1. PM Modi Lays Foundation Stone for Ayurveda Institute



Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone for a ₹185 crore Central Ayurveda Research Institute in New Delhi. The institute will focus on promoting Ayurveda as a global wellness alternative and advance research in traditional medicine.

2. Indigenous Paracetamol Production Technology Unveiled



The Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) announced the development of indigenous technology for manufacturing Paracetamol. This technology aims to reduce India's reliance on imports for the widely used painkiller and provide an economic boost.

3. PFI Terror Funding Case

5. Supreme Court on Property Rights
