1. Tableau On Theme 'India: Mother Of Democracy' Clinches First Spot At Republic Day Parade 2024

2. THDCIL Inaugurates India's Largest Green Hydrogen Pilot Project On 75th Republic Day



On the 75th Republic Day, THDC India Limited (THDCIL), a prominent Power Sector PSU, proudly unveiled India's Largest Electrolyser End Fuel Cell-based Green Hydrogen Pilot Project at its office complex in Rishikesh.

The initiative aligns with the "National Green Hydrogen Mission," showcasing THDCIL's commitment to sustainable energy practices. The pilot project, utilizing a 1MW Rooftop Solar Plant, will produce 50KG of Green Hydrogen daily.

The hydrogen will be stored in two tanks and used during night hours to illuminate the THDCIL office complex through a 70 Kw PEM Fuel Cell.

As India's Largest Electrolyser End Fuel Cell based Pilot Project, THDCIL's achievement demonstrates key technologies in Green Hydrogen Production, H₂ storage, and features a PEM Hydrogen fuel cell-based microgrid system.

3.Comoros President Azali Assoumani Secures Controversial Fourth Term Amid Opposition Dispute



In a disputed electoral process, Comoros President Azali Assoumani has claimed victory for a fourth term with 63% of the vote, as announced by the electoral body Ceni. The opposition alleges instances of ballot stuffing and premature closure of polls in favor of Assoumani, while international observers maintain the overall fairness of the election despite reported irregularities.

Azali Assoumani, a former military officer who first seized power in 1999, secured his fourth term after a contentious 2018 referendum abolished term limits. Accusations of imprisoning and exiling opponents have marred his rule, with critics raising concerns about democratic principles.

4. Bhutan's Tshering Tobgay Embarks On Second Term As Prime Minister After Fourth Free Election



Bhutan's liberal leader, Tshering Tobgay, from the People's Democratic Party (PDP), has commenced his second term as prime minister, following recent elections in the nation.

Bhutan, with a population of less than 800,000, has embraced democracy for 15 years and is renowned for its unique Gross National Happiness (GNH) index, measuring factors like recreation and emotional well-being.

Tobgay, 58, now serving his second non-consecutive term, was previously prime minister from 2013 to 2018 and led the opposition in the first free vote in 2008. A former bureaucrat and advocate for Bhutan's Buddhist culture, he faces the task of revitalizing the \$3 billion economy post-COVID-19 and addressing youth migration abroad.

5.Odisha Hosts Fourth National Chilika Birds Festival



The National Chilika Birds Festival, a hallmark event in Odisha's calendar, commenced with grandeur on January 26. The festival was inaugurated by Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik.

Participants embarked on birding excursions to Mangalajodi and Nalabana, sanctuaries nestled within Chilika's pristine environs. Mangalajodi, dubbed the "Birds Paradise of Asia," offered a glimpse into the diverse avian species that call this region home.

6.Odisha Launches LABHA: A 100% State-Funded MSP Scheme For Tribal Empowerment



In a significant move towards the development and empowerment of approximately one crore tribals in Odisha, the state government, led by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, has approved the launch of the 'LABHA' scheme.

LABHA, an acronym for Laghu Bana Jatya Drabya Kraya, is a 100% state-funded Minimum Support Price (MSP) for Minor Forest Produce (MFP).

The state government will annually determine the Minimum Support Price for the minor forest produce. Tribal primary collectors will sell minor forest produce at MSP through procurement centers managed by TDCCOL (Tribal Development Cooperative Corporation of Odisha Limited).

7. India Nominates 'Maratha Military Landscapes' For UNESCO World Heritage List 2024-25



India has nominated the 'Maratha Military Landscapes' for inclusion in the UNESCO World Heritage List for the 2024-25 cycle.

The 'Maratha Military Landscapes of India' comprise twelve components, including Salher Fort, Shivneri Fort, Lohgad, Khanderi Fort, Raigad, Rajgad, Pratapgad, Suvarnadurg, Panhala Fort, Vijay Durg, Sindhudurg, and Gingee Fort. These structures, dating back to the 17th and 19th centuries, span across Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, showcasing the strategic military prowess of the Maratha rule.
