1. **Lala Lajpat Rai's 96th Death Anniversary**



- On November 17, 2024, the nation remembered Lala Lajpat Rai, also known as "Punjab Kesari," on his 96th death anniversary. He died after being severely injured by the British police while leading a peaceful protest against the Simon Commission. A tribute ceremony was held in his native village in Moga, Punjab.

2. **Prime Minister Modi Conferred Grand Commander of the Order of the Niger**
