th Asian 100 UP Billiards Championship 2022. It was held in Doha, Qatar.
- Overall this is Advani's 24th international title and 8th Asian crown. Earlier, Advani had held off the stiff challenge of Pauk Sa of Myanmar to secure a spot in the final.
- He managed a 5-4 win after his opponent fought back strongly to level the match at four frames each.

9. JAY SHAH'S TERM AS ASIAN CRICKET COUNCIL PRESIDENT EXTENDED BY ONE YEAR



- The Asian Cricket Council (ACC) has unanimously extended the tenure of its incumbent President Jay Shah for a period of one year. The decision was taken during the annual general meeting of ACC on March 19, 2022.
- Jay Shah is the Secretary of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) since 2019.
- Shah was first appointed as the President of ACC in January 2021, replacing Nazmul Hassan, the President of the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB).
- Shah's extension was proposed by Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC) president Shammi Silva and the nomination was backed unanimously by all the members of the ACC.

National News

1. Uttarakhand: Pushkar Singh Dhami to take oath as CM



- Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader Pushkar Singh Dhami will take oath as the Uttarakhand chief minister on Wednesday for a second consecutive term, despite losing his seat in the Khatima constituency.
- Uttarakhand governor Lieutenant General Gurmit Singh is set to administer the oath to Dhami at the parade ground in Dehradun.
- The BJP contested the Assembly elections under Dhami's leadership and secured a comfortable majority in the 70-member House, winning 47 seats.
- Dhami, who lost from the Khatima constituency in the Uttarakhand, led the party's poll effort as Chief Minister during the assembly polls held last month.

2. PhonePe acquires GigIndia, top network for freelance micro-entrepreneurs

- PhonePe, a digital payments and financial services company, has acquired GigIndia, a network for independent micro-entrepreneurs based in Pune.
- PhonePe will be able to integrate 1.5 million entrepreneurs and over 100 businesses as customers, in addition to its own employees, as a result of the acquisition.
- PhonePe will use GigIndia's network of freelancing microentrepreneurs to assist corporations and businesses in expanding their customer bases and distribution channels.
- PhonePe's key services are payments and financial services, and the Walmart-owned company has a 47 percent share of monthly Unified Payments Interface (UPI) volumes.
- UPI is the platform's primary client acquisition channel, allowing it to cross-sell revenue-generating items such as mutual funds, gold, and insurance to customers while also facilitating bill payments.



3. Diébédo Francis Kéré, the first African to win architecture's highest honor



- Born in the village of Gando in West Africa's Burkina Faso and then getting into Technische Universität Berlin, one of Europe's renowned educational institutions, to winning the 2022 Laureate of the Pritzker Architecture Prize, the profession's highest honor architect Diébédo Francis Kéré has traveled far and long.
- The 57-year-old is the first architect from Africa to win the prestigious award, in its over four-decade history.
- Established by the Hyatt Foundation in 1979, the Pritzker architecture prize is bestowed on architects whose built work demonstrates a combination of talent, vision, and commitment.
- In 2021, the award went to French architects Anne Lacaton and Jean-Philippe Vassal.

4. Ex-Malian prime minister dies in Bamako hospital



- Mali's former Prime Minister Soumeylou Boubeye Maiga, arrested over corruption allegations last year, has died of an undisclosed illness in hospital.
- One of his lawyers told the Reuters news agency that the 68-year-old died at a clinic in the capital, Bamako, on Monday morning.
- He had been detained since August 2021 after the country was taken over by a military junta.
- He was appointed Keita's prime minister in 2017 but resigned in April 2019 over a massacre that left 160 people dead.

5. HDFC BANK TO GIVE A DIGITAL PUSH TO SMALL BUSINESS LOANS



- HDFC Bank has announced to launch the "SmartHub Vyapar programme" & 'AutoFirst' app the following two initiatives/application to give a digital push to small business loans.
- The financial institution has onboarded over 2.7 million retailers and is buying 100 thousand retailers each month. HDFC Bank has plans to onboard 20 million retailers in three years.
- More than half of the newly onboarded retailers solely function by means of the app platform.

funds.


6. India Placed 51st in Global House Price Index Q4 2021

1. NAGALAND BECOMES FIRST PAPERLESS ASSEMBLY BY IMPLEMENTING NATIONAL E-VIDHAN APPLICATION PROGRAMME



- Nagaland has created history by becoming the first State Assembly in the country to implement the National e-Vidhan Application (NeVA) programme to become completely paperless.
- The Nagaland Assembly Secretariat has attached a tablet or e-book on each table in the 60 members' assembly amid the ongoing Budget session.
- NeVA is a work-flow system deployed on NIC Cloud, MeghRaj which helps the Chair of the House to conduct the proceedings of the House smoothly and to conduct Legislative Business of the House in a Paperless manner.

2. Classical wind music instrument narasinganpettai nadaswaram gets GI tag

- Geographical Indication tag has been awarded to the Narasinganpettai Nadaswaram under the category of musical instruments of class 15.
- Narasinghapettai nadaswaram is a classical wind music instrument that is traditionally made in a village near Kumbakonam, Tamil Nadu.
- On behalf of Thanjavur Musical Instruments Workers Co-operative Cottage Industrial Society Limited, the application for receiving the GI tag was filed by Tamil Nadu's Nodal Officer for GI Registration of Products.
- The nagaswaram that is being used by artists nowadays is named pari nagaswaram and that is longer than the thimiri.
- This musical instrument has a body that is cylindrical in shape and takes the shape of a bell at the bottom.



3. Kuwaiti becomes hottest place on earth, temperature reaches 53.2 degrees Celsius



- It was so hot in Kuwait last summer that birds dropped dead from the sky. Sea horses boiled to death in the bay. Dead clams coated the rocks, their shells popped open like they'd been steamed.
- Kuwait reached a scorching temperature of 53.2 degrees Celsius (127.7 degrees Fahrenheit), making it among the hottest places on earth.
- The extremes of climate change present existential perils all over the world. But the record heat waves that roast Kuwait each season have grown so severe that people increasingly find it unbearable.
- By the end of the century, scientists say being outside in Kuwait City could be life-threatening not only to birds. A recent study also linked 67 percent of heat-related deaths in the capital to climate change.
- Environmental consultant Samia Alduaij said that, the country is severely under threat.
- Racing to burnish their climate credentials and diversify their economies, Saudi Arabia pitches futuristic car-free cities and Dubai plans to ban plastic and multiply the emirate's green parks.

4. ASH BARTY BOMBSHELL AS WORLD NO.1, AUS OPEN CHAMP RETIRES FROM TENNIS AGED 25





- Australian female tennis player Ashleigh Barty has announced retirement from tennis at the age of 25 years.
- She has won three Grand Slam singles titles the French Open in 2019, Wimbledon in 2021 and the Australian Open in 2022.
- Apart from playing tennis, she has also played semi-professional cricket during her break from tennis between 2014-2016.
- Barty is retiring after winning three major singles titles on three different surfaces the 2019 French Open, the 2021 Wimbledon and, back in January, the Australian Open.

5. MARCH 24TH IS INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR THE RIGHT TO THE TRUTH

- United Nations has recognised March 24 to be observed as the International Day for the Right to the Truth concerning Gross Human Rights Violations and for the Dignity of Victims every year.
- The day aims to pay tribute to those who have devoted their lives or lost their lives in, the struggle to promote and protect human rights for all.
- This day is observed on 24th March every year to pay tribute to "Monsignor Óscar Arnulfo Romero" as he was murdered on 24 March 1980.
- He was actively engaged in criticizing violations of the human rights of the most vulnerable individuals in El Salvador.
- The day was proclaimed by the United Nations in December 2010, to say no to all forms of violence, injustice and oppression against humanity.



6. KERALA TO INTRODUCE CARBON-NEUTRAL FARMING METHODS



- Kerala is set to become the first state in the country to introduce carbon-neutral farming methods in selected locations, for which the government has set aside Rs 6 crore in the 2022-23 Budget.
- In the first phase, carbon-neutral farming will be implemented in 13 farms under the Agriculture Department and tribal areas, and steps are on to convert the State Seed Farm at Aluva to a carbon-neutral farm.
- In the second phase, model carbon-neutral farms will be developed in all the 140 Assembly constituencies.
- The Agriculture Department was involved in a process of adopting new farming methods in phases, which would reduce carbon emissions and help the carbon to be stored in the soil.
- The government had already initiated discussions with experts in this regard.

7. IIT Madras establishes AquaMAP, an inter-disciplinary water management and policy centre



- The Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras builds a new interdisciplinary water management and policy centre known as 'AquaMAP' to address India's water issues.
- The centre will build scalable models employing novel technology to provide smart solutions for water concerns.
- As proof of concept, these models will be installed in various areas across the country.

8. Devendra Jhajharia becomes first para-athlete to receive Padma Bhushan, Avani Lekhara also receives Padma Shri award




- Devendra Jhajharia became the first para-athlete to receive the Padma Bhushan award.

3. October 5 to be designated as National Dolphin Day

- The Gangetic dolphin is an indicator species, whose status provides information on the overall condition of the ecosystem and of other species in that ecosystem, for the Ganga ecosystem and is extremely vulnerable to changes in water quality and flow.
- It is categorised as endangered on the International Union for the Conservation of Nature Red List.
- A WWF-India and the Uttar Pradesh forest department assessment in 2012 and 2015 recorded 1,272 dolphins in the Ganga, Yamuna, Chambal, Ken, Betwa, Son, Sharda, Geruwa, Gahagra, Gandak and Rapti.
- The Union environment ministry has designated October 5 as the National Dolphin Day, to be celebrated annually starting this year. The decision to designate a National Dolphin Day was taken by the standing committee of the National Board for Wildlife (NBWL) on Friday according to a statement by the environment ministry.

- Due to multiple threats, including pollution, water diversion, habitat fragmentation, and bycatch, the Ganges river dolphin is seriously threatened. Several major infrastructure projects within its region will impose a real risk for catastrophic population decline in the future," states the US based National Marine Mammal Foundation.
- The government through the National Water Development Agency (NWDA) and Jal Shakti ministry has started a programme of interlink rivers. NWDA has identified 30 such linking projects. The government has prepared detailed project reports for the Ken-Betwa link, the Daman Ganga-Pinjal link, and the Par-Tapi-Narmada link.

With the success of its first pilot project, the Government of India is planning to use the steel waste in the construction of highways to make the roads stronger in the future.

2. Pramod Sawant takes oath as Goa CM for second consecutive term



- The BJP had won 20 of the 40 seats in Goa.

- The President's Colour is bestowed upon a military unit in recognition of exceptional service rendered to the Nation, both in peace and in war.
- The Indian Navy was the first Indian Armed Force to be awarded the President Colour by Dr Rajendra Prasad on 27 May 1951.
- It is also known as 'Nishaan' which is an emblem that will be worn by all unit officers on the left-hand sleeve of their uniform..
- To this day, the President's Colours is very significant, if the unit lose their colours, it is a disgrace for that unit and, if the unit captured the enemy's colours then it is a great honour for that unit.

5. DRDO SUCCESSFULLY TEST-FIRE INDIAN ARMY "MRSAM" MISSILE



- India successfully test-fired the Army version of Medium-Range Surface-to-Air Missile (MRSAM) from a defence facility off the Odisha coast on Sunday demonstrating the system's high killing efficiency.
- The network-centric and most advanced sleek missile has been developed by Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and Israel Aerospace Industries (IAI) in collaboration with public and private sector enterprises.
- With a strike range of nearly 100 km, the 4.5-meter long supersonic quick reaction missile weighs around 2.7 tonnes and can carry a payload of 60 kg.
- Travelling at a speed of Mach 2, it can achieve high degrees of maneuverability at the terminal phase.
- The air version of the MRSAM system has already been handed over to Indian Air Force (IAF).

6. YAMUNOTSAV



- Yamunotsav is the annual Swechha event commemorating World Environment Day.

- The current target is the cleaning of the Yamuna River and ensuring that the 3 big sewage treatment plants (STP) that are being constructed are finished by December 2022.
- This will prevent all dirty water from the drains from falling into the River Yamuna.
- The funding of the sewerage infrastructure construction for River Yamuna amounts to Rs. 2300 crore is being funded by the NMCG.

- The 2022 Swiss Open (officially known as the Yonex Swiss Open 2022 for sponsorship reasons) was a badminton tournament that took place in St. Jakobshalle at Basel, Switzerland from 22 to 27 March, with a total prize pool of \$180,000.
- Indian women's world No 7 defeated Thailand's Busanan Ongbamrungphan in straight games in the final at her favourite venue. HS Prannoy failed in a bid for an Indian double, losing the men's final.
- The 2022 Swiss Open was the sixth tournament of the 2022 BWF World Tour and was part of the Swiss Open championships which has been held since 1955.
- It was organized by the Swiss Badminton with sanction from the Badminton World Federation. The Badminton World Federation (BWF) is the international governing body for the sport of badminton recognised by the International Olympic Committee (IOC).
- It was founded in 1934 as the International Badminton Federation (IBF) with nine member nations (Canada, Denmark, England, France, Ireland, Netherlands, New Zealand, Scotland and Wales).
- In 1981 the IBF merged with the World Badminton Federation, and on 24 September 2006, at the Extraordinary General Meeting in Madrid, the name of the organization was changed to Badminton World Federation (BWF).

8. DETERMINATION OF MINORITY IN INDIA

- The Supreme Court on Monday granted four weeks to the Centre to respond to a plea, which has sought directions for framing of guidelines for identification of minorities at the state level, contending that Hindus are in minority in 10 states.
- The Union government has told the Supreme Court (SC) that state governments can now grant minority status to any religious or linguistic community, including Hindus.
- The SC had sought the Union government's response in a plea that sought directions for framing of

- guidelines identifying minorities at the state level.
- The expression "minorities" appears in some Articles of the Constitution, but is not defined anywhere.
- The plea contended that Hindus are in a 'minority' in six states and three Union Territories of India but were allegedly not able to avail themselves of the benefits of schemes meant for minorities.
- In the TMA Pai case, the SC had said that for the purposes of Article 30 that deals with the rights of minorities to establish and administer educational institutions, religious and linguistic minorities have to be considered state-wise
- Under Section 2(c) of the National Commission for Minorities Act, 1992, the Centre had in 1993 notified five communities Muslims, Sikhs, Buddhists, Parsis and Christians as minorities.

- He participated in the Satyagraha of 1948 and was against the ban on RSS (Rashtriya Seva Sangh) and was jailed for the same.

2. PIYUSH GOYAL INAUGURATES INDIAN JEWELLERY EXPOSITION CENTRE BUILDING IN DUBAI



- The Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal has inaugurated the Indian Jewellery Exposition Centre (IJEX) building in Dubai, UAE, during his visit to Dubai to participate in the India Pavilion at Dubai Expo 2020.
- During the launch of IJEX, the minister called upon the export members of the Gem and Jewellery Export Promotion Council (GJEPC) to go for a USD 100 billion export target annually from the current USD 35 billion.
- IJEX will be a one-stop destination for the world to source Indian jewellery in Dubai and the platform will enable GJEPC members to display goods and book orders throughout the year.
- From India, 15 states and nine central ministries are participating in Dubai Expo, which will end on March 31, 2022.

3. PRIME MINISTERS' MUSEUM IN CAPITAL READY TO OPEN DOORS

- A museum of all former Prime Ministers, Pradhan Mantri Sangrahalaya (the Museum of Prime Ministers), has been built at Teen Murti Estate, in Delhi.
- The Rs. 270 crore project will be inaugurated on April 14, 2022, at the Teen Murti Bhavan complex which was the residence of ex-PM Jawaharlal Nehru.
- The Museum will showcase the life, times and contribution of all 14 Prime Ministers of India so far, except for the collections and works on Jawaharlal Nehru, who has a separate Nehru Memorial Museum, which was also his residence.
- The PMs Museum project was approved in 2018, and the deadline for its completion was October 2020 but faced delays due to pandemic-related lockdowns, as well as civil works and content-curation issues.



4. Himanta Biswa Sarma re-elected as President of Badminton Association Of India



- The incumbent president of the Badminton Association of India (BAI), Himanta Biswa Sarma has been re-elected unopposed for a second four years term, from 2022 to 2026.
- He was elected during the General Body Meeting of BAI in Guwahati on March 25, 2022.
- He is also the current Chief Minister of Assam. He was first elected as BAI chief in 2017.
- Apart from this, Sarma also serves as Vice President of Badminton Asia and a member of the Badminton World Federation Executive Council.
- Badminton Association of India is the governing body of badminton in India.
- BAI is an association registered under the Society's act.
- It was formed in 1934 and has been holding national-level tournaments in India since 1936.

5. Uday Kotak to step down as the Chairman of IL&FS

- Uday Kotak has announced to step down as the Chairman of the board of the Infrastructure Leasing & Financial Services (IL&FS), after his term ends on April 2, 2022.
- CS Rajan, Managing Director, IL&FS has been appointed as Chairman and Managing Director for six months with effect from April 3 by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs.
- Crisis-hit Infrastructure Leasing & Financial Services Ltd (IL&FS) has resolved nearly 55% of the group's outstanding debt over the last three-and-a-half years, managing director C.S. Rajan said on Tuesday.
- Among others, the company sold its iconic headquarters at Bandra Kurla Complex for ₹1,080 crore to

reduce debt.



6. Shashi Sinha is new Chairman of BARC India



- The board of Broadcast Audience Research Council (BARC) India has elected IPG Mediabrands India CEO Shashi Sinha as the new chairman.
- He will take over from Punit Goenka, who served as chairman of the TV viewership measurement agency for the last three years.
- Sinha, who also represents the Advertising Agencies Association of India as its board member, has played a key role in the formation of BARC.
- The Broadcast Audience Research Council India is a joint industry body founded by organisations that represent Indian broadcasters, advertisers, and advertising and media agencies.
- It is the world's largest television measurement science industry body.

7. GILBERT HOUNGBO NAMED NEXT DIRECTOR-GENERAL OF INTERNATIONAL LABOR ORGANIZATION

- Gilbert Houngbo from Togo will be the next Director-General of the International Labour Organization (ILO).
- Houngbo was elected by the UN agency's governing body, comprising representatives of governments, workers and employers during their meeting in Geneva.
- Houngbo, former Prime Minister of Togo, will be the 11th head of the agency and the first African to hold the post.
- His five-year term will begin on October 1, 2022.

• The current Director-General, Guy Ryder, from the United Kingdom, has held office since 2012.



8. PVR & INOX Leisure announced merger combined entity to be called PVR Inox Ltd



- Multiplex companies INOX Leisure Ltd and PVR Ltd have announced the merger of their two companies.
- Inox will have a 16.66% stake in the new firm and PVR will have a 10.62% stake.

1. MAIDEN EDITION OF INDIAN OCEAN NAVAL SYMPOSIUM MARITIME EXERCISE HELD

- The first edition of the Indian Ocean Naval Symposium (IONS) Maritime Exercise 2022 (IMEX-22) was held from March 26 to 30, 2022, in Goa and in the Arabian Sea.
- The objective of the exercise was to enhance the interoperability of the navies of member nations in Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) operations.
- The exercise is seen as a significant stepping stone for regional navies to collaborate and respond

- collectively to natural disasters in the region and paves way for further strengthening regional cooperation.
- The navies from 15 out of the 25 member nations of IONS, participated in the exercise.
- The Harbour Phase of IMEX 22 was held at Marmugao port, Goa on March 26 and 27 while the Sea Phase took place in the Arabian Sea from March 28 to 30, 2022.



2. International Transgender Day of Visibility:March



- The International Transgender Day of Visibility (TDOV) occurs annually on March 31 to raise awareness of discrimination faced by transgender people worldwide, while also celebrating their contributions to society.
- The day is dedicated to celebrating transgender people and raising awareness of discrimination faced by transgender people worldwide, as well as celebrating their contributions to society.
- The day was founded by US-based transgender activist Rachel Crandall of Michigan in 2009.
- As a reaction to the lack of LGBT recognition of transgender people, citing the frustration that the only well-known transgender-centred day was the Transgender Day of Remembrance which mourned the murders of transgender people but did not acknowledge and celebrate living members of the transgender community.
- The first International Transgender Day of Visibility was held on March 31, 2009.

3. BELGIAN FOOTBALLER MIGUEL VAN DAMME DIES AGED 28



- Veteran Belgian footballer, Miguel Van Damme has passed away aged 28 after a long battle with leukaemia.
- Van Damme was diagnosed with leukaemia in 2016 and was undergoing treatment for cancer for over five years.
- During his eight-year professional career, Van Damme played for Cercle Brugge and made 40 appearances for the team.

4. IAF unveils new initiative for refuelling its convoys



- The Indian Air Force has unveiled a new initiative with the Indian Oil Corporation Ltd. Under it, IAF's convoys will be refuelled at fuel stations of the state-run energy major.
- As per the Defence Ministry, 'Fleet Card-Fuel on Move' has been rolled out to facilitate the refuelling of convoys belonging to the Indian Air Force.
- Under the existing system, the Indian Air Force procures fuel from various agencies and then distributes it within the Air Force establishment.
- With the advent of the Fleet Cards, the IAF will be able to utilise the vast network of retail fuel distributors across the country to refuel its vehicles on the move.
- The availability of Fleet Card will permit the convoy to refuel at any IOCL fuel station, thus increasing the pace of movement and reducing the lead time for readiness at operational locations across the nation.

5. NITI AAYOG AND FAO LAUNCH BOOK TITLED INDIAN AGRICULTURE TOWARDS 2030

• Union Minister of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare (MoA&FW), Narendra Singh Tomar has released a book titled "Indian Agriculture towards 2030: Pathways for Enhancing Farmers' Income, Nutritional Security and Sustainable Food and Farm Systems".

- An event organized by NITI Aayog and the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations.

6. Canada qualify for FIFA World Cup finals for first time in 36 years

- Canada is top of the CONCACAF qualifying group and has now secured its place at a World Cup finals tournament for the first time since 1986.
- Canada becomes the 20th team to qualify for the 2022 FIFA World Cup which will feature 32 nations vying for the ultimate prize in Qatar from November 21 to December 18.
- The remaining 12 teams will be decided in the coming days before the draw on April 1 to determine the eight groups.

7. Dr Renu Singh joins as Director, FRI



- Dr Renu Singh has been appointed by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF) as the next director of the Forest Research Institute (FRI) in Dehradun.
- She will be the institute's second woman director.
- Singh joined as FRI director after AS Rawat, director-general, ICFRE, handed over his additional charge of director FRI to her.
- Dr Renu Singh has an extensive experience in Forest Policy, Forest Management and Research Issues.
- She has a special interest in gender and development, climate change adaptation and mitigation issues in the forestry sector.
- She has participated in and represented various biodiversity, forest and climate change-related issues in international conventions like United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) and United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD).

- The Leadership is rotated in alphabetical order of country names. The permanent secretariat of BIMSTEC is in Dhaka, Bangladesh.
